## BRITAIN'S NEW £1,000,000 SHOP WINDOW.

Manchester to Have Its Wembley.

### GIANTIC HALL

A great project of great national importance is the building of the British Empire Exhibition at Wembley. The scheme is to be a building of gigantic proportions, to be known as the British Empire Exhibition Building. ### Dormaged Concrete.

It will be built of concrete, like Wembley, but of a different kind, and the method of construction will also be different. The trade hall, for example, which will be the largest hall in Britain, will be built of corrugated concrete. This is the invention of Sir Owen Williams, the engineer of the British Empire Exhibition. It will be the first time that concrete has been used in a corrugated form.

The hall will be in the form of a square tower, 825 feet long, 225 feet wide—50 feet wider than Olympia in London—and 100 feet high. It should be ready in six months and it will be possible to erect anything—a trade exhibition, a horse show, a prize fight, and even a football match under cover. From an ornamental point of view it will also be ideal for concerts. We have discovered that the average towns turn up and distribute money for more events than does a cathedral.

In the interesting feature of the exhibition will be a theater built on the most up-to-date lines. The latest London theater is all but twenty-five years behind the times according to American ideas. We hope to build something as good as nothing in Broadway, especially in interior design and decoration.

The theatre will seat 3,000 people, and will be able to present anything from a spectacle to a drawing room play. There will also be a cinema to seat a thousand people.

**Six Acre Park**

The amusement park will cover six acres, and offer all the latest amusements, including a giant race, twice the size of the famous "Wembley" race. The amusement park is scheduled to open to the public in June.

The site of the exhibition is being leased by the British Council of what amounts to a peppercorn rent. The exhibition, which Wembley, improves the city's revenue considerably, is not being built off the map, but within a possible 2000 yards of Manchester City Hall. It will offer an attraction to a population of 10,000,000 people from Manchester, its satellite towns, and Liverpool.

As present it is well over twelve acres, but it is bound to be extended. An "e" trade improvement of the Million Pound Shop Window is bound to be recognized. It will give the world of England what it has long needed for years—a permanent show shop of its trade and manufacturing, where overseas buyers can come at all times in search of supplies.

# MOTURING TOPICS

## TIRE EVOLUTION

### A New Development in Construction.

#### AN APOLYPTIC

Before the Institution of Mechanical Engineers, Captain C. H. Kibben, in his paper on military transport vehicles, foretold the possibility of an oval section pneumatic tyre, as a means of saving higher diameter, and thereby avoiding the damage caused to the tyre by the best from the adjacent wheels.

Many students of motor transport and tyre sections have recently been inclined to believe that tyre construction has by now reached its zenith, and that any revolutionary development was impossible, or at any rate highly improbable, or at least an altogether surprising innovation.

However, the developments of pneumatic tyres, more particularly for low and medium pressures. Nevertheless, the latest form of air tyre may possibly exercise yet further, and very great, influence on the tyre question, and thereby on the entire problem of motor transport.

Students of motor transport will recollect that the appearance of the low-pressure pneumatic was due to the realization of the need for a tyre that would give at least double the normal deflection of the high-pressure pneumatic load.

Moreover, with lower ply and greater height of section, it has not the same lateral stability. It is a great mistake to designate any type of low-pressure tyre, that is not equipped for pneumatic cars, with only a simple oval foundation, as an efficient or safe one with low ply, and the same remark applies to great measures for low-pressure transport. For this week the article of the latest form of tyre has found that a pressure should be made with an oval ply, the low-pressure pneumatic tyre should, if required, offer things being equal, except the vertical

height of section which in the new tyre is reduced.

#### The New Oval Tyre.

To overcome these objections the oval section pneumatic tyre has been evolved, its shorter walls its lower height of section, and its abnormal width, permit the same number of ply as in the high-pressure tyre it replaces, and without increasing the weight of the cover, a very important constructional feature.

But there are other virtues in these shorter walls of section, in that they give greater lateral stability, more particularly with the formation of a circular section or equal form, with its greater width than the high-pressure tyre.

Further, less injurious wear or movement is imposed on the walls of the casing, it will be remembered that the low-pressure tyre was a great formation; the new tyre is quieter still.

Obviously, the form of oval width of the wheel and the construction, affords the maximum safety, without having to alter the standard dimensions of wheels or brake drums. The section height of the tyre is the same as that of the standard high-pressure tyre, but with greatly increased width, and of course with the standard wheel diameter, say, 20 or 24 in., possible with high-pressure tyres, the trouble from brake lining heat will not be caused by the wheels, or of sufficient diameter to wear away from the brake drum.

With the low-pressure tyre it has been found in practice that the tyre, in wheel diameter, caused by the larger tyre section, leads to a reduction from the heat being conducted from the tyre; indeed, in some cases, the resulting reduction in deflection to tyre with the fewer plies of curves has been put at fully 25 per cent.

That this decrease in actual height of section, is accompanied by a great increase of stability, and body with a really the combined

point for success in tyre designing. So wide is the tread that a single tyre can more than support more equivalent tyre tyres to carry the same load. Thus, with a tyre all width can be reduced.

Of course, also, in this new tyre the principle is retained of making the construction so that the deflection under load, the tread area in contact with ground increases proportionately with the load, and thus load pressure are maintained constant.

The inventor of this new tyre explains that, other things being equal he has found that the satisfactory of a tyre under maximum load amounts to one-quarter of its nominal width. Manifestly then, the wider the tyre the greater the shock absorption.

Thus from this aspect the ideal would be a tyre with a cross-section reaching right to the center of the wheel and tyre and widened in fact. Now though such a tyre is manifestly impracticable, it will be noticed that, if the oval shaped tread were continued to each side, the whole would form a section, reaching in some cases to near the wheel center, in others even beyond. And after all, it is only the tread, as the part in contact with the road, that matters, other things being equal.

Thus with a construction say, 35 to 40 per cent wider than the existing low-pressure tyre, the increase enables to have achieved a tyre attaining to the theoretical ideal. Not only is the tyre light for this in equivalent in ordinary low-pressure tyre, but it is claimed to be manifestly cheaper, a most important point in these days of cost prices.

Clearly, too, this reduction in section height is of advantage in possible cases of actual deflation. In such a case, assuming the wheel rim at once drops on to the road, with a low-pressure tyre it falls lower, whereas with an equivalent oval section tyre it drops only half that amount.

Thus with a foot-proof air tyre the tyre is not only safer, but more with its tyre and foot-proof against being cut or run down by sharp objects. It is not in driven with its tyre, not the walls that will be cut, but the contact with the

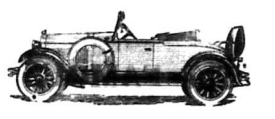

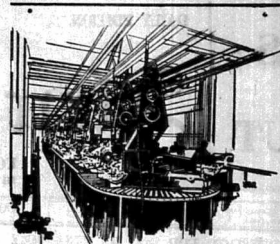

**MORE ABOUT CONDITIONS AT THE PORT.**

**Enquiry by Advisory Board's Sub-committee.**

**A GODOWN QUESTION.**

**"STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT.**

Mombasa, March 26.

The interest which appears to be taken by the Advisory Board's sub-committee in the godown question, the Standard and publicity given to it, is a welcome sign. It is to be hoped that the committee will be able to reach a decision on the subject, but by no means has reached its final stage. To begin with, as prolonged was the discussion on the subject at the last meeting of the Chamber of Commerce here, that it had to be adjourned and on Wednesday of this week, the Chamber will again meet to discuss the subject, the Port Managers have promised to be in attendance. In the meanwhile, a sub-committee of the Chamber is laboriously endeavoring to prepare another memorandum for presentation to a sub-committee of the Port Advisory Board specially appointed to go into the "whole question of the alleged chaos and present a memorandum on the subject. The Chairman of the sub-committee is the Hon. the Commissioner of Customs, who has manifested the keenest interest in the subject and has been present at most of the Chamber's meetings when the subject was discussed.

One of the points at issue, over which some of the local merchants are particularly vexed, is that regarding upon the question of commercial houses taking over land in the port area for the building of private godowns. This subject has been before the community for many months now, and the business firms are being invited to take up plots and get on with the building. But, herein, not a few of them seem a "muzz".

"Of what use," they say, "building godowns within the port area, if trucks are not available to carry the goods to and from the places?" At things are, that is

just what we complain about. There are not sufficient trucks under existing conditions to handle all the goods which are being raised there better, in that numbers of trucks would be needed constantly for the removal of the goods stored there or for their removal from place to place. If we get an absolute guarantee that there will be of some use and we shall not be penalized by rolling stock shortage."

**Greater Complaint?**

That is that. Again, it is worth further remark, on the godown question, that even though there are trucks available, the facilities at the Port will not permit of the smooth and expeditious handling. For example, if there is, suddenly, a congestion owing to the "dead end" at No. 2 Deep Water berth, an account of the impossibility of making a loop line there, will there not be confusion were confronted a number of godowns, in the immediate vicinity, are demanding for trucks with which to convey goods to ship or for trucks with which to convey cargo from ship to godown? As things are, a godown here, as these goods go to outside warehouses and a godown there, in the case of a congestion of in one long line, or long lines of trucks with the godowns, in the Port area things would be somewhat different. Each godown would be calling for its own supply for a matter of transport over a few hundred yards or feet.

It is suggested, in this connection, that special light trucks be available for this service with special light rails connecting the railway tracks, and that the goods be taken through the top viaduct of the Deep Water sheds, and loaded direct on to the ships; or taken direct from the ships, as the case might be, and so through the upper stories without adding to the congestion on the wharf level, which, it is not yet known, what Mr. Bulkeley thinks of this idea, as it has not been publicly broached in the Chamber of Commerce, but it is not unlikely that it will be brought up at the next meeting of the Chamber of Commerce. Of course, in due time, when the No. 3 berth is completed, and a loop, (or loop) built, the problem will, in some extent, be solved, insofar as the present one.

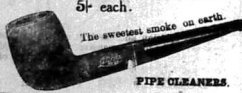

# MOTOR TOPICS

## AMATEUR FITTING-OUT.

**Gadgets and How to  
Install Them.**

### SAVES TO COMFORT.

The following ideas and alterations were carried out on a 1920 Morris Cowley car, but will undoubtedly be applicable to many other models and to other makes of cars. One of the first things which occurred to the writer in making improvement was the accelerator. A pedal was fitted in such a position that one need not rest upon the usual normal accelerator pedal, which was found to be rather tiring on a long journey.

Under this pedal was screwed a piece of flat steel 2 1/2 ins. long with one side bent at right angles to take the side thrust of the right foot when depressing the pedal and to form a normal slide for the left hand side, which should be ground conical. A piece of rubber floor matting, held to the pedal will give a nice finish.

### FINANCIAL FOR PASSENGERS.

I have greatly added to the number of seats on the car, by fitting the seats, but this has made it more difficult for elderly passengers to enter, to name them I have arranged a sliding door handle to the left-hand side of the front seat, which has been much appreciated.

Similar handle has been fitted to the back of the front seats for the use of rear passengers.

It was found that the passenger in the back seats seemed to find it difficult to get into the car, so I turned an inner door light which I had proved a great success. This lamp, incidentally, was described quite readily and used as an inspection lamp if required. I made my connections to the dashboard switcher by attaching the flex to the rear ends of the inspection lamp pipes; the wire was led out to a small round stop switch of black bakelite, to make the switchboard plate, which was mounted upon a piece of electric sheet 2 1/2 ins. by 1 1/2 ins. by about 1/4 in. thick, suitably in wireless construction.

The electric sheet was drilled and ground to accommodate the wire and make connections with the switch. The two lamps shown are of the make-plated wireless type. The main lamp, which in position were convenient to enable the plate to be fitted easily in the dash. Incidentally, it should be mentioned that the ground wires, which should not, of course, be hammered or forced suddenly, owing to the brittleness of the sheet.

A length of flex was taken to the lamp, which was fitted behind and above the book of the front seat on the driver's side. I made a detachable clip-bracket for the lamp out of a bit of mild-steel, but which it would do equal work. The clip-bracket, from a strip of metal, of whatever material, was 2 ins. long by 1 1/2 ins. wide, at the top. From a hole just below the top end, I drilled a hole at right angles, at a point just below the fork end. I thought a standard type of lamp holder, which has two rings holding the detachable wires together. These rings I screwed back and slipped the lamp-holder into the fork, afterwards screwing them up again. This held the lamp quite firmly, but allowed it to be withdrawn with the greatest ease.

On the car to which I have made these additions there is a strip of aluminium running along the top edge of the back of the front seats, having removed the screws on the right-hand side I carefully filed

the strip and slipped it under the heavy brackets which hold in the seat of rear passengers.

The bolts in the same as used for the rear and side lights; incidentally, serving as a very useful spare for either of the lamps. Although the position is somewhat exposed, I have never found it liable to damage in use. In the 1927 and later Morris cars another position will have to be found, and I should suggest the sides of the car just behind the front seat, the brackets being secured under one of the side panels.

### Side-Screen Repair.

Here is a simple method of repairing cracked side curtains. Obtain some small pieces of tin clear oiled, which can be supported cheaply by those who carry out accumulator repairs; and a small tin of zinc. Then, a new and very useful (Bullock) paint preparation. First Thinner is used for cleaning Thinner after use has been used. Clean the side curtain very carefully around the crack and cut a circle of oiled tin from one of the sheets and paint it on one side with Lin Thinner, tracing the part of the screen around the crack in a similar manner afterwards; then stick the two together, being in contact. In a very short time the patch will be found to have adhered firmly to the curtain. I usually fix the patch on the inside. Thinner will be very handy for smoothing up, and I have found a lumpy back or a small water-tight by painting it over with Lin Thinner. It takes rather a large quantity, (1/2 in. The Motorist).

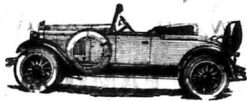

## HAS THE TRUE GOLGOTHA BEEN FOUND?

Discoveries That Upset Age-old Traditions.

### SKULL HILL.

The Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem, which has been accepted for centuries as the site of the crucifixion, will be regarded more critically. Recent discoveries in the Holy Land for new and ancient tombs, and the fact that in Jerusalem have strengthened the belief already held by many archeologists that the Skull Hill on the Jordan road near the Damascus Gate, is the true Golgotha, and that the church in the garden adjoining, known as the Garden Tomb, is the real scene of the Resurrection (writes Martin Warren in the Daily Express).

### The New Finds

Two of the discoveries which may revolutionize theories that have been held for centuries are the recent location of the Tomb of the Wall at Belegot Agrippa and the chance finding of a small carved stone.

The Tomb of the Wall was made by Herod Agrippa about ten years after the death of Christ to replace the existing altar, but that since the discovery of the wall it has grown up to the north of the city. When British engineers were making the new road, leading from the Damascus Gate, they discovered traces of this wall, and some of the Palestine Exploration Society has uncovered it. It is definitely located, and is a considerable distance from the Garden Tomb.

The first of the new finds was the finding of a small carved stone by Miss Elmer, who is in charge of the Garden Tomb. This on being cleaned and examined proved to be a small shrine stone of a Temple of Venus. It was unearthed some thirty feet from the entrance to the tomb.

This discovery is of immense value when it is remembered that Herod after his conquest of the Holy City in A.D. 70 decided to decorate one and for all the place most sacred both to Jew and Christian. To this end he built a temple to Ashtar on the site of Solomon's Temple and a temple to Venus at the scene of the Resurrection.

Almost two hundred years later Constantine, the first Christian Emperor, destroyed the heathen temple and built a magnificent basilica in honor of the Resurrection, and to make amends for Herod's sacrilege. The Church of the Holy Sepulchre stands today on the spot where Constantine built his cathedral almost in the centre of the present city.

It seems not improbable that Constantine had deliberately chosen the hill—not on the actual spot, but within the walls and under the protection of his fortifications.

### Seldom Heard of

Whether or not the Skull Hill and the tomb near by are the actual scenes of the Crucifixion and the Resurrection, the happenings of the first Good Friday are however probably never to be known for a certainty. It is, however, interesting to note that they are seldom heard of but are mentioned in the Holy Land. Not since then has there been a building erected that straggles hill where the stone block nature the rocky side bears the ancient resemblance to a grinning skull.

The great story tells how Christ bearing His cross, "went forth into the place of a skull which is called in the Hebrew language 'Golgotha'."

Did the remarkable skull-like formation of the rock, and the fact that it was also the place of stoning, give rise to the "skull name?"

Few were condemned to death by stoning were thrown from this cliff and their bodies buried from above by their stones.

### 'A New Sepulchre.'

Assuming that the Skull Hill is the place where the Crucifixion was held, then it is obvious that the tomb of Christ must also be near. As John says: "In the place where he was crucified there was a garden, and in the garden a tomb."

It is a remarkable fact that this tomb, answering the Scriptural description, has been found in a garden on the slopes of the Skull Hill. It is rock hewn and unfinished. It has been, at some time, closed with a stone. It is comparatively isolated, and some visible as a concrete burial place. It also contains the head cavity which is the distinguishing mark of Jewish tombs of the period.

In addition there are signs that a building once stood over the tomb. Traces of two arches still exist, those in the fragments of stone paving and the remains of a column. Above the door are three small recesses which are usually found in heathen temples. All these seem to indicate that Herod's Temple to Venus never stood here, and the further finding of the shrine stone strengthens the theory.

To-day this tomb—perhaps the most holy place in the world—is in the charge of a representative of the Garden Tomb Association.

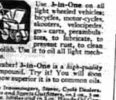

# MOTOR TOPICS

## SHEER CARELESSNESS!

### Cause of Many Driving Mistakes.

### LACK OF CAUTIOUS

These carelessness in driving is a difficult subject on which to write, for it is hard to discover when someone, negligence or gross bad driving, and carelessness begins. Nevertheless, a tip on your road today cannot be complained without at least one instance of carelessness coming to light. If it may be the fault of another driver, a pedestrian, a cyclist, or the motorist himself may be guilty of the fault he is out to discover and condemn. These are times in everyone's driving career when carelessness is allowed, momentarily, to take command, and there are times when lack of caution may have nearly resulted in a mishap.

For instance, how many of us go for groceries? find their way into print, there will always be manufacturers, who will be glad to see, had driving and maintenance, but in the latter two cases one can be considerably misled by a constant changing of the safety first slogan into the minds of all users of public highways. The human element, however, can never be relied upon.

Therefore the writer has compiled the following few maxims—found often after later experience to be good and true—which cannot be too frequently repeated or too loudly proclaimed.

Some of the worst kinds of carelessness occur in connection with parking a driver for instance, even his car just beyond a blind corner; it passes the writer's comprehension how very many cars could be so foolishly up to the wheels in a position where it might, if any moment, be hit by another car, not to mention the possibility of the coming a well timed surface collision between two

other vehicles endeavouring to squeeze through.

**Thoughtless Parking.**

Parking carelessly, even in official parking places, often causes damage and trouble to other drivers, which could easily be avoided by a little forethought; for example, many an owner runs his car needlessly close to the one just ahead of him about a foot from the curb or at least it projects into the path of passing traffic.

Another variation of this form of thoughtlessness is the way some people have of driving at the red stop station in such a position that other cars cannot be brought suddenly close to the petrol pump. The writer has often noticed the careless way in which some types of garage men and also private owners handle their cars at the extra stops, and think nothing of filling a tank right up to the top. Should the latter happen to be inside the tank and to any extent to the exhaust pipe, there is every likelihood of a serious fire! The spirit bubbles over and splashes on to the hot metal. Fortunately, manufacturers realize this and generally place the filler orifices on the opposite side to the exhaust pipe. A point in connection with petrol tanks, which many people do not seem to know is that it is extremely dangerous to throw those litpore down drain pipes, and the practice is an offence which warrants the perpetrator liable to prosecution.

**Taking Hints.**

There are all sorts of undrivable streets, committed on hills, the worst of which is mounting gear-box, and, unfortunately, hanging on top. In fact, on one might suppose, the punishment, but rather the only way some people have of getting out of their difficulties. Crawling instead of up a steep hill is almost as bad as taking it too fast, for it allows a following driver's run or tempt him to overtake, which is always risky if he lacks first-class coordination. If a driver feels that a car which is following him is likely to make a mistake, better, he should not

doze off, if not safe, allow the other man to make the climb first. Happily, the motorist is impatient of making a stiff hill by "walking" up it as almost dead on, for it is a needless feat, with petrol. Traffic coming down a hill is liable to be moving fast, while the man who has to "crash" up a hill has practically no acceleration in hand to get out of the way in a hurry. Driving too close to a vehicle in front has been the cause of many a mishap. Children particularly are apt to run off the roadway to cross the road, and they cannot be blamed if a small car is following so closely in the wake of a chauffeur that it is invisible from the pathway. To make another case, a driver "loads in" too close to a car ahead cannot blame anyone but himself if the smaller vehicle suddenly and without cause, swerves from the top of an embankment, a large hole being bored in the roof of an immediate collision may be a certainty.
