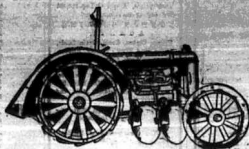

**AN IMPORT CONTRACT.**

Draft Designed for General Use in E. Africa.

The question of a comprehensive form of Import Contract was dealt with by the Associated Chambers of Commerce at its meeting on August 6.

Mr. Campbell said that the Contract had been originally drafted off by a sub-committee of the Merchants' Chamber, who spent months in getting it through. The draft was sent to the A. C. Society of the London Chamber who invited delegates from the Glasgow, Liverpool and Manchester Chambers to meet and consider the form. All went through except clauses which were not altered.

The result was that certain amendments and additions were suggested which were approved by the Merchants' Chamber. The draft was then still further discussed and amended at a special general meeting of the Chamber, and the result was the form now before the meeting. It had been unanimously passed by the Merchants' Chamber and approved by the legal adviser.

Mr. Campbell said that he had been lately comment on the use of such a contract in legal cases where the question of custom, imported up to date, is to be considered. It was to be used and he confidently said the meeting to support a resolution that it be an instruction to the Executive Committee to consider the contract with a view to its universal adoption in commercial circles.

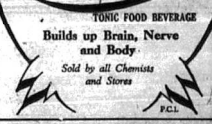

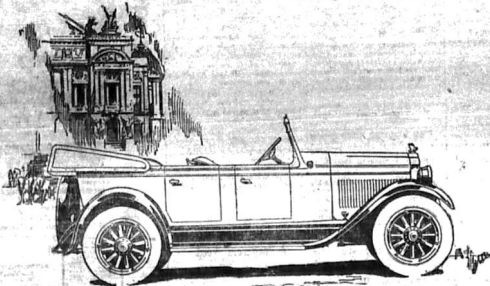

## The Nairobi Road Problem.

It will be a relief to those who use the roads of Nairobi to know that the Town Council and its technical experts have at length reached the conclusion, so apparent to the lay mind for some time, that the present method of endeavouring to repair the highways is a waste of public money. The Council have advised if ever been in so bad a condition as they are to-day and it has been quite obvious that the wear and tear upon them has been so great as to make the possibility of a proper road system presenting itself much more and more remote. In fact the roads had got beyond their capacity of repair, financially and from a staff point of view, to keep them in the repair which the people of the town are entitled to demand. Now the Council has decided to take its courage into both hands, wisely we believe. Government has been asked to provide a loan of £100,000 to construct nearly all the roads in the town. It is a large sum of money and there are certain considerations we would advance without in any degree attempting to discourage the Council. We suggest in the first instance that despite all the experience of the past it is doubtful whether the construction of roads in Nairobi has been or is being done by the best methods. Considerable success has attended the system of using tar on the metalled roads and the structure of main roads which have been so reconstructed have only served to emphasize the appalling condition of the earth roads which remain in an advanced stage of deterioration but it is as yet impossible to say, however, as to the development of the town and the increase and change in traffic, whether the metalled roads recently introduced is one which, in its kind, will give the best result. That, we suggest, is why technical engineers and road construction experts. Government recently reported a road expert who has, of late, contented himself with a general denunciation of the road system and the advice that gives extra money they can be improved. With his and other assistance it should be possible, and it is, in the necessary, to examine the whole question of road construction in Nairobi before further money is expended. In addition, it should not be assumed that it will be possible, or necessary, to spend the whole of the loan money on one of the that the schedule of roads to be dealt with on submission. This process of improving the grade of the town must in any event be a gradual one, limited both by available funds and knowledge. There is one one fact, however, and it governs the whole position. The roads of Nairobi must be improved as soon as possible; but only one the present thoughtful likely to impose a handicap on the development of the town and a cost to the owner of transport which is never fully recouped, but the duty certainly of the Council lies largely in the road and the neglect of waste land, as a very serious and growing menace to the health of the population. We hope therefore that Government will not return the too obvious answer that a decision is required in the future must be delayed pending consideration of the Local Government Report. There is a plain duty for delay. The Local Government Commission certainly gave advice in the question of roads and finance for their system and advised clearly into the principles of responsibility for their system and of the fact that their own foundations were largely dependent upon the adoption of large schemes and if the community has to wait long before making it.

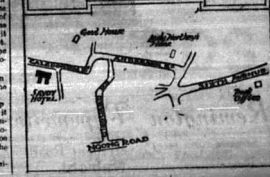

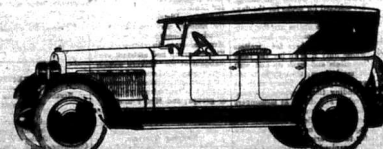

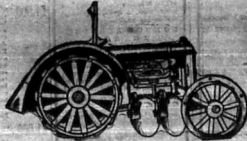
