POULTRY NOTES.

Crop Binding.

I have a letter from a correspondent asking for information on the treatment of crop-bound birds. The symptoms of crop-binding are lack of appetite and full, hard crop. It is usually caused by some substance which cannot be digested, such as long grass, bits of stick or even a large bit of grit or sand.

In a mild case the trouble can be cured in the following manner: First fill the crop with warm water in order to dilute it, then work the crop about with the hand until the grain is softened. Now hold the bird head downwards and repeat the work till the liquid will flow out and the process can be repeated. When the crop is soft and pliable it can be left, firm inserting more water, till the grain containing a little Epsom Salt. If this does not effect a cure the best way is to cut the crop open; it is not at all a difficult operation. First of all pluck the feathers from the skin covering the crop; this makes an incision with a pair of sharp scissors in the top skin and another in the outer casing of the crop.

The gut should be quite small, just sufficient to insert the finger or a teaspoon and remove the offending substance. Clean out the crop and rinse with persimmon juice of potato and water, and repeat several times till the crop is quite clear. When clean leave a little persimmon juice and water in the crop and switch up. Each skin must be sewn separately and carefully, and the wounds smeared with antiseptic ointment. When finished leave the bird in a dark coop and keep it quiet for some six or eight hours. Then give it a feed of bread soaked in milk and squashed fairly dry. Only give one more tablespoonful for five feed; if this passes away unaccom-

pany, feed again in three or four days with a rather larger quantity.

Liver Trouble.

At this time of year, especially after a heavy laying season, birds are apt to be a bit run down, and often show signs of liver trouble, by the excrement turning to green and then to yellow, while the droppings are thick and sticky. For this disease one half a canna tabled every night for a week, then twice a week until cured. Some people prefer to use calomel in fractional doses every other night. The best kind should be the lactated one which will reduce the accumulation of fat which is properly causing the mischief as liver trouble, as a rule, is brought on by feeding on starchy foods, excessive use of spurs, and neglecting a full supply of green food and grit. If a poultry farmer suspects that there is a risk of liver trouble coming on, it is advisable not to feed too heavily, and to put in the soft food of each day some few seeds of Epsom salts, mixing the salt with the hot water before adding the meal.

Answer to Correspondent.
"Q.B."—Your bird suffering from "Prognosis" or "downy head," as it is commonly called, is in the condition caused by muscular weakness after prolonged laying, and a portion of the integuments of the feet are seen to hang down. A hard lump on the other foot. The foot should have the web bashed with a strong infusion of cold tea, the part washed gently and held in place. After a week the operation may be repeated again. "Low feet" is a general ailment and nothing of a stimulating nature gives.

INDIAN DEMAND FOR KENYA POTATOES.

Prospects of a Growing Market.

PACKING HINTS.

From information received from the Director (General) of the Department of Commercial Intelligence and Statistics (through H. H. Trell, Commissioner, Nairobi) it would appear that there is a very much larger demand for potatoes in India than in Kenya and that whilst the larger proportion of Kenya potatoes is used for cooking purposes, there is a large proportion of other potatoes for "maltification" purposes. Italy supplies 8,000 tons of potatoes per annum of a value of £20,000. The average net weight per sack being 60 lbs. 6½ per cwt. The potatoes from Italy are packed in 50 lbs. and 100 lbs. sacks. The average net weight per sack of African potatoes is 40 lbs. and per cwt. The average selling price of standard potatoes in Bombay is 8½ paise per cwt. From the foregoing it would appear that there is a large market awaiting the Kenya potato grower and one which will accept better quality potatoes than the Indian one seen for the past.

Countries to which has been stated by some exporters, the percentage supporting potatoes into Bombay are declined to favour the growing of East African potatoes of the coast, and they consider it to be important that they should be packed in wooden barrels, crates or boxes.

Further enquiries are being made as to what exactly are the requirements for "maltification" purposes.

A monthly average of prices indicates the price paid at the time of the year (October-March) when Kenya crops are fit to export on other average.

New Bank Notes.

OLD TREASURY ISSUES TO DISAPPEAR.

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT.] London, March 18.—Treasury notes are shortly to disappear and there is to progress the bank manufacturers of the new bank of England notes. The new notes cannot be issued for some time, and the Government officials required to replace the £50,000,000 of Treasury Notes now in circulation. The design of the new note is still a well-guarded secret. The Chancellor of the Exchequer is to decide the day of issue, and arrangements have been made between the Bank of England, the Treasury, and the "Big Five" banks for cooperation in the transfer.
