NOTES ON THE CLASSES.

Horses a Strong Feature of the Show.

NUMBER OF BADLY STAGED EXHIBITS.

("East African Standard" Special Correspondent.)

**Egbert**  
The value of Agricultural Shows lies in the lessons to be learned from the classes. The exhibitor's report is a valuable contribution to the knowledge gained from a show.

The following notes on the classes comprising the Egbert Show, will, I hope, be found of interest.

**Waxed Farm Produce.**  
The exhibits as a whole in this class were highly prepared.

In the Cakes class the second prize was probably better grain than that which was awarded the first prize but it was not so well displayed.

The first prize for beans was for a very good bag.

The buckwheat was very dirty and the exhibit there was almost rubbish.

The livers as well as quality.

In the only exhibit in the class for a collection of roots, the carrots and potatoes were good, the mangolds and beets fair and the three turnips which were shown should not have been staged.

There was nothing outstanding in this class; the entries were poor but those that there were, were of good quality, though poorly staged and displayed.

**Horticultural.**  
Lady Muriel Jas. Blake who judged the Horticultural classes told the Standard representative that in view of the fact that time had been so run in the District since last September it was marvellous that any flowers were shown at all.

The entries naturally were very small, many of the classes having only one exhibitor. There was only one competitor in the rose class and the flower shown was past its best. Carnations were slightly better.

The first prize winner in the class for cut flowers showed a large number of flowers but they were badly arranged and would have shown to better advantage if they had been separated. The second prize winner put up a rather poor display.

No prize was awarded in the section for Cactus.

The prize winning vegetable was exceptionally good and would have attracted attention if they had been shown in Nairobi. Tomatoes and potatoes were very good.

In the Fruit section the plums were disappointingly good, but the apples were not of a high standard from the class. There were only two varieties shown.

In spite of the drought the cabbages were greater in number and better in quality than at the show two years ago.

**Home Food Products.**  
In the Home Food Products section the entries were small in number, largely on account of the dry weather. The exhibits shown were of good quality but there was unfortunately very little competition in any class and therefore no comparison becomes possible. The bottled fruits were excellent.

In spite of the small entries in the Home Cured Ham classes, the exhibits were exceptionally good.

**Pigs.**  
There was very little competition in this section, the only breed shown being the Berkshire. The quality of the three exhibits was good.

**Cows.**  
In his report on this section the judge states:

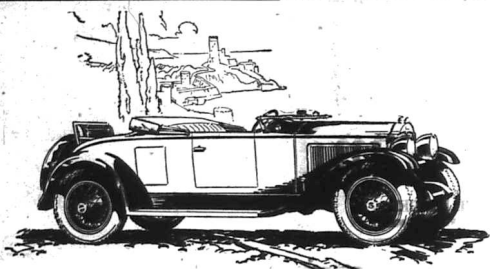
There was very little competition between the first and second prize winners in the Cows in Friesian, Jersey and Guernsey classes. The first prize was awarded on account of more even dresses. All samples showed a tendency to over-drying.

In the class for coffee, card, steamed and upgraded, the winning beans were very bold, showing good colour. The second prize was awarded to a sample which contained dust and broken parchment. The hulling process requires improvement.

Coffee, card cleaned and graded first prize awarded to a sample that put up as in last class, the grading being particularly uniform. The second prize had colour by being over-dried which is probably the cause of there being too much air-ter skin.

There was only one exhibit in the class for a sample of coffee seed, and this was of a particularly nice bold type. In seed selection

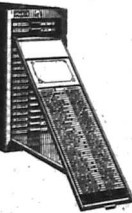

## "TRADE STREET" ELDORET.

More Features of the Commercial Exhibits.

AN INTERESTING SECTION.

(STANDARD SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT.)  
Eldoret. Following are further and concluding notes on the Trade Exhibitions at the Eldoret Show. The first portion reported in the early edition of the Standard on Saturday.

**T. J. O'Shea and Co., Ltd.**  
Expectations had run high that Messrs. O'Shea would satisfy at least the country which the public have witnessed ever since they knew that the Ford Works were actually going to put a new car on the market. These hopes, however, despite every effort, were doomed when it became known that the ship bringing the first car was due to arrive four days later than was anticipated. A large protest poster centered on the stand of the new car attracted much attention. Messrs. O'Shea are the local agents for Ford cars and Fordium is a representative display as also complete range of the Oliver farm implements. Trade of these was done by the Red River motor picker. Delivery of this machine was delayed for two years whilst experiments were being conducted for the best perfection and even now the looking attachment has still to pass its final tests. The whole machine is so built up as to be an integral part of the Fordson tractor. All parts are cast on the ground, as it is reported from the power side of it, and the speed is claimed that seven seven a day can be harvested and the fallow made out to clearly doubled.

**Gair, Lawson & Co., Ltd.**  
To have won first prize in the Agricultural Machinery Section was no mean achievement, when the display generally was of such a high order. Gair and attention was also shown to placing the various exhibits and adequate examination of such implement was given. Handed out to be used in being it is desired to mention that the Harrow Dragon also plough for tractor. Specially designed for East African conditions, it dominates one a strength of construction and a sturdy plough of 4 or 5 ft. There are no more than 1000 ft. of plowing being regulated by a worm thread and a plunger spring could also be seen in operation of course. There was found for the Caterpillar Tractor and the Two Ton Haul whilst emphasis was given to these tractors by a cunningly arranged lighting display of their trade mark, the current being provided by a Lister Lighting Plant.

**Gair, Lawson & Co.**  
The firm is the agent in Eldoret for the International Harvester Company, and staged a very representative exhibit of their well known farm implements. Special mention must be made of the Farmall Tractor which is a comparatively new addition to the firm's machines. As in the same simple, it has many and diverse uses. It is a three-wheeled internal combustion engine with one forward wheel. This allows of tilting between rows of maize and of carrying it attached between the forward and rear wheels. There is a draw bar for draught and a bolt pulley and such universal uses have given this machine its name. Another new importation was the Diesel tractor plough which is intended to fulfil the functions of both a plough and a harrow.

The motorize have certainly not been forgotten for there was a very fine display of the well-known makes which Messrs. Gair, Lawson & Co. represent. Great admiration was expressed at the lawnmower, the Deere Nash Coupe Model. There was also on show the new Rugby Four Tracer, Canadian Model, with all conceivable fittings. Standard Models of the Austin, Essex, Nash and Rugby Tractors were on exhibit. And not to be overlooked was a display of Whatshall's Central Oil. Messrs. Gair, Lawson have developed a business and a very interesting and profitable range of goods.

**Fraser & Co. Agents of Africans Ltd.**  
An opportunity was afforded for the time in for many people of the neighbouring districts to have a specially built internal combustion engine with a water pump and a plough hitch. A special feature in the list of the differential which can be instantly applied when there is danger of the wheels digging in on soft ground. By locking the differential both wheels are in operation together and the soft spots thereby overcome. Electric head lamps can be fitted for night work. The engine is of the agricultural implements manufactured in England by Messrs. Marfirth and Fris attached most attention. Much admiration was evoked at the various lenses and instruments of Zeiss manufacture on view.

Leading interest centered round the Klein-Daimler Monoplane that flew over from Nairobi and landed near the Show ground on Tuesday evening. The monoplane and real appearance of this little machine were very much admired and not a few aviators glanced over at the pilot.

**J. R. Cox & Co.**  
As might have been expected from a company that has shown its interest in their Headquarters in Kenya, this firm exhibited was a notable feature in the Trade Section. Occupying a prominent position on the stand was a charming building built of concrete blocks and covered with an artistic red tile roof, a striking advertisement for the high class building materials manufactured by this firm at their Eldoret works.

A portion of their stand was devoted to a display of building materials including concrete blocks and tiles of numerous sizes and patterns. Critical Steel windows, fire boarding, asbestos Roofing and Flooring materials etc.

A comprehensive range of "Wright's" Block and the machinery, concrete mixer etc., were shown, and the adoption of these machines by builders and contractors is readily understood on examination of the design and finish.

In the foreground of the stand was a striking display of farm machinery made by the Benson Farming Manufacturing Co., and the care and trouble taken by the firm in the selection of implements suitable for East African conditions is likely to be rewarded. Amongst the items of special interest were a Tractor (now almost worn) in particular, efficient in "touch" in the field and on a hillside, a Power Controlled Drill Harrow, Chequer and ordinary Drill plough.

**Wells "Columbs" Mower and Reaper and Binder, Dies and Miscellaneous Frigates, Grass Drill etc.**  
The "Lama" exhibit included a 15-20 h.p. Farm Tractor with charcoal heating device for starting. With a wide range of wheel extensions etc., suitable for all weather and soil conditions. A 15-20 h.p. Road Tractor, fitted with rubber tyres, and very head lights etc., and with very recently designed mould brake for the rear wheels.

A portable steam engine made by the "Easton Warren Works" Shrewsbury was a splendid example of this well known British firm's manufactures.

Another interesting section of this exhibit was that of "Deutz" stationary engines. Two models were shown, one of 4 h.p. running on kerosene, and a very neat compact engine giving promise of lasting quality, and one 12 h.p. Diesel engine, an extremely strongly designed engine, at a remarkably low figure.

## THE ELECTRICAL SYSTEM.

### Regulating the Dynamo Charge.

#### VOLTAGE AND CURRENT.

The function of the charging dynamo is to charge the car battery which supplies current for the lamps, starting motor, ignition, horn, etc. The voltage is far standard, but the dynamo is not electrically tied to it, and so the voltage required per cell of charging varies from 2.5 to 2.7. Thus for a 6-cell system, the charging voltage will vary from 15 to 16.2 volts, and for a 12-cell system from 30 to 32.4 volts. The voltage variation, therefore, is required to about 20 per cent. (On the other hand, the dynamo (or engine) speed may vary over a range of several hundred per cent. above the rated speed.)

The difficulty in meeting this requirement at once has been the problem, when it is remembered that the voltage of a dynamo with a constant ordinary dynamo with a constant speed or field current is practically constant. #### The Three Brush Dynamo.

The automatic cut-out. This is an essential feature of both types of regulation. **Juvenile Labour.**

We republish this morning an interesting reply by the Bishop of Southern Rhodesia to an article in the *Juvenile Labour Ordinance* recently introduced by Government. There were two points in the measure which attract the attention of critics. In the first place Native Commissioners were given power, under the Bill, to take charge of juveniles, if found to be without work, and, in the absence of parents or guardians, contract the juvenile with an employer for not more than six months. In the second place, Native Commissioners were given the power to issue warrants for juveniles against parents and to inflict a fine not exceeding five £10 or a whipping. The Bishop of Southern Rhodesia has taken strong exception to the measure on account of its unqualified character. He has strongly deprecated the Government of the colony and has pointed out that had the measure been entitled the "Child Protection Bill" the criticism would not have arisen. According to the Bishop, the object of the measure is to give Government power to take out of bed surround- ing orphan children, or children without proper guardians, and to place them under a carefully selected employer for not longer than six months at a time. The facts are that children are being taken into contracts which are neither binding on themselves nor on their employers and are being handed with the danger of removal, outside of charitable institutions. He believes that the purpose and object of the Government is to endeavour, by this kind similar measure, to regulate the flow of juvenile labour and

not proper guardians are in need of special protection by the State. It is to be noted, however, too, that if the Bill is actually administered it will tend to increase private employment by withdrawing from unsuitable children already in employment. The controversy was summarised by Kono, an all-Ireland politician met here. We find in the Report of the recent Labour Commission in Kenya which was originally, has been reported by the Colonial Office although an extension of residence has not yet been forthcoming—an expression of opinion, unfavourable largely to the Rhodesian Bill. The Commission of Kenya should take all reasonable steps to encourage the use of private labour under proper safeguards for the benefit of employer and employee alike. It is added by the Report that the principle of juvenile employment has been accepted by the Medical Department of the Colony and by the Chief Native Commissioner "as in no way harmful to the natives." The Commission expressed the opinion that the employment of juveniles on farms removes the children from the bad influences of towns, that the conditions of their life on farms are superior to those in the reserves and that the absence of discipline in a reserve factor is more parental control in the reserves "a very little exercised". The latest report of the work of the Judicial Department in Kenya deals with the year 1925. It is, we think, a significant criticism of the Report that in the criminal statistics no endeavour is made to indicate the number of juveniles involved in prosecutions and convictions. The only reference occurs under the heading of "Whippings" where it is shown that whereas in 1922 the number of whippings imposed by Magistrates was 900, there has been a steady decline in the form of publications and the number in 1926 was only 396. The majority of the persons so punished by Magistrates were 900. Reports of the Police Department upon crime in the Colony is equally

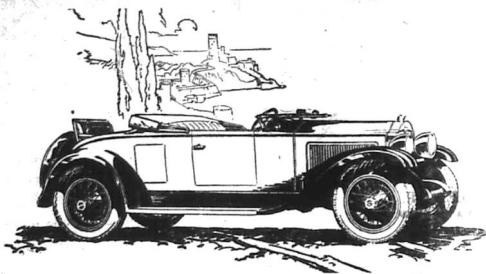

The country has been free from epidemics of serious diseases. Malaria was common, always with us and will always require watching, and no outbreak of any magnitude has occurred during 1927.

### Disease from India.

Disinfection is carried out into Nairobi from India, and numerous cases were caused from the fact that some of the Indian troops carried considerable amounts of malarial parasites. Original cases had remained unobserved. Probably owing to the wholesale vaccination campaign which was conducted two years ago the outbreak did not assume any magnitude.

The epidemic of malaria which was experienced in 1926 did not recur, possibly owing to the fact that the rains generally were on the short side. The problem is to be tackled extensively in Nairobi. An amount of 500,000 units of vaccine was available a sum of £50,000 was expended in Nairobi during the present year. The Municipality and Railway authorities have discontinued their willingness to share in the expense, and there is little doubt that considerable progress will be made.

The International Sleeping Sickness Commission, part of whose business was conducted in Kenya, has dissolved, and its reports may be expected before long. It was possible during the year to conduct a comprehensive population survey of the Lake shore. Over 200,000 individuals were examined and only 800 cases of trypanosomiasis were detected. These numbers being found in three well-defined areas. In one small locality containing a population of 800 odd, over 100 cases were found. Measures to deal with the most thickly infected areas are being undertaken. The small areas referred to as being especially heavily infected is to be eradicated. Other steps will include clearing of the Lake shore, and the construction of watering tanks. It was also noted that the construction of a road through the interior has been completed.

**Hospital Policy.**  
The future position with regard to hospitals in Nairobi has at last been settled. At the Budget Session of Legislative Council the announcement was made that a definite decision had been reached that the scheme for the combined hospital should be abandoned. Other plans remain to be settled, these being to build a new European Hospital which continues to be under consideration. It shall be run by the European community, whether the native hospital shall remain at its present site or shall be removed elsewhere and if so where.

The scheme for the removal of some of the hospitals in various parts of the country, as far as those built by the Government, is still under consideration. A small hospital at Kilifi is also being considered, while work has been commenced on the building of a dispensary at Mombasa. The present consultative body which was set up by the Government is still in existence, but it is not possible to say whether the future of the hospital at Nairobi is impossible to proceed with any organized measure, and the training of hospital assistants. Nothing would be done until buildings had been provided. Towards the end of the year provision was made for the erection of the necessary dispensary at Mombasa. Unfortunately it was too late in the year for the work to be commenced. One of the craves made by the Government and approved by generally is for the erection of a dispensary in the interior. Disinfectant stations, which are known to be of great value in carrying out the work required of them under supervision, at the hospitals, or in individual cases of disseminated cases.
