



The latest issue of the Kenya Official Gazette contains several ster boring operations by Gov

In publishing the conditions for ceneral information Government legires to notify the public that ater-boring operations, in the sterests of economy, will be connoted by zones.

The Colony and Protectorate nas been divided into twenty sec-ions for this purpose, comprising lati-toth non-native and native areas. In the event of the bore-holes proving unsuccessful, i.e., if they are found to deliver less than one gallon per minute on test Govern ment proposes during the experi-mental stage to reduce the charges o the first ten applicants in each of these twenty sections to one half of the scheduled tariff rates subject to a minimum charge of £30. Applicants in this category will be notified to this effect by the Director of Public Works.

It will be realised that the li-It will be realised that the li-mited number of drills available and the expenses and difficulties of transport render it impossible to guarantee that individual ap-plications will be accorded to in the order in which they are received. order in when they are received.



Natives and the Land

We might be pardoned if w nerely published the extract from the 1926 Annual Report of the Uganda Land and Survey Department, which appears claswhere in this issue, as an example o our own Land Department of the sublitties of an Annual Report. But while we may be permitted to hope that the value of the fact of publication will not be lost in Kenya from that restricted point t view, there are other aspects of statement with which we sire to deal more particularly. They are of interest to ourselves at a moment when we are facing veral problems related to land alienation and the questions releant to the future of the Native serves.
