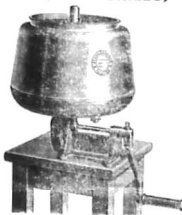

The Commons Fracas.

HIS MAJESTY'S SECRETARY CONFERS WITH PREMIER.

It transpires that after the meeting of the Ministers in the House of Commons yesterday evening Lord Knollys, Private Secretary to His Majesty the King, conferred with Mr. Asquith at the home of the speaker.

HOUSE ADJOURNED TILL MONDAY.

At the re-assembling of the Commons on Thursday morning the House was suspended as on the previous day.

Mr. Ronald MacNeill who yesterday threw the loc. of Mr. Churchill's proposal had been described as entirely reprehensible and he expressed his extreme loss of temper.

The speaker's motion and the proposal had evidently aroused very strong feeling and he humbly suggested that a little further time for reflection which might lead to a solution of the difficulty would be more in accordance with procedure than Mr. Asquith's motion and would not create a new precedent.

The acceptance of the suggestion by all sides of the House seemed to indicate that this procedure was agreed upon in the private consultation at the speaker's home.

Mr. Asquith welcomed the spirit of the suggestion and stated that it was the particular wish of the Government in no wise to break the continuity of the traditions of the House.

Mr. Bonar Law concurred with the Premier in accepting the suggestion.

The Opposition regard this course that has been adopted as a great victory.

The Commons then proceeded with other business.

Colonel Stanley announced that a resolution was being made in the South African Garrison by two regiments of cavalry and one regiment of horse, artillery, one foot of Royal engineers, and one battalion of Infantry.

His Excellency's Coast Tour.

VIEWS IRRIGATION WORKS.

VISITING PLANTATIONS

His Excellency the Governor, accompanied by Mrs. Bedford, left Nairobi with a staff by special train for the Coast on Friday afternoon the 1st inst.

Early the following morning His Excellency proceeded to Kiwazi where he received at the station by Major-General and B. Deane, Manager and Assistant Manager of the Anglo-East African Rubber Estate, and Mr. Morgan, Manager of the Kiwazi Rubber lands, who accompanied His Excellency on a tour of inspection of the Estate.

The party was first directed by Mr. Deane to a new house on his estate where a gas engine has recently been erected. Water will be pumped out of an adjoining tank, where there is a plentiful supply and distributed all about the estate by means of a pipe-line which is tapped at intervals to feed various running fountains and fountains of trees. A rubber tapping machine is distributed to the same engine.

Subsequently His Excellency and party were entertained to lunch by Mr. Morgan at the Kiwazi Estate. His Excellency returned to Kiwazi Station where the journey to the Coast was resumed in the evening and Mombasa was reached in the morning.

During his stay in Mombasa His Excellency inspected the townships, Government offices, the Government offices, and the site of the Kilindi Harbour Works. Some hours were also spent at the Customs and the port and Kilindi, where His Excellency made himself conversant with the difficulties attending in connection with the import and exports owing to the lack of facilities at the two ports.

Visits were paid to the East African Industrial at Kilindi where His Excellency was met by Messrs. Millett and the Nyali Salt Estate of which Mr. Redwell is the Manager, and the Church Missionary Society at Kilindi.

Deputations attended on His Excellency from the Mombasa Chamber of Commerce, the B.E.A. Planters' Association, Mombasa residents and the Committee of the Indian Society.

A five days trip was made by sea to Kilifi and Malindi. At Kilifi His Excellency called on the Malindi Plantation where Mr. Dodge, the Manager, conducted a tour of the whole estate, the plants of which appear to flourish in all stages in spite of the severe drought experienced on the Coast this year. Taloungi Government station and town, the latter the old headquarters of the Marni Arabs, were inspected during the afternoon.

From Kilifi His Excellency and party were taken by Captain Chatterton in his motor launch to Kenjoia which is within half an hour's walk of the Sokoli Rubber Estate where a camp was pitched for the night.

The party returned to Kilifi on the following day by the same way after a walk through the neighbouring forest area. The journey was continued to Malindi in the Government launch "Mvita." On Monday afternoon His Excellency received deputations from the Malindi Chamber of Commerce and the Malindi Committee and he inspected all Government buildings.

On the morning day the Malindi Plantations, Manager, Mr. Hind, and another Rubber Estate managed by Mr. Doherty, were visited and in the evening the party returned to Mombasa on board a s.s.

The Government Farm at Maresa was inspected on the return journey to Nairobi, and reached on Sunday afternoon, November 17.

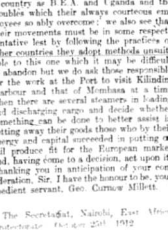

**MEMBERSHIP BRANCH.**

The Nursing Association having secured a block of land from the Government on which to build a small Nursing Home at Mombasa, the local committee of the Coastal League is at present engaged in securing special offers to raise funds for the purpose. In this work Mrs. Maclean is the leading spirit and is in contact with the "P. A. Standard" soliciting the assistance of the paper also applying to other papers to the effect of the smallness of the white population in this district. It would be very gratifying to the committee if such rights could be secured from the Highlands, and even from from the Highlands. At present time the only nursing staff at Mombasa was that of the European Hospital, the members of which were not available for outside cases or maternity work.

### Distinguished Indian.

**VISITING SOUTH AFRICA.**

The Hon. Gopal Gokhale (civ. is at present touring South Africa as a guest of the Government for the purpose of studying first hand and on the spot the Indian question. He has developed largely as a result of his penitentiary and industrial life in the plantations. The distinguished Mahatma has a general influence over his fellow countrymen which he holds with acknowledged discretion. He is a member of the Council of the Viceroy of India. A. C. Chatterjee was awarded a public welcome in the City Hall which was presided over by the Mayor Mr. Harry Hanson. Senator Schreiner delivered one of his characteristic speeches, in which the guest regaled on some length. He admitted that there was no doubt whatever that the Government of India in South Africa was an extreme difficulty and an extremely complex one. He would not say it was simply a matter of what they had to do to treat them all on an equal basis, and there was an end to the matter.

As a labor leader Mr. Gokhale availed himself of the opportunity afforded him of a banquet given in his honour at Kimberley to refer to the Indian claims for fair treatment. He said the Indian Congress was bound to understand and recognize the difficulties of the European community, and that that treatment should be such as to be reasonably satisfactory. It could not be absolutely equal, it should be so far just and humane as to be reasonably satisfactory. The Indian Congress must not neglect the Indian problems here in South Africa. The progress of the industry system in the Natal sugar plantations. The Free Indian followed the work of the Indian laborer in the West. There was no doubt an appreciable scale on the part of Indians to emigrate. They are now working for labor and the majority of labor in India was such that it was difficult to find labor for Indian requirements. India could not exhaust the irrigation funds because of the necessity of labor, while Durban was continually empty to-day. The system of indentured labor had been stopped, and he would ask them to wait and stand for a short time—two or three years—and see how the Indians would come. They would be surprised to find that now that the indentured system had been stopped, the Indians would not have much to complain of. But they must realize that, Indians were in the future entitled to just and humane treatment, and secondly they must be made to feel that they were citizens of the Empire.

will suggest a lay commission with a sprinkling of technical commissioners. It was noted that the Commission might be formed. He felt they were more likely to get a reasonable working scheme if they have such a committee.

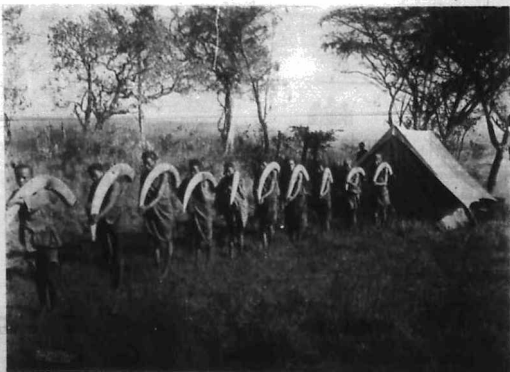

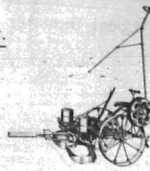

## Stock Management.

### PIG RAISING.

In the "Melbourne Times" a special representative of that journal contributes an interesting article on farming conditions in the United States of America. His observations on pig-raising are interesting as giving the experience of the country with the largest swine industry in the world. An American experimenter, he says, so far as he could be gleaned from inquiries from Dr. Bennett, the head of the animal husbandry branch in the United States Department of Agriculture at Washington, and from Mr. A. Krogemann one of the buyers in Chicago for Armour, and from a visit to the industry in Pennsylvania, is that the industry is not dependent upon the corn or maize growing sections, and that although in the States by far the greatest number of pigs come from those areas, the quantities from beyond the corn belt are increasing, and that in some cases the quality was improving. Where corn was not procurable other food had to be given, particularly peas and barley, and that as far as investigations had gone the best colored flesh was frequently obtained upon corn the flesh was placed solely upon corn and that, while corn made a good food, judgment had to be exercised in its use. That legs and corn are interdependent, therefore, is not a fact, and so far as Australia is concerned, we are not necessarily to look to our maize growing localities to extend the pig industry. To some extent we have already experience of our own to guide us, and Victoria where only a small amount of maize is grown, is making more progress with pig raising than any other State.

### FEEDING AND MANAGEMENT.

While the first phase in pig raising in this country is the corn zone, and while the grain as the position matters, especially in the States, possesses great advantages in hastening the growth, it has not without its disadvantages, one of which is a detrimental effect on the fecundity of the breeding stock. Dr. Bennett stated that as one result of the farmers in the Southern States where corn is raised, and the noticeable change in their system of feeding and management, and though they might still claim maize as the basis of their feeding ration, they are giving a bigger proportion of green food and peas than formerly. Any locality that grows a small variety of foods is regarded by him as the best place to have the surface of the soil as light and locally where dairying is common, no better advantages are required; given humus, pasture, clover, alfalfa, peas, beans, etc.—as a basis, with also dairy by-products, the very highest grade of pork can be produced at a minimum cost. Despite America's advantages as a corn-growing country, this is the opinion of their recognized expert, and his statement of the case is of some interest to us who are inclined to give more weight to the opinion of the pessimist than the experience of an expert.

Iowa is the chief pig-producing State of America, and was estimated to produce the number of swine within its borders about one-sixth of the total of swine in the United States. Iowa is also one of the largest maize-producing countries. It is estimated that the day the train passed through some of those country in the world, and everywhere the harvesting of the corn was in full swing. Illinois and Nebraska were also producing the farmer on the east and the latter on the west, and also supplying the maize and wine States. Each year between 4,000,000 and 5,000,000 hogs annually. In fact the demand upon the British stock almost depleted the farms of the best stock, just as the demand in Argentina for Shorthorn within recent years has absorbed all the best cattle the British breeder can give. One of the first sires of the Iowa farmers, was early imported, and it is often stated that his progeny has been increased by as much as 30 and even 50 per cent. Breeders in other States then paid more attention to breeding problems, and with what success may be judged from a statement made in 1891 by Dr. Bennett that there was a difference of from 4 to 5 dollars head in the value of swine in those States where breeding had been neglected, and those where it had received attention.

The very first object of cultivation is to give scope to the roots of plants to spread in every direction, for without abundance of roots no plant can become vigorous, in which it is placed. The quantity of food taken from the soil does not depend upon the quantity in the soil, but on the number of absorbing root fibres. The more fibrous and pulverulent the more the fibres are increased, the more food is obtained, and the more vigorous the plant becomes. Any house plant growing in an earthenware pot will demonstrate this. The roots grow down and then, finding an obstruction, begin to grow round and round in search of food, until the entire pot is filled with root fibres, even forcing out the soil to find room, and when they have grown to the limit of their confined space, the plant starts growing and becomes stumpy. This culture, however, is not only essentially precious in shading or sowing, but highly beneficial afterward during the progress of vegetation, and when practiced in the spaces between the plants it also operates as a method of root-pruning, by which the extended fibres are cut off, or shortened, thereby causing them to throw out numerous other fibres, whereby the mouths or ends of the plants are greatly increased, and their food capacity enhanced. It is very much like fattening animals for market by increasing their consumption of fattening food.

### DEPTH OF CULTIVATION.

The depth of cultivation must depend upon the nature of the soil and the variety of plant grown in it. The subsoil, also, is not to be disregarded. Rich clayey soils can hardly be cultivated too deep, and even in sands unless the subsoil contains alluvial in dangerous quantities, or other plank passages. Deep cultivation should be practiced. When the roots are deep they are less liable to be injured by excessive water or drought, they reach the rich earth into every part of the soil, the space from which nourishment is to be drawn being extended over a much greater extent than when the soil is superficially inserted in the soil. In this respect cultivation should be attended with a thoroughness of care. Ploughing, of course, has the result in a great measure, but the difference of greatly between the organic and the inorganic matters in the earth, has a tendency to separate them, for which reason light or shallow stirring of the soil is of little or no use practically, because it leaves the surface of the soil too light and springy and the lower part too compact and stony. Even where the plant roots are near the surface cultivation with a plough and a complete turning over of the soil is much better than the mere scuffling of the surface, for there, as has been said, it is equivalent to not ploughing.

### CONSOLIDATION.

When the soil, however, require the opposite to pulverization and dinnal mechanical consolidation. This will be understood in the case of the spring soils and light, dusty sands. A proper degree of subsoiliness is best given low soils by the addition of early timbers in which they are deficient, perhaps the striking up of a heavier and more consistent material will accomplish the purpose. Tilling and treading, however, are simple methods, but in that case the soil must be dry, and the operation must not be carried too far, or so far as to concrete the earth, which is not the object intended. A post bog drained and rolled will occur before covered with grass than one equally well drained left to itself. In heavy sands, however, may well be rolled when wet, and by repeating the process after rains or floodings, they will in time acquire a surface of grass or herbage. Tight soils should always be rolled, and the seeds should be not in when planted, a pat with the foot not being sufficient as in the case of heavier soils, unless the seeds be very small.

For years past a feeling of public dissatisfaction with our two administrative bodies—the Legislative Council and the Municipal Commission—has been steadily increasing in the country generally.

Now, while it is not our desire to be conclusively settling on a string already sufficiently responsible for a "monstrous disservice" we feel that it is time for some other affairs are to be straightened out, and our public business conducted upon the lines of a progressive and sane policy.

Against individual members of the two chambers in authority we do not wish to come in consistent with a sense of justice, and to give individuals the benefit of justice, and nevertheless, we can hardly refrain from expressing the opinion that the personnel of these two administrative bodies is scarcely all that could be desired, from a business point of view, we most emphatically claim that an effective, working legislative and municipal machine the Legislative Council and the Municipal Commission are, in our view, fulfilling those functions for which they were designed.

This conclusion we have arrived at with some substance of the assertion, "It is not the well as in some of the governing power in the Protectorate."

This is the day of election, not selection, and that British East Africa should so far be behind in the march of modern progress is the more surprising, in view of the rapid and enthusiastic country in every other direction.

We would, however, suggest to His Majesty's Government, presents him and the community as a representative of the people, and to immediately put into operation such enquiries as will convince him of the very real and urgent need of administrative reform, both governmental and municipal. We claim, in delay commensurate with the progress of the people for a popular representation of the people—for a system of election by ballot such as obtains in Britain and similar enlightened democratic countries.

### The Peril for the Powers

With one exception—the Peace of Helgrad (1763) by which Austria had to surrender Belgrade and Northern Serbia, which she had acquired under the Treaty of Passarowitz—every war subsequent to the decisive Battle of St. Gothard in 1664, when Turane's great rival, Montemucelli, defeated the Turks, has left the Ottoman Empire with greatly diminished frontiers. There is, indeed, no reason why events should move differently now. If the Balkan Allies win victories, "sada quatuor"—and the only quarter—a very serious one—will be over the division of the spoils. If on the other hand, the Turks win victories in Serbia, or in Bulgaria, or in Athens in 1876, in Europe, or in some European Power, will intervene to save them. Thus in 1876, in what was called the first Servian War, the Turks defeated the Servians and were marching on Belgrade when Russia intervened in November. Then followed the Constantinople Conference, when Lord Salisbury went as special Ambassador. Montenegro also was at war with the Serbs, but she was not allowed to enter to get across for warships into the Mediterranean, but not allow the warships of other Powers to enter the Black Sea. In proportion as Rumania and Bulgaria get stronger, they will claim for themselves every privilege which Russia asks in the Black Sea, and Austria-Hungary will probably say that her war and her right to enter the Black Sea through the Bosphorus are her own. One can see the Luft-Diplomacy now so famous—in the lower reaches of the Danube, and so into the Black Sea.

The boundaries between Turkey and Rumania in Armenia, the direction of Lake Urmia would give Russia a pretext for war with Turkey at any time, as they are close to the Bosphorus frontier also. The Turks have been foolish enough for several years to permit the Russian fleet to have a base. It is understood, hold all the important military positions in the mountains on the frontiers of Rumania, except the city of Khotin, which is especially dealt with by Article 60 of the Treaty of Berlin, but they have no war right to them, and perhaps none at all.

Their idea probably was, and is, that Russia will invade the Balkans, and that, from the positions referred to, they could strike powerfully at any Russian force advanced to the South. The Committee said it was weak nominally to survey and

settle the boundary, but it is doubtful if any real progress has been made. There is a very long chapter of diplomacy behind this matter. Lord Curzon went an elaborate paper on it some years ago for the geographical office, to be found in his Transactions.

Totally-ridiculous Austria-Hungary, by her position and army, holds the key to the situation; for her there must be no change of ownership in Macedonia, to parts of which she claims the right, she will lay claim. Great Britain is principally interested (1) as a Power with millions of Moslem subjects, and with large Mediterranean interests and an effective occupation of Egypt; and (2) from a power protecting Crete, and wishing the Aegean Islands change their allegiance to the Greek and Italian Powers, as the most likely interested from the financial point of view, though this also nearly applies to Russia. Italy's interest approximates to Russia's. Austria is largely territorial; our own both territorial and religious.

For that purpose the Committee is obtaining a list of the ten or so chief rubber companies all over the world, and it is probable that they intend, so far as possible, to call upon the directors of each of these companies. Indeed, the existence of the Committee is the outcome of the Commission's work is likely to be far more important in this particular direction, for no company is ever likely to be definitely proved to be in violation of the Putumayo Director's law if it did not know what was an under administration. The Home Rule Bill finally moves on in Committee. This week we finished Clause 4, which deals with the power of the Executive, and the divisions have shown that the Liberal majority is unshaken. 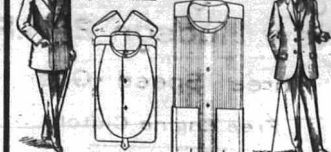
