CRIMINALS IN THE CRADLE.
Getting at the Root of a Problem.
"BRAIN LIGHT"
Convinced that the only effective method of abolishing crime is the New York Neurological Institute, which has spent over £400,000, for the purpose of eliminating criminal tendencies at the root.
Many wealthy Americans interested with deep interest in the members of the medical board of the New York Neurological Institute, which urged the establishment of a fund for the study and treatment of the "brain light" which causes so many life failures and potential criminals.
Dr. Frederick T. Coney, co-ordinator of America's best-known mental specialists, declared that brain-light before birth causes many persons a chance even to start with adequate equipment for a happy adjustment to life. He said that before birth he knows of cases slowly take their places to form the human brain, and the slightest change in the admixture and combination of the chemical materials may mean a retardation in brain growth and produce many anti-social criminal tendencies.
The research programme of the proposed survey will permit a profound study to be made of factors such as the development of poisons before birth and pre-natal conditions which may make failures or criminals.

"THE COMPANY OF ADVENTURERS."

A Humble History of the Era of Freedom in African Colonisation.

THE COFFEE BERRY BORER BEETLE.

Its Life History and Habits.

HINTS ON CONTROL.

(By H. Wilkinson, A.B.C. Soc., F.E.S., A.R.C. Entomologist.)

Origin of the Coffee Berry Borer.—This pest has been discovered from specimens received from Uganda. It was first recorded as a pest in this country in 1909 and is thought to be indigenous there. During the year 1908 pests were taken by the Kenyan Government to formulate regulations to control the pest. The coffee berry borer beetle differs from other borers in that its eggs are deposited in the coffee berries and the success of such regulations can now be judged by the length of time it has taken Biphendolates to make its appearance in this Colony, for after a period of exactly twenty years it is recorded for the first time as being present in Kenya. During that time it has been reported from the Belgian Congo, Tanganyika, French Indochina, Ivory Coast, Assam, Siam, Indo-China, Java, Sumatra and Brazil. In the latter countries, Biphendolates has assumed the proportions of a major pest of coffee.

We see in the fortunate position of knowing its life history in other countries and the various methods employed therein combating it. With this information at our disposal, unnecessary alarm need not be felt as its appearance, because measures are known which, if properly applied, are capable of lowering an infestation down to the point at which Biphendolates has made its appearance only recently, little original work can yet have been done in Kenya, and the following is merely a compilation and summary of all information available to the writer.

Life History.—The life history of the coffee berry borer, which is slightly different from that of the other species of the genus, is as follows: The female, in the same country and in the same climate, lays from 20 to 30 eggs. In Kenya, according to S. Loewman, the average number of eggs laid by the female is only 2.5 per cent. were laid. In this country, the female has laid 2.5 to 5.0 eggs.

SOME PRINCIPLES OF COLONIZATION.

No. 3.

A RIGHT TO PEACEFUL POSSESSION.

Following is the third of the series of articles on principles of colonization which were recently published in "The Examiner". The rights and duties of a colonizing power follow in natural sequence from the reasons that justify its occupation of colonial territory.

(1) The Rights. The colonizing nation enjoys sovereign authority over the territory she has lawfully acquired. There is the obligation of organizing the life and destiny of its people. With this end in view she may decree and cause to be obeyed laws of all legislative, administrative and executive measures she thinks fit in the execution of her noble mission.

The colonizing authority will reform the land and material conditions of the natives; she will also reform their laws, customs and conditions that obstruct the moral and material progress of the backward races. She will order and control the land so that it may be developed by consistent works of industry which are to be carried out by the natives. It is necessary that all the indigenous colonial subjects defend the common patrimony of civilization and culture, material and moral, which they share with those who have become their colonists. History shows how well it has been understood that those who have been colonized have always and everywhere displayed sublime self-objection and perfect loyalty.

(2) The Duties. We have said that the colonial power will exercise all sovereign rights over the possession she has lawfully acquired. This authority should be exercised for the subjects' advantage, in the colonies as in every other human political government, except for the benefit of the people.

A First Consideration

It should therefore be the first duty of the colonizing power to establish colonial government to watch over the welfare of the native races. The legislation should never sacrifice the welfare of the natives to those of the colonists. The government should never permit the production of the original population, by directly or indirectly, to be reduced to the point of leaving forever no trace of its existence.

**CAT BURGLARS BUSY
IN KAMPALA.**
£300 Goods Taken from
Customs Bond.
SERIOUS POSITION.

"STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT.
Kampala, June 9.
We commented last week on the case of a thief, that is taking place in Kampala and his very serious position that he had been arrested by the apparently unheeded view of crime that is sweeping over us.
Last week a gang of burglars entered the Customs Bond, by climbing up the stackpole, pushing in the expanded metal jugs on the top of the wall and entering the building. They handled precisely every bale and case in the godown, including open bales and rubberies, breaking boxes and cases. A case of whisky was opened and a bottle had its neck broken off and then left.

STATE OF AGRICULTURE IN KENYA DURING 1927.

Need for Overhauling Methods of Farming.

OFFICIAL REVIEW.

Hopes of Greater Development as Result of Coming Legislation.

The necessity for overhauling methods and systems of agriculture in Kenya is emphasised in the annual report of the Department of Agriculture.

The view is expressed that there is too great a dependency for farmers to rely on a single crop instead of taking advantage of the opportunities offered in a good mixed farming country.

It is hoped that the efforts being made now and those planned for the future to control more effectively stock diseases will result in more mixed farming.

FUTURE OF MIXED FARMING.

The Annual Report of the Department of Agriculture for the year ended December 31, 1927, has been received by the "E. A. Standard."

Under the heading of "Report by Director-Staff" the Report states—

During the year developments in two directions have resulted: a provision for and attempt made to strengthen the Plant Breeding Service and the Entomological Section of the Department. It is becoming increasingly important that more of good culture be appointed who have the will to do such varying conditions, and to realise that their work is not that of the ordinary set task, but that it calls for the exercise of more than ordinary consideration and apprehension.

FINANCE.

The following statement shows the position in respect of Expenditure and Revenue during the last three years, and for explanatory purposes it is divided under two heads—

(1) Agriculture (including Horticulture Administration), Native Agriculture, Stock Rearing Services, Grazing and Condensing Services, Grants to outside bodies.

(2) Veterinary (Executive and Executive Division), Horticulture (including Horticulture Administration), Stock Rearing Services, Grazing and Condensing Services, Grants to outside bodies.

ed in the workings of the Veterinary Field Staff is due to the prevalence of drought in native areas, reducing the number of animals it is possible to do on account of the condition of the stock.

General.

During the year 1927 the rainfall was slightly under average and it was patchy, crops and pastures were not so important. Of the main crops the yield of maize, which is the staple crop of being over the average quite excellent. The total short fall and expectations were not quite realised. The total quantity produced was in excess of 1,000,000 bushels. The yield of maize which was over 100 bushels per acre. The yield of wheat was 100 bushels per acre in most districts. Methodical ploughing appears to be a method of cultivation of some importance, whilst other operations in connection with soil cultivation and planting have long been recognised as tractor operations on account of the speed attained. Normally where such work as harrowing, sowing, planting and other subsidiary work can be done on large yields are derived. It is becoming more and more evident to progressive farmers and farmers' associations that the system of agriculture of the Colony requires, may demand, serious consideration, and that methods and systems require overhauling. There is too great a tendency for the farmer to plant in a great measure a concentration on that line, the staple planters. In a mixed farming country it is the experience of the "E. A. Standard" that they are purely wheat farmers or maize farmers without very much thought as to what additional purposes they will do to secure the planter of a perennial crop such as coffee, but even that not entirely. Thinking farmers are experimenting with a rotation and

now that the possibility of more fully controlling disease in cattle through fencing, dipping and insecticide is coming, we may see a change in farming systems, which will save much of our land some improvement. However, in the "Dry Areas," in only after a long time and which may give some of our best agricultural areas farmers, particularly and what farmers are agreed to introduce green manures. 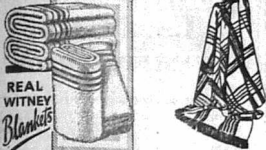

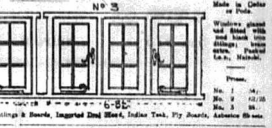

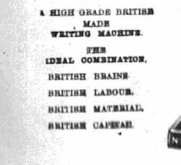

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL DEBATE ON NATIVE LANDS TRUST BILL.

Just and Honourable Effort to Solve a Difficult Problem.

ELOQUENT SPEECHES.

Only One Dissenter from the General Principles Underlying the Measure.

The whole of the morning in Legislative Council yesterday was devoted to a debate on the second reading of the Native Lands Trust Bill.

The measure was met with approval and convincing advocacy of the principle of the bill and the necessity of some such measure was emphasised by all the Government Members of Council.

The only dissenter was the Indian Member who described the measure as iniquitous and premature. Nairobi, are the supervisors.
A representative of the Kenya
African Students' Union, who
has been in the Reserve, was
sent to see the work actually in
progress. The first houses built
for the African School teachers
were of brick construction, but it
was felt that although the natives
could build these they were not
taught economical methods of
building which would be of use in
their own Reserves, and so the
present system of wood and con-
crete houses was devised.

Last year in ten weeks work
of this kind was completed con-
taining two rooms, 10 ft by
10 ft. These are easily constructed,
and it is thought that the use

WHEAT PROSPECTS



MOTURING TOPICS

ROAD SKIDS.

“Kill them at Birth”
—Wise Slogan.

CAUSES & CURES.

Prevention is better than cure, in expert motoring, as well as in human life, and it would not doubt be possible to go through one’s automobile career without ever needing to know how to check and control a skid. This, however, will necessitate such unusual good luck, as well as good judgment and careful driving, that the state of complete skid-fulness is rather an ideal for which to strive than one which will have any real hope of attaining.

Lock enters into the skid—no matter how slowly and carefully we may ourselves, at almost any moment, on any road, in any weather, any person may thrust us into a situation where it is necessary to apply the brakes or steer in such a way that a skid is caused. It is obviously desirable, and even essential, therefore, that the gentle art of skidding, in cases not met with, should be assimilated by the novice in the safest possible degree of novitiate.

Master by Practice.

And just as with learning to reverse neatly and efficiently, an skidding can be mastered only by practice. It would not yet even occur to the novice to try to reverse. It is not until first skid he acquires confidence, and then until and succeeds with repeated trials that he can handle a skid and have a notion which could cause the loation rather than have it forced upon him. Usually safety in the event of a skid covering depends upon a certain amount of free space and a deserted road, so far as your portion of it is concerned.

Select a suitable piece of road, therefore, and deliberately handle

the car in such a way that the rear wheels lose their adhesion of the road. This can be done at almost universal low-level locking you may have an opportunity in coming the car to a skid, but in cases you will acquire a better success you will acquire a better command of mental knowledge of the causes, as well as the correction, of a skid slip.

It is a popular fallacy, by the way, that four-wheel brakes have completely eliminated the danger but this is a dangerous overstatement of the truth. Older factories must be considered.

First of all, the rear set of adjustment and pull more to ease than that of the front, and if you cause a skid even more readily than the old rule which they obey. Second, while perfectly adjusted brakes will prevent the car’s falling from dragging and side slipping, if they are applied on the very top surface so that the wheels become skid, they will continue to operate as brakes, but they had had no effect upon any braked portion of the vehicle in front. And third, skids can occur through faulty driving, on a corner, for instance, and if the brakes are not on use it is obvious that they can have no effect one way or the other.

An Inherent Possession.

The necessary action to check a skid when it has started is to take the foot off the clutch completely. One must be ready to do this, and if it is obvious that they can have no effect one way or the other.

In the case of a skid, a few moments will be enough to bring the point more clear than this more you can see, and it is to consider what would happen if one started with the car on the side of the skid. Your tail has swung to the right and you are inclined to the left, the skid, so that you will hold the car in its dead centre, the car will not be tilted. THE COST OF LIVING COMMISSION.

Mr. A. B. Suda, Nairobi, recently gave evidence before the Cost of Living Commission, mainly on the shortage of cattle. He pointed out that the bulk of the cattle farmers in this country were going into dairying and were not reaching into the market. They supplied the restaurants, and he being able to feed their local calves, they knuckled them on the local at birth. Therefore, there would be a shortage of stock.

Since October last the price of butter had gone up, in one occasion it was over Rs. 20 per cwt. and was Rs. 17.00 to 21.

There was quite a good supply of fruiting into Nairobi. The prices were fairly good. The number of productions was increasing every year.

The Chairman stated that most of the evidence they had got of that people were going out of the local business, the terms of fruiting was increasing. He was glad to hear Mr. Suda's view, mainly, if they were referring to citrus.

When it was suggested that something could be extended to something else as meat, a member of the Commission remarked: "It would be rather difficult to sustain a market shop."

...in the future for appropriating to the interests of the natives a whole portion of the lands which have been now set aside for the benefit and use of the native. For every acre, Sir, I should like to conclude by emphasizing, though still I sincerely hope in my lifetime it will not be necessary, that we should not be driven to expropriating those reserves. I judge myself should I be sanctioned with this country for any way directly or indirectly after the passing of this Bill to endeavor to assist in the administration of that land in an spirit of kindness—entirely in the interests and benefits of the natives and I judge myself that to action of mine arising out of this Bill will be judged entirely from that point of view. That is a pledge, Sir, that may sound egotistical, but I think it is necessary for a man in my position to give it, and I give it gladly and freely (floor, laus).

Bound and Pair

Lord Francis Scott (Kisumu) supported the measure which he believed to be both sound and fair. It had been dealt with exhaustively by other speakers that he did not consider it necessary to go into great detail, but there was one point which he wished to emphasize. People were frightened that the Bill did not give sufficient scope for the native's land, danger presumably being apprehended from the settler community. He admitted that when one travelled through the rich and fertile Kiambu Reserve there was a great temptation to break the small allotments and that the outstanding belief that the Highlands could best be developed by a combination of leasehold, if the assistance of the settler community. A Settler's Bill

The Hon. Capt. E. M. V. Kenney (Wangari) said that although this was a Government measure it was really a settler's Bill, and had been suggested by

settlers, and had approval and formulated by Government. There were one or two fundamental principles which should be observed. It had been said that the present time did not represent the summit of wisdom or honesty but it was suggested to pass legislation now because the future would be less wise or honest. The Bill contained certain absolute principles but it would provide for more compromise than was included. There were certain details which affected the principle. Those might be corrected, but when dealing with legislation and other matters were increasing and the Bill did not provide for any permanent transfer of land. This was a full-recognize both fact and possibility. There was no provision in the Bill against the maintenance of good behaviour of the tribes. If a native tribe was well behaved they should be certain of their tenure of land, but if a tribe was rebellious Government should have power to withdraw their land. This was possible within this country. It was necessary to compromise.

It did not seem to be generally recognized that the majority laws of the country would apply to the reserves. According to clause 10 of the Bill it was necessary for a Bill to be given through the "Official Gazette" of any land which was proposed to exclude from a Native Reserve. It was not always possible to do this of legal proceedings by that method might be necessary in the case of the delimitation of part of or other reserves in the case of a Native Reserve for purposes of defence.

No operative compensation for land, other than that was provided for in the measure, but he believed that there were other methods which were more reasonable and more just. The Bill should not attempt to introduce "alien" policies which conflicted with common sense. It would be very much better to give the tribes a certain amount of tenure and be thought that this would be done by certain allotments being made in the Bill. It was wrong to feel that a native's land should not interfere with and alter the decision of the Central Board.

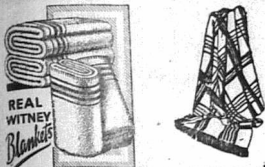

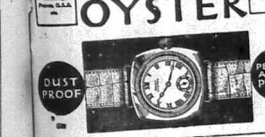
