Sir Edward Origg at Home.

Although the interview which His Excellency Sir Edward Origg, the Governor of Kenya, accorded to our London correspondent does not reveal much of the more practical results of the work of the Governor in London, and does not forecast decisions on the important outstanding questions, it gives an indication of one aspect of the work in which Kenya cannot show too great interest to establish a better basis for the already apparent results. In official circles Sir Edward received many sympathetic and understanding treatment in his discussions regarding Kenya and those connected with East Africa in London who have returned within recent months to the Colony speak with considerable pleasure and conviction of their impression that the name of the present Governor of Kenya stands high indeed in the respect of responsible authorities in the Mother Country. The trust and confidence placed in him by the Colonial Office have long indicated publicly and privately several directions which he visited England and he has established between the Colony and those largely responsible for its policy in London a basis of understanding and co-operation which is particularly gratifying to a community so liable in the past to be criticised and misunderstood because its work and aspirations were not matters of common knowledge and so great a distance from the centre of their practical application. It is possible now, without entering into consideration of the other aspects of his work, which will be subject to scrutiny and criticism when he has discussed proposals in detail before the Legislative Council at the end of August, to pay a tribute to Sir Edward Origg upon the strength and stability of his position in the name of Kenya. His personal concerns among all parties, his own brilliant qualities and his complete knowledge of political circles and personalities in Britain have all been used by him to the best possible advantage in explaining to the responsible authorities at Home the true story of the developments in colonisation in this country and in conveying to those who matter most an accurate picture of the qualifications of the white community in Kenya for the discharge of the important Imperial responsibilities which have been laid upon trusteeship by the part of the Empire. Sir Edward has not confined his endeavours to easy to official quarters. He has ventured into the ranks of the "honest work" of the Kenya people and in that direction no less than elsewhere his efforts on our behalf have been no less successful. The crisis of Kenya may be divided into two main groups; those individuals and historical events which with the best of intention and in a helpful spirit attempt to use their influence in maintaining and advancing the good name of the British Empire and of the nation in the work of trusteeship of subject peoples but whose theories are not always founded on a sound knowledge of facts, and the other section whose opposition is frankly hostile to goodly political, based on an unimpaired suspicion of their own people and directed by local interests and incidents which have no relation to present conditions and which is used almost entirely for propaganda purposes. To both sections Sir Edward has brought a message. He has expressed to the Church for informed con-

**MANDATES COMMISSION CONSIDER TANGANYIKA.**

Sir Donald Cameron's Review at Geneva.

The administration of Tanganyika Territory was discussed by the Permanent Mandates Commission at Geneva recently. Sir Donald Cameron, the Governor of the territory, made a general statement on the situation in Tanganyika, and explained his views as to the nature of the policy to be adopted in Central Africa. He said that in Tanganyika the administration had endeavored to make use of existing institutions, and to secure the confidence of the indigenous population in order to make use of it for the good administration of the territory and for the progressive education of the native population.

Sir Donald Cameron gave information on measures taken to improve the native and improve their social condition as far as was compatible with their aptitudes, also on the policy adopted in regard to native labor. He said that the Administration abstained from increasing any kind of pressure in order to persuade natives to undertake one certain kind of work rather than another. He emphasized that pressure of this kind would have the result of decreasing the confidence of the natives in authorities of the territory. Natives were not to be forced to do any work unless with an employer of their own choice.

The Mandate Commission met with interest the measures taken in regard to the education of the natives. These matters have been organized between the Administration and the natives, and education was expected to be developed in a more systematic way with a view to developing the practical knowledge of the native rather than theoretical studies.

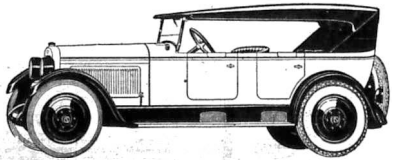

### CURIOUS STORY OF DEATH OF A NATIVE.

#### Mystery Fracture of the Skull.

On June 2, last, a young man named John Martin Pickett, 27, with his fat, for impetuous. Twenty eight hours after the native died, and the young man on Monday found himself arrested before the Supreme Court on a tentative charge of culpable homicide.

Mr. Justice Pickering (the acting Chief Justice) was on the Bench, and Mr. E. J. Davies appeared for the Crown to prosecute. Mr. R. K. Figue R.C. was retained for the defence. Crown Counsel stated that he had been through the record of the proceedings before the Magistrate—particularly the medical evidence—and his fact that he could not ask a jury to return a verdict of culpable homicide under the circumstances. He would therefore ask the Court to return a charge of simple trial under Section 304 of the Indian Penal Code. The Judge then suggested that "grave and sudden provocation" is established? It was said that the fact and evidence on the grave and sudden provocation, as a result of which the accused punched the deceased's head. You concede that such words are sufficient to constitute "grave and sudden provocation"?

Mr. Justice Pickering: I am far from suggesting that the use of those words would have justified the act. I think that it would mitigate the seriousness of it and assist to bring it within the offence of simple trial.

The Judge: In view of the fact that the Crown attorney just pointed out that the facts establish a grave and sudden provocation, I find it difficult to believe that you are serious when you say that the accused charged just thereafter by the Crown.

The accused was then charged with the commission of the offence of simple trial by striking one, Waweru, a native, on the head with his fat, having received on the time grave and sudden provocation.

#### Fine of Cattle.

The accused pleaded guilty. The Judge: Accepting that plea,

there is no possibility of my ascertaining the extent of the injury inflicted. From the record, it is impossible to discover this. What is the position now?

Crown Counsel: The Court must infer some pain was inflicted by reason of the blow on the head with a fat.

A Pencil Case.

The doctor's evidence was that there was a fracture on the right side of the head. He had subpoenaed Dr. Kester, who had examined the skull of the deceased boy. Dr. Kester would prove that the fracture being on the left side of the head and that this fracture could only be due to the blow by immediate contact, and could not possibly be due to the blow by the right side.

It must be remembered that the skull did not take place until twenty-eight months after, and it was not known what happened to the pencil case. Under these circumstances he asked if a pencil case damaged the skull as an instrument to the result. All the Court thought was to look to the subpoenaed homologue on the right side of the head caused by the accused's fat.

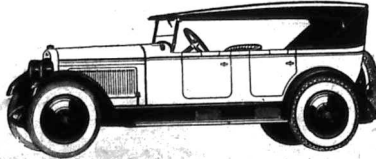

### The Associated Chambers.

The Show week opens in Kenya what will be one of the busiest and most important periods in present history within months' time. To-morrow the Association of East African Chambers will begin a season expected to last two days. On Monday the important East African Chamber of Commerce representatives of Eastern Africa will begin their work in the Kenya Capital.

The purpose of the meeting is to discuss principally the major problems of information and on Tuesday the Budget session of the Legislative Council will begin. Before it is finished, and within the next month, Kenya will have the opportunity of hearing from the lips of His Excellency Sir Edward Grogan, a first hand account of his work in London. The long and arduous period which has occurred since his departure from London is now at an end and the Colony will have to be prepared to grapple with the problems which are now foisted by the spirit of co-operation which has marked the most successful agricultural show ever held in Eastern Africa and also comes out of the value of the meeting in understanding and cooperation not only within the borders of the Colony but extending readily and to add its borders. The Association of East African Chambers which meets to-day had on its agenda a number of important items, not the least being the report of the resolutions by the Executive which are in preparation for representation of the East African view of the future before the meeting of Empire Chambers which will be held before the end of the year at Cape Town. It is most important that commercial opinion in Eastern Africa should not only be lined up against the measures on questions of Imperial commercial policy but that there should be an opportunity to secure the goodwill, understanding and help of the other parts of the Empire in securing progress in that part of the world along the lines which are being followed by the Dominions and Colonies in order that there shall be established the co-ordinating factor which is essential for obtaining the major values of combination and strength. The commercial community will bring to the Kenya Capital for sympathetic consideration and practical support several problems with which they are closely acquainted but which affect the Colony as a whole—the questions of responsibility in the age of goods at the Coast, produce consigned to the port at export time, the acquisition of the Port Advisory Board, particularly those to represent Members, and the question of the Shipping Committee which has been a subject of concern for a number of years and other matters of common interest. It will be realized that great difficulties present themselves in reaching agreement on any of those subjects but if the difficulties are approached in the proper spirit and with full appreciation of the views of all communities affected, we believe that it will be possible, however difficult, to obtain understanding so that Government and the Legislature can rely upon the valuable advice of the commercial community represented with one voice.

The main section of the Show, embracing the judge's reports and the cattle section, will begin on Monday. The cattle section will be particularly interesting, especially in view of the fact that the exhibitors were recently, many of the animals were in poor condition and in some instances not fit to type. There was a considerable number of good animals which had a very good speaking generally, the quality was not up to the standard of previous shows.

Lord Dalhousie's white bull was nearly the best of the males. Although the exhibitors in the class now show three years and over only a few animals were represented by "Babies" of Lord Dalhousie's blood, the quality was not up to the standard of previous years. 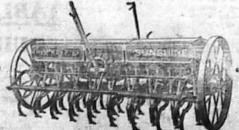

**COFFEE INDUSTRY RESES TO THE OCCASION.**

Comprehensive Display at the Show.

There were 108 exhibits in the section including the coffee trade exhibit. On the whole, the year and the seasonally dry weather, recently, on the whole, were amenable to participation, so that there were a few exhibits on the benches. This space is a large extent exhibited separately for the coffee trade representative of Kenya Coffee, but on the whole the standard of exhibiting was high.

The districts with the most rainfall naturally secured more exhibitors than the established areas to Nairobi, and the factor was partly the reason that such were the crop given for the best exhibit which was a very fine effort. Kyauzu once secured three third and Malindi being highly commended.

This makes the third time in succession that the Kidge Estate has captured the cup and it now becomes the property of the winner in consequence.

A feature of this section was the Cafe, where coffee from various districts was coast, ground and served to visitors both in English and French styles. The roasting and grinding was fully evidenced by Messrs. Elitza and the proprietor of the Talafu Restaurant supervised the service.

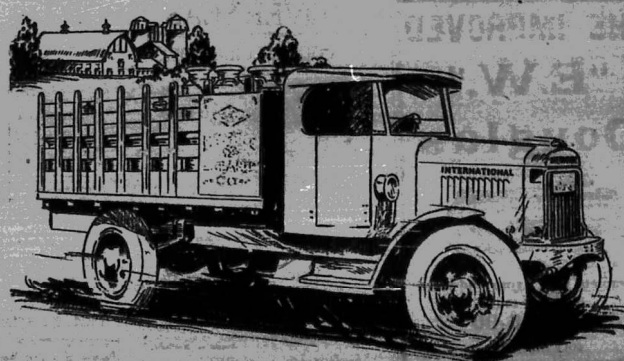
**POTTERY.**

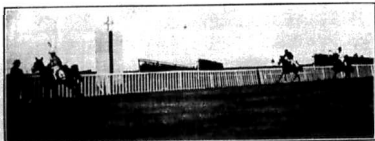

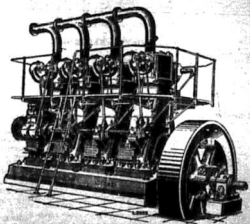

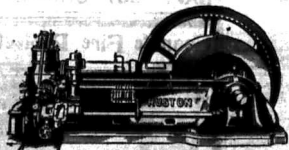

### MONEY FOR SILENCE BRIDGE AND OTHER WORKS

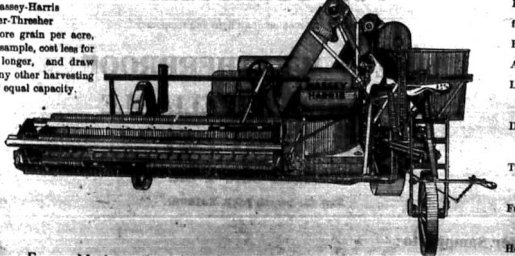

**A Fishing Expert.**

HONORARY ADVISOR FOR KENYA AND UGANDA.

The consideration of fishing regulations and an East African movement for the preservation of fish in the Lake was indicated by H.E. Sir William Gowers, who in his latest address to the Legislative Council in Uganda when he said:

The question of the development and conservation of the fishing industry of Lake Victoria has recently occupied the attention of the Government. In consultation with the Governments of Kenya and Tanganyika, as a result of these deliberations, we have been fortunate enough to secure, through the good offices of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the services of Mr. Graham, one of the authorities on the subject of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, who will shortly arrive at Kisumu and will conduct an economic survey of waters of the Lake.

I have every hope that, as a result of the expert advice and assistance which we shall receive from Mr. Graham, it will be possible for the Government to frame regulations for fishing and the preservation of fish, which will place this valuable potential industry on a firm and enduring basis.

I hope that we may be able to secure the services for some investigations of the fishery possibilities of the Nile and of Lake Albert, about which we have at present very little scientific knowledge.

### SLEEPING SICKNESS INSTITUTE FOR E.A.

Decision Following the League Commission.

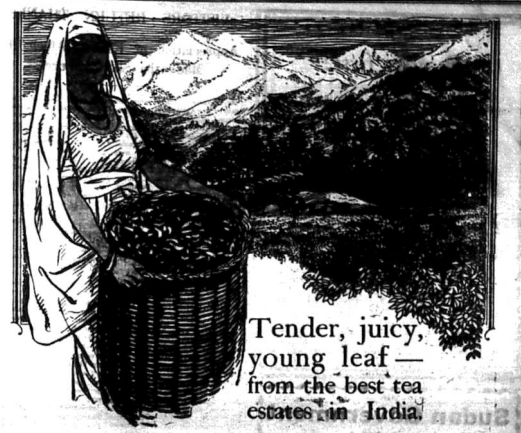
The Secretary of State for the Colonies has approved proposals to establish a Central Sleeping Sickness Research Institute at Entebbe.

All the E.A. territories will be called on to meet the cost. The announcement was made to the Governor of Uganda to his Legislative Council recently with the following terms:

The League of Nations International Sleeping Sickness Commission, which assembled at Entebbe some eighteen months ago, ceased its labours and was dissolved on the 30th June. The results of the Commission's work will be of the utmost value to African administration as well as to Science, and the Honourable Members of the Council will, I am sure, share my appreciation of the distinction which was conferred on the Medical Service of the Protectorate by the selection of Dr. H. L. Dakin to act as Chairman of a Committee of such eminent scientists, and my satisfaction that Uganda was able to provide the equipment and laboratory requisite for the expedition.

This Commission, has limited certain experiments and those of limited scope, but it has been continued until the work of the Commission is to have its full effect. It was in satisfaction of the position which has arisen that the Trustees of the Sub-Committee of the Civil Research Council, constituted in 1925, that in order to secure continuity, research should be continued on the same lines when the Commission had been dissolved, a resolution which was supported by the Governor of the East African Dependencies in Conference in 1926, who agreed that research on Human Trypanosomiasis should be continued at Entebbe.

A New Institute I have, accordingly, submitted a scheme of proposals to the Secretary of State for the Colonies for the establishment of an Institute for Trypanosomiasis Research at Entebbe. The Secretary of State has approved these proposals and they have been communicated to the Governments of the remaining East African Dependencies, who are being asked to contribute to the expense of the Institute on a basis analogous to the common contributions to the Amant Institute for Agricultural Research situated in Tanganyika Territory. It is hoped to obtain assistance towards the cost of the project from the East African Government Loan.

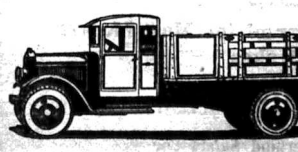

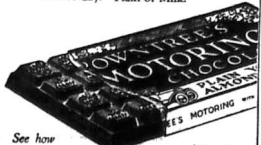

### ARE AMERICAN FILMS DETERIORATING.

#### Results of a Critical Examination.

(STANDARD) CORRESPONDENT.

London, June 30.  
"American film producers appear to be relying on mechanical effects and technique and neglecting the story, while British producers are giving serious attention to the story, and improving very rapidly in the technique. This statement was made by Mr. W. Gwazda King, consulting secretary of the Cinematograph Exhibitors' Association, at the conference at Morecombe, of the Cinematograph Exhibitors of Great Britain and Ireland. There had been a decline for more than two years, he said, in the number of good films turned out from American studios.

Mr King who was discussing the question of films and their critics, said a critical examination of films for 1926 revealed an amazing poverty of story. The British output in the same period, though very small, possessed a very much higher percentage of good story material. He added—

"The idea of the American conception is something like this. One ounce of story, one pound of sentiment, one pound of shells and one half pound of laughs and back as possible. Laughing—half a pound of night club and cabaret music, three pounds of star (at a million dollars per pound) possibly one pound of humor, and three pounds of settings. Laughing British pictures have taken this prescription as a rule, but here taste has deteriorated. (Chorus) There is a dearth of good papers. There has been a decline for more than a year in the number of good pictures from American studios. The character of the stories employed has greatly deteriorated. Some of the films concern the story of manufacturers of either motor cars, motors cycles, or aeroplanes. I have a list of 21 films in which the chief, if not the whole interest is centred in motor cars.

"But it is resorted for want to play the dominating part in the cinema film. This might possibly be expected in a dry country, but I shudder to think of what would happen to American production if there ceased to be any. In recent productions, in no less than 11 separate instances a hero had played the principal part. In the last two was a dancing girl after another. (Laughter) I am inclined to think that a man who is just a prop actor for a few days short story writers than in America. The reason must be that so much has to be paid for stars that there is little left for authors.

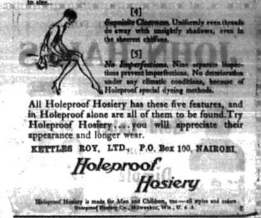

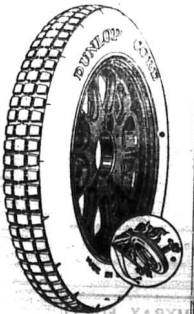
