MOMBASA, A "FREE PORT".

Informal Discussions Which Have Taken Place in Nairobi.

ENOURIES TO BE MADE IN THE EAST.

It was revealed at a special general meeting of the Mombasa Chamber of Commerce held last week that discussions have taken place in Nairobi, in which H. E. the Governer participated, with the object of declaring Mombasa a "free port."






