It was before us regarding a State on the lines of West Africa. If you get a Federal Council you run risks that they are not likely to go so far as the policy of duty to go on. If you have a Federal Council on which you have proper representation, and this country agrees to it as a form of federation, then you would be in a far safer position in regard to your civilization in Kenya than you are to-day. That is the only sense in which I think the Water that great dangers would attach to federation, I still think that the dangers on the other side are much greater. There is a danger of isolation which might arise under certain forms of federation in England. I do not think that in Kenya that has been done by unofficial members at the recent session and that you will refer to Captain Sawyer's resolution.

**Drainage Suggested.**
