WORLD'S NEWS. BY CABLE.

Dreadful Gloomy Christmas

Terrific Storms and Floods.

Shipping Port Bound.

Fast Damage to Property.

MIDLANDS FLOODED BY RAIN.

(Reuter's Special to "E. A. Standard.")
 A Gale of exceptional rain that pervaded England has made Christmas one of the most dismal on record. Besides the many shipping casualties there was a crop of fatal accidents. A family of four perished in a fire at Islington; a fire occurred in a jute warehouse in Dundee. This jute had swollen with the water; burst the wall of the warehouse and fallen on an adjacent house killing four children. The mother of the latter was rescued from the ruins unharmed. These accidents all occurred on Christmas eve.

The British fruit steamer Turville one of the steamers of the new line which has been trading with the West Indies and New York went ashore in a heavy storm off the coast of New Jersey. The steamer succumbed for help by wireless. The crew and about sixty passengers sang while they were awaiting the lifeboats. They were all rescued with difficulty owing to the high seas that were running.

The dismal weather of Christmas Day was followed by a depressing Boxing Day accompanied by a gale of rain. There were numerous wrecks along the United Kingdom coasts. A terrific storm raged over Devon and Cornwall with lightning and torrents of rain. Two passenger steamers and many other vessels have been driven ashore. Telegraphs and telephones are broken down in many parts of the country. Much damage has been done to property.

Thursday's hurricane was most severe along the South Coast the wind travelling at times at 85 miles an hour at Plymouth. Four vessels were wrecked at that naval port. The most exciting scenes were to be witnessed in the rescuing of the crews and passengers from these ships. One of the lifeboats filled with one of the wrecked ships passengers was blown ashore but was subsequently refloated. Abnormal tides flooded Portsmouth and Southampton. Several towns on the Isle of Wight are abandoned and considerable damage has been done. A steamer travelling from Ripon to Philadelphia has had to put back into Queenstown after being battered about by the storm. One tug was that struck the ship badly injuring seven of the crew and drowned one. The P. and O. boat Narring going from Ushant to Sydney has wireless from Ushant that she is returning to London with much water in her hold and seriously damaged. Steamers are hastening to her assistance. The Midlands of England are again inundated.

London, Dec. 28
 LATER.—A wireless message from the Argenta states that she is within sight of the Narring. The lights of the Narring are also close at hand. The foredeck of the Narring was swept with the hurricane sea. Her position at 6 o'clock on Friday was very bad. The Narring carried 245 passengers for Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide and also for Cape Town.

A later message states that the Lizard Station received a wireless message from the Narring at 9.30 on Friday. The effect that she did not require any assistance. P. & O. and Co. also announce that they have received a wireless message from the Narring stating that she is coming back at the rate of 10 knots. Powerful tugs have been sent from Falmouth to her assistance. The weather is moderating and further favourable news is hourly expected. The Narring is now reported to be off the Isle of Wight and out of danger.

News of further shipping casualties continue to come to hand. Numbers of wrecks reported, and many vessels have been

Went Murder.
 Savage Mutilation of Two Women.
 ABE VICTIM SURVIVER HORRIBLE BUTCHERY.

Information that most dreadfully cruel and heinous crime had been done on the 2nd night of January reached the Morning Post office late on Christmas afternoon. Miss Jane Linn had been living peacefully with her husband, from whom she had been separated for some time, in a house in the district of St. James. It is said that she stood in receiving an order from an official, compelling the unwilling wife—she had only two months married—she was to return to her home as of January 1st. On Wednesday, Christmas Eve, she received an invitation from her sister to spend the day at the latter's home in London. It is thought by the police that the man followed his wife to London and he is supposed to have the author of the heinous crime which followed. An auto bearing quarrelling brother and sister, who then informed the husband of the latter's absence. He immediately hastened away from his work at the railway siding and on reaching the home the inquiry brought forth a blood which was dripping from the woman, while her sister who was sitting on the floor, had her face scratched and her hair pulled out. The woman who had run away from her home, was found in a state of unconsciousness, and was taken to hospital. The police are endeavouring to trace the murderer, and it is believed that the murderer is a man of about 30 years of age, with some sharp features, and a dark beard, and is thought to be a native of the district.

Cattle Thefts.

Twenty eight hours after the occurrence certain cowboys in Nakuru township reported that eleven calves had been stolen out of their home which was within a short distance of the police line, on Friday night, December 27. With delayed notice, a lost and a small staff of rangers while looking around should talk of the theft. Up to the time of writing no information has been received as to any trace of the cattle being found.

Goan Xmas Sports.

FAVORED BY JUST THE PROPER weather, an occasion of the kind, the Christmas sports at the Goan Club on Saturday, proved to be a most successful one. The sports, which were really of a children's class, were well patronized, and the somewhat versatile programme secured many entrants. The grounds—those of Mr. Crampton situated between River road and Victoria street—were decorated for the occasion with flags of all nations, and a display of fireworks and a lighting was in evidence in the vicinity of the ladies' stand and the stalls. One of the side shows attracted attention and the "Lucky Wall" was the scene of much hilarity—many natives willingly tendering the entrance fee and "chipping" for the good things on display. Many women Goans and Indians with their wives families patronized the Sports and a prominent figure was that of Mr. R. A. Marquis whose firm was the donor of the cup which bears his name. During the course of the sports an orchestra, composed of some gentlemen who had kindly volunteered their services, accompanied the sports. Many of the events were profitable of considerable amusement, the children's race being the cause of special interest owing to the little one's disregard for the rules of racing and the eagerness with which they started off—before the starter had given the signal. A high jumper was also seen by the sports of the grown-up competitors in the back race. In the gentleman's broad jump many of the competitors acquitted themselves in quite prominent fashion—an average jump of about 16 feet being recorded. The course of the day was the presentation of the Marquis and Rose, cup to the triumphant Railway Goan Sports Club for an unbeaten football record. The ceremony of presentation was carried out in an acceptable fashion by the Provincial Commissioner Mr. S. L. Hinde. In a few felicitous remarks Mr. Hinde dealt with the splendid record of the club and expressed the hope that their brilliant career would not terminate with the presentation of the cup. The cup was then handed over to the captain of the club, Mr. D'Mello. The Secretary of the Goan's Union offered a few words in reply thanking Mr. Hinde for his kindness in officiating and three cheers were given the Provincial Commissioner. Tea was served to the children during the course of the sports and day's entertainment concluded with the distribution of prizes.

Outward Bound Boats Returning.

The copyright of the Encyclopaedia Britannica (which since its first appearance in 1770, has passed into the keeping of no less than six publishing houses) has been taken over by the University of Cambridge, and the present entirely new (11th) edition is issued by the Press of the University.

Now they demand a minimum of over fifty per cent above the figure which they formerly declared satisfactory, and under which figure they would have been willing to accept a salary which would have been no more a separate charge, it is not difficult to see why they should have pointed out that the medical examination undergone by members of friendly societies was of the most commonplace.



WORLD'S NEWS. BY CABLE.

Turks Yielding.

Conference Progressing

Adjourned for Instructions.

SERBIA TO BE INVITED TO WITHDRAW FROM ALBANIA.

(Buster's Special to "E. A. Standard.")

The Powers have decided to do nothing concerning Turkey's proposals that they should take some action to promote peace between Turkey and the Allies. In the meantime however the Powers' Ambassadors in Constantinople are urging moderation upon the Porte and emphasizing the necessity for Turkey recognizing the present situation.

Reuter learns that Premier Danov and Rasid Pasha, the heads of the Bulgarian and Turkish delegations respectively, met privately and discussed the whole situation. They are earnestly attempting to arrive at an understanding. It appears that the Turkish attitude has influenced the Allies which now demands the retention of Adrianople. The Bulgarian position in London states that there have been many assertions from the Turkish Government that Adrianople recently. It is understood that immediately peace is concluded Austria and Italy in the name of Europe will invite Serbia to withdraw her troops from Albania.

THE PRESIDENT'S CONFERENCE MEETING.

The Peace Conference sat for four hours last night. It has been adjourned for two days so that it meets again on Friday.

It is believed that the outlook is brighter and much progress has been made.

The official statement of the doings of the Conference has been issued and states as follows: The Conference discussed the Turkish counter-proposal. An agreement has been reached between the conference on certain points. The discussion of the Turkish counter proposal as submitted was that Turkey should cede all occupied territories westward of the village of Adrianople which was to remain in Turkish hands subject to the rectification of the Turco-Bulgarian frontier. This rectification should be negotiated by Turkey and Bulgaria alone. Albania must be autonomous. The Powers settling her boundaries and political organization. Crete is an depot with the Powers therefore the latter must be consulted before any decision can be taken on that point. As regards the Aegean Islands as they belong to Asia Minor it is impossible to settle those but Turkey was prepared to discuss the question concerning them with the Powers. (This discussion apparently means with regard to reforms.)

During the debate on these proposals the Allies are stated to have replied that the position of the territory must comprise all territories not only those occupied. The Turks have yielded this point. The Allies refuse to admit of separate negotiations of the question of Adrianople as stated to be affecting Turkey and Bulgaria only. The negotiations for peace must be with the Allies as a whole. The Turks yielded this point also to the Allies. The Allies then stated at the point of the "rectification of the frontier" as that proposal was too vague. They therefore asked the Turks to submit definite boundary limitations with a map to be submitted on Friday. On the question of the statement that Crete was a matter between Turkey and the Powers the Allies stated that they might possibly approach the Powers on the latter question but Turkey must relinquish all her rights on that island forthwith. The Allies insisted on the cessation of the Aegean Islands.

Regarding those points which the Turks have not conceded the delegates said that they must ask fresh instructions from Constantinople.

Continuous Wheat Growing.

When wheat was making 60 to 80 shillings a quarter in England it had from the fibres to the chaff, the idea of continuous cropping with wheat was very attractive. The practice is indeed the rule rather than the exception to-day on virgin lands paying little or no rent in newly opened up countries like our own. This is in the United States of America the case of settlement passed out to wheat, land in the east when exhausted by a system of continuous over-growing being continually abandoned for the still virgin soil of the West. This between 1850 and 1890 the case of wheat production in the United States migrated from 81° 49' west longitude to 94° 50' 29". Even now in the Western portions of the wheat area little or no rotation of crops is practiced, the older wheat lands of the Eastern portion will not now give a paying crop without rotation.

In England John Tull was the first to suggest a system of continuous cropping growing wheat in the same field but did not exactly grow it on the same soil. He sowed his wheat on the same soil 7 inches apart but later sowed on the same soil 12 to 14 inches apart. These rows were situated in the centre of a ridge about 4 feet broad, these ridges being separated from one another by furrows. When one crop was harvested the plough was passed up the ridges, the furrow always being turned into the furrows on each side. In this way the position of the ridge of one year was the furrow of the next year and vice versa; in other words the land bearing the rows of wheat one year by fallow the next.

This system is therefore really one of a rotation of wheat and fallow; it is however a later known as the Lota Weston system. Tull never manured his land but relied on tillage alone and taught that pulverisation of the soil was all that was needed for securing good crops as he said: "The manure of clays is not of lighter soil."

The manures he applied are: for wheat, 1 lb. of mineral superphosphate and 1 lb. of nitrate of soda; for clover, 1 lb. of mineral superphosphate and 1 lb. of nitrate of soda. Mr. Post's farm is on strong land and this is the only type of soil that is suitable for continuous wheat growing.

A light is applied, and the whole turns slowly against the wind. Whether the sowing afterwards breaks away or not makes no difference to the growth of the seedlings. As one method of breaking and has been mentioned above, it may be interesting to note the method employed with the best results in breaking the virgin prairie in the West. One method is to break the land to a depth of 8 or 10 inches during the rainy season (May-June) while the grass is succulent. When turned under in this state, the soil decays while it breaks away the soil would remain in an unchanged condition for months. To keep the inverted soil moist, a heavy roller is passed over the portion broken each half day; this prevents the existence of an air space between the soil and the ground which would hasten drying. The last is sown the following Autumn or Spring.

Parklands.

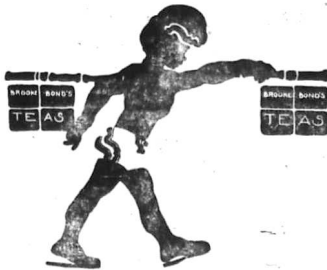
