THE MINERAL WEALTH OF UGANDA.

Geological Investigations Disclose Hopeful Prospects.

TIN, GOLD, OIL AND COAL

Extracts from the latest Report of the Geological Department of Uganda indicate the prospect of great mineral wealth in the Protectorate.

The work of the Department in a search for oil, gold and coal, stripped of the technical matter, is summarised in the following article.

A patient investigation of the influence of earth formation changes upon the flow of the Kafir River is being conducted and the prospects of finding gold in any quantity are being examined.

A Report issued by the Geological Survey Department of Uganda in 1925 gives an interesting review of the mineral possibilities of the neighbouring territory and the continuous attempt by government geologists to increase their knowledge on the subject.

The field work which it was proposed to undertake in 1925 for the purpose of testing for petroleum fields in the Albertine district had to be postponed pending certain arrangements with the British-Kyoga Oil Company. This Company has decided to send a geological party to investigate a large area, and £10,000 is to be set aside for transport costs of the Company's field party.

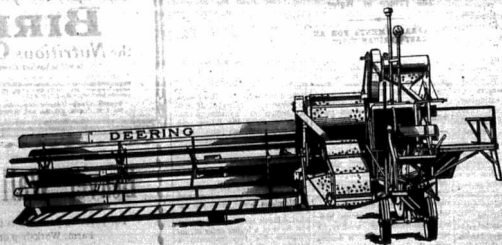

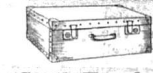

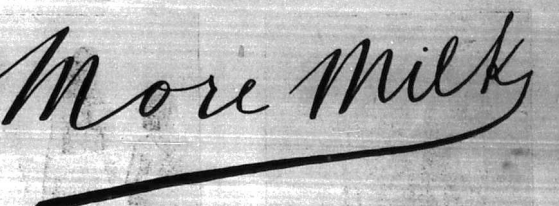

THE Construction of a Silo

The cheapest form of Silo is the trench and it preserves the fodder as effectively as the more elaborate kinds.

A trench silo, 8 feet wide at the bottom, 12 feet wide at the top and 8 feet deep, at 25 pounds of silage per cubic foot, would hold one ton to each foot in length of 50 feet in length.

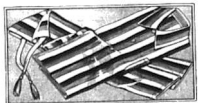

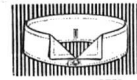

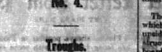


Fig. 1. Small trough suitable for use as pig trough.

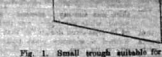


Fig. 2. Method for construction of trough illustrated in Fig. 2.

The end has been reinforced... concrete on the farm.

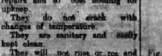


Fig. 3. Method for construction of trough illustrated in Fig. 3.

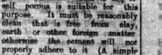


Fig. 5. Method for construction of trough illustrated in Fig. 5.

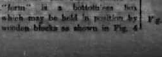


Fig. 7. Section of small trough showing position of reinforcement.

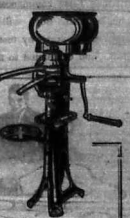

POULTRY NOTES.

Breeding and Rearing Turkeys.

Last Christmas turkeys realized high prices on the market, that probably there are very large numbers now in process of being reared for this year's Christmas market.

The extent to which the breeding and rearing of turkeys may be undertaken in this country by those with sufficient areas of land, must, in every case, be considered in relation to the availability of soil and situation. Many parts are unsuitable for turkeys, especially those where heavy rain falls, and sometimes, or other reasons, will not do so.

By farming on a large scale it is impossible to those in possession of small acreages. A large range will save the question of soil of food and the rearing conditions, and is a great factor in the size and vigour of the birds reared. Soil and water have a great deal to do with the success of turkey rearing, and the best of dry season in this country means little to those who are at the best times the damper districts.

It is necessary to begin to be on well-drained land, to be fertilized, and to be sheltered. Turkey hens usually begin to lay about Easter Time, and the younger eggs have had better weather if the Christmas market is the objective.

THE SHOP HOURS ACT.

New Law for Nairobi

The Shop Hours Ordinance comes into force as far as Nairobi is concerned on September 1. From that date a shop shall not be open before 9 a.m., or after 6 p.m., with certain exceptions. These exceptions are: (1) the sale by retail of intoxicating liquors; (2) the sale of refreshments for consumption on premises; (3) the sale of newspapers; (4) the sale of tobacco and smokers' requisites and of "pan-cakes"; (5) the sale of medicine and medical and surgical appliances; (6) Post Office business; (7) on at least one day in each week a shop assistant shall not be employed above the business of a shop after 1 p.m.

Sunday Closing.

Coming to Sunday, all shops must be closed all day, with certain exceptions. The exceptions are open until 1 p.m. and are shops for:

- The sale by retail of intoxicating liquors;
 - The sale of refreshments, sale of motor, cycle and aircraft; (4) surplus and accessories to travellers;
 - The sale of newspapers and periodicals;
 - The sale of fresh fish, milk, cream, bread, confectionery, fruit, vegetables, flowers and other articles of a vendible nature;
 - Books of medicine and smokers' requisites and "pan-cakes";
 - Books of medicine and surgical appliances.
- To sum up the provisions of the Act shopkeepers must note:
- That a shop may be open between 9 a.m. and 6 p.m.
 - That a half-holiday every week is compulsory.
 - The half holiday has to be on a Friday.

BUILDING MATERIALS FOUND IN KENYA.

Expert Examination by the Government Geologist of Uganda.

In 1926 at the request of the Government of Kenya, the Government of Uganda arranged for the services of Mr. E. J. Wayland, a geologist of the Government of Uganda, for the purpose of investigating and reporting on deposits of mineral substances that might be used in the manufacture of lime, cement, and brick.

The insurgents are reported to have taken complete possession of Polesno, and to have about 25,000 republicanist soldiers there. The Bolsheviks are said to have arrested 14 persons in the Brest-Litovsk district.

They were taken into a parlour and the baby was brought in through the door in a small basket. The whole of the Ukraine is reported to be in a ferment. AMAZING COP.

Distilled Water from the Breath. A life-saving cup, which can produce fresh water for an indefinite period, was carried by both Lindbergh and Byrd on their trans-atlantic flights. Knowing as the Arabian water-maker cup, it gives fresh water to a half to two ounces of pure drinking water per hour, by condensing the water vapor of the breath. The cup is five and a half inches long, and weighs six ounces, and is made round the neck of the wearer, who breathes through it. When the cup is subject to temperature lower than that of the human breath, such as would be the case of a tropical landing in the sea, vapor is forced and the water is produced. The construction of the cup is such that anyone can breathe through it for hours at a time without fatigue.



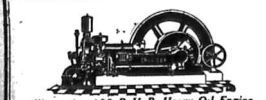

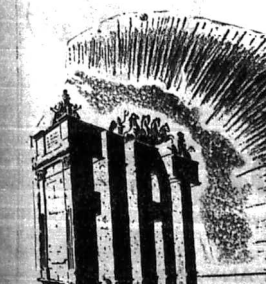
