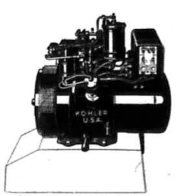


Aerial Mail Boxes, Farmerville, La., lighted by Kohler Electric Plant.

**SENTENCE OF FIVE YEARS IN FORGERY CASE.**

**Accused Pleads Guilty to Two Charges.**

Before Mr. Justice Sharada in the Supreme Court at Nairobi on Monday, Myer Herman (31) was charged with forging and passing as a result of which his late employers, the East African Steamship, Limited, were wrongfully deprived of the 20,000/- Public Interest in the case was satisfied by the Crown and by the Court when His Honour took the oath on the bench.

Mr. P. MacEwan appeared for the Crown, Mr. Bakker represented the accused and Mr. E. Tugge, K.C., held a watching brief for the East African Steamship.

The Judge addressing the accused said: Myer Herman, the first charge against you is that you on about August 15, 1926, employed by the East African Steamship you did forge a document, to wit a cheque which is a valuable security or to the alteration that you forged a document, a cheque, which was an authority purporting to authorize Barclay's Bank to pay over a sum of Shs. 6,254/- and the amount in which you are alleged to have forged it is by inserting a "1" before the figure in the millions column and by adding a "seven" after the "six" in the body of the document. You are further charged that in when it had been signed by Mr. Anderson and myself, you are further charged with having done that dishonestly or fraudulently or both—dishonestly with intent to create wrongful gain.

to yourself or wrongful gain, or dishonestly with intent to defraud. How do you say, guilty or not guilty. Answered: Guilty my Lord.

**Second Charge.**

His Honour: The second charge against you is in relation to a cheque dated September 13, 1927 and the facts of the charge are exactly the same as in connection with the first charge with the exception that the alteration called for was that you inserted "one" after the "eight" and "and" before the charge, you put a "1" before the "eight" and "and" before the charge. How do you say, guilty or not guilty. Answered: Guilty, my Lord.

**Crown Counsel** at this stage asked that the Court would put to the accused the facts as set out in the Supreme Court of South Africa at Pretoria on the 24th of August, 1926, he was convicted of the theft of a sum of £124/17/6 and was sentenced to two years and nine months hard labour.

**Accused's Statement.**

With the permission of the Judge accused's advocate then put in a written statement made by the accused. In the course of this, accused said he first came to Nairobi in October of 1925 and started work during the same month. For Mr. W. T. Trew as an accountant, in March of this, following year he obtained a similar post with the East African Steamship. Later he entered into partnership with the East African Steamship, and at the same time included in private banking transactions locally and also with South African bookmakers. The bookmaking business progressed very well until August, but after the losses held in Nairobi was forced that, although the

business was showing a profit, there was a good deal of money owing to it and there was not enough money to satisfy demands for the Nairobi season in August.

**Accused's Statement.**

He (accused) own name the sum of shillings ten thousand against certain accounts. The amount was towards payment for settlement of the obligation of Hunter and Simmons. About the 15th of August, 1927, he was being pressed by the Bank for payment of his own thousand pounds at that time, but such sums were not easily convertible into cash, and as he felt that it was necessary for him to maintain credit with the Bank, he very foolishly took on some paper or note from the first cheque dated the 15th day of August, 1927. With the amount of shillings ten thousand shown on that cheque, he paid the Bank £1,150/- (said accused's statement) Hunter and Simmons had outstanding and same valued at about seven hundred pounds, and depending on the good faith and integrity of those who owed money to the firm to pay.

**He had also backed a horse called "Canton" to win a contest for the October Race Meeting at Nairobi, and he had also another big bet on an English Race to be run in the month of October.**

He said that among the first amount of five hundred pounds was not partial and as he had personal anxiety to meet the same, he again had recourse to the same method, resulting in the loss of £2,115/- September being increased by Shillings Ten thousand, without the knowledge or consent of the employees. With this money he paid certain betting debts. This amount he said that from the Shillings Twenty thousand, the aggregate amount of the two cheques, he had not had any direct dealings with

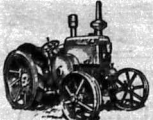

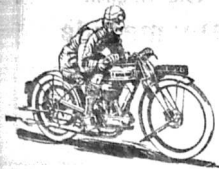

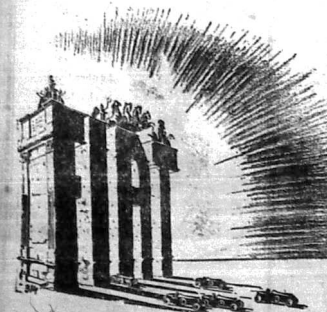

## WATER BORING DRILLS FOR HIRE BY PUBLIC.

Government Conditions and Scale of Charges.

The latest issue of the Kenya Official Gazette contains several pages of regulations governing water boring operations by Government.

In publishing the conditions for general information Government desires to notify the public that water-boring operations, in the interests of economy, will be conducted by means.

The Colony and Protectorate has been divided into twenty sections for this purpose comprising both non-native and native areas. In the event of the boreholes proving unproductive, i.e., if they are found to deliver less than one gallon per minute on test, the Government proposes during the experimental stage to reduce the charge made to the first ten applicants in each of these twenty sections to one-half of the scheduled tariff rate subject to a minimum charge of £20.

It will be realized that the limited number of drills available and the expense and difficulties of transport render it impossible to guarantee that individual applications will be accepted in the order in which they are received. Application in this respect with the Director of Public Works in Nairobi should be addressed on the appropriate form provided.

The regulations provide that the drills can be hired to applicants by Government on definite terms. Payment for the use of the drill can be made either by cash in advance, each on demand, when the job is finished or by three monthly instalments.

The D.P.W. desires to direct attention to the following points:

- 1. The Public Works Department will provide a foreman and necessary staff and the foreman will have entire direct charge of the drill and the boring operations.
- 2. The regulations will draw an eight hours day for the Government and staff and no work on Sundays.
- 3. The Department will give technical advice in the selection of suitable sites but will not give transportation services.
- 4. The number of successful boreholes to be drilled on any one property under one application

shall be at the discretion of the D.P.W. Boring shall be stopped when, in the opinion of the D.P.W., further reasonable water supply has been obtained a quantity to be settled before the operations are stopped. The direction of the D.P.W. is final and obligatory on the applicant.

On request and on payment of costs the Department will erect a hand pump at any bore hole.

The Director of Public Works finally reserves the right in circumstances of unusual or exceptional nature and with the consent of the applicant, to impose special conditions in addition to the ordinary terms of payment. Local transport costs, expenditure on erection, dismantling, etc., will be borne by the applicant for the drill.

**Charges.**

The charges set out in the Regulations are:

- For each day during erection or dismantling or boring, pumping tests on completion, £3.
- For each day during erecting Pump, £5 10s.

For each day to be any delay for which the applicant is responsible £5.

A minimum charge of £50 will be made for any bore hole.

No charge will be made during bad weather or illness on the part of the applicant.

The P.W.D. may apply an effect on applications, to provide a preliminary report on the water prospects, if transport and travelling costs are defrayed by the applicant. This can be done before application is made for the use of a drill.

In all cases of dispute the decision of the D.P.W. will be final.

## "I BELIEVE IN THE NANDI BEAR."

Kenya Game Warden's Record of Strange Killings.

### GHOSTLY VISITORS TO KAVIRONDO.

"The Game Warden of Uganda makes a simple confession of faith in his latest report. He says: 'I believe in the Nandi bear.' He inclines to the idea that it is a Giant Hyæna."

A record of strange killings in a cattle boma is given in which the perpetrator is believed to be akin to the great strand wolf of the Kalahari.

The assistance it was hoped would be given by the Game Bird Ordinance in protecting the species in Kenya by prohibiting the sale of birds or eggs has not been forthcoming and settlers are themselves to blame.

### FATTENING FISH FOR THE TABLE.

Further and final extracts are given to-day from the 1926 Report of the Game Warden of Kenya, Capt. A. T. A. Ritchie.

Under the heading of Departmental Activities during the year ending on his own share, he says: "While in England I attended the general meetings of the Society for the Preservation of the Fauna of the British Empire, and in connection with the Southern Game Reserve, the permission of the Secretary of State having been granted, were explained by me, and discussed."

I spent some time in consultation with experts on the subject of fattening fish, which is required in the event it will be found necessary to fence a portion of the Southern Game Reserve. My return to Kenya was postponed for a month, more to my departure, by the painful illness recently having my tonsils out.

Captain Whittier, who was Acting Senior Colonial Game Warden during my absence, spent the greater part of the year in the Northern Frontier visiting the following areas: Garba Tula, Archer's Post, Marsa, Kitere, Camp, Bulosa, Merri, the Kinnia and Shikari. Later he spent a considerable time in the Kitui area visiting among other things, the Tika and the Athi River areas, and Mombasa. While in this part of the country he had very bad luck. He was working intelligently amongst various native game and in his possession and was on the point of obtaining a considerable haul, having already the specimen which a newcomer expected him to present in an important elephant poaching case in which Mr. Brown was involved brought him into the limelight and his prospective victims quietly faded into air."

### The Nandi Bear.

The usual descriptions were experienced with native scenes. Some of the scenes, worked well, while others did nothing save elaborate stories of unusual success to be related on pay day. The most interesting was a complete fall of apparent enthusiasm on the part of the "game-watching" so soon as he is found out. It is of course to be expected that employes make about that the tracking of scenes must be difficult. For the nature of the work, it is not made at a time, beyond all doubt, the supervision, and few minutes of the time limit set by many people who know, in the maximum necessary for the emergency work of natives to work the charms of darkness.

A most unpleasant experience was had two weeks ago. The game-watching was very much surprised when they were met by a party of natives, consisting of several men and several boys, who previously gave evidence, resulting by using of the same. The natives were received very graciously, as also, I am glad to
