FAVOURABLY RECEIVED BY THE PRESS.

THE EDUCATION BILL.

July 27. The Report stage of the Education Bill was completed yesterday by the application of the clause.

July 28. Mr. Robertson in his speech also referred to the forthcoming Hague Conference and said that Government bearing in mind the resolution already passed in the House of Commons favouring the reduction of armaments proposed to lay down only two unarmoured Cruisers instead of four with a provision for a third should the Hague Conference prove abortive.

July 28. Mr. Robertson in the House of Commons stated that it was the unanimous opinion of the Board of Admiralty that the ship building programme should be reduced as follows:—

3 ships instead of 4 of the "Dreadnought" type.
 3 ships instead of 5 of Ocean going Destroyers.
 2 ships instead of 23 submarines.
 Thus saving a sum of two millions and half.

July 31. The House of Commons have adopted the Naval notes.

July 31. Mr. Churchill in the House of Commons stated that the Construction of the Water Pier in Kilindini East Africa has been sanctioned and that the work will be proceeded with as quickly as possible.

July 31. Lord Elgin stated that he was considering the establishment of a Legislative Council in British Central Africa of similar type to that proposed in East Africa.

Aug. 1. The House of Commons read for the second time the Colonial Marriage Bill and on the third reading of the Education Bill 300 votes to 177, the Nationalists voted in the minority.

Aug. 1. An interesting debate took place in the House of Lords on the question of the reduction of the Naval Programme. Earl Cavendish considered the action of the Government and stated that they were setting an excellent example. Lord Camperdown ridiculed the idea that these reductions would influence Foreign nations. Lord Farnborough admitted that the Government had just before the Sea Lords the desirability of reducing the estimates.

Aug. 1. The new Transvaal constitution gives a working British Majority and also provides for an Upper House by nomination.

Aug. 1. Mr. Churchill explaining the Transvaal Constitution said that to his guiding principle was the confederation of a responsible Government to British and Boers with the fullest privileges of British citizenship, that Government had adopted the principle of Manhood suffrage with single members of Constituents, that there would be 24 members for the Rand, 6 for Pretoria, And 29 for the rest of the Transvaal.

Aug. 1. The First reading of the Transvaal Constitutional Bill was adopted by 316 Votes to 83.

Aug. 1. Both Mr. Lyttelton and Mr. Balfour consider that no security was afforded for British supremacy and that the only hopeful feature was the postponement of the granting of a Responsible Government to the Orange River State.

Aug. 2. The Liberal Papers consider the Transvaal Constitution a fair compromise, the Unionist Press with the exception of the "Daily Mail," content themselves with moderate criticism but believe that a British majority is assured if the British will agree on a common policy. The "Cape Times" states that the Constitution has been read with relief in South Africa and that the distribution of seats are fairer than what had been anticipated.

Russia.

THE FORERUNNING OF CIVIL WAR.

RED REVOLUTION AT HAND.

July 27. Wednesday was generally quiet throughout Russia. The Labour Organizations are restraining workmen and discouraging premature strikes.

July 27. General Stolypin stated to Reuters Agents that the Tsar was fully resolved to a policy of strong handed reform and that reaction was far from his wishes, but that he was determined that the Revolutionists must be thwarted.

A strict censorship of all the Foreign Newspapers has been reintroduced in St. Petersburg.

July 30. The Warsaw Revolutionaries attacked a train killed two Generals a cashier, and 5 Soldiers and stole 16,000 roubles.

July 30. Fresh and prolonged conferences have taken place amongst the Members of the Duma in Finland and considerable divergencies of opinion have developed. The Constitutional Democrats refusing to go so revolutionary lengths demanded by the extreme parties.

Aug. 1. All revolutionary organizations of Russia including representatives of the Duma have issued a Manifesto to the peasants urging them to seize the land of which they have been deprived by the diabolical designs of the Grand Dukes and other Connectors of the Tsar, to remove all local authorities and elect their own officials instead of Government's stating that the time has now come for the country to rise.

Aug. 1. The garrison of Dushajev in the Caucasus has mutinied killing its Commander and 8 Officers and has taken over the local administration.

Aug. 2. The latest information with regard to the mutiny in Finland and that commencing continues at Sveaborg and that a large number have been killed and wounded. There is intense excitement in St. Petersburg owing to the unrest in Kronstadt caused by the news of the mutiny and it is reported that several ships that have mutinied are proceeding to Kronstadt.

July 30. Representatives of Municipalities of French and English Watering places are fraternising in Boulogne.

July 30. It is reported that Major Dreyfus contemplates retiring from the French Army.

COLONEL MACKENZIE REPUDIATES CHARGE OF ATROCITIES.

July 31. Colonel Mackenzie has arrived in Durban and declares that the rebellion in the Militia will be recalled in a week and the irregulars in a fortnight. A Composite Regiment will be formed to remain in the field for the next six months.

July 31. Colonel Mackenzie vehemently denies that atrocities have been committed.

Miscellaneous.

THE FIRST EAST AFRICAN DINNER.

July 27. At the inaugural banquet of the East African Association Lord Hindlip who presided stated that Lord Elgin's attitude towards the Association was most friendly. Mr. Wason, M. P. urged the Government to assist emigration to East Africa.

THE BRITISH EAST AFRICAN LINE COMMENCE OPERATIONS.

The new "Langford" sailed yesterday for the East Africa Line.

THE SCOTS GUARDS.

July 30. His Majesty inspected the third Battalion Scots' Guards at Buckingham Palace on Saturday prior to their disembarkment. In his speech he expressed his admiration for the Battalion.

July 30. The men of the Third Battalion Scots' Guards will be divided amongst the First and Second Battalions. Recruiting for the Regiment will not be stopped but the standard height for both the Scots and Irish guards will be raised to 5ft. 9 inches.

THE VIZIER DISMISSED.

July 31. Reuters Agent at Tehran States that the Grand Vizier has been dismissed.

EDITORIAL.

CRICKET.

The Masters and Servants Ordinance is working satisfactorily in some instances but it is not entirely effective in its operation at the Coast. The Master is legally not out at all right but the servant, whose servant means a labourer engaged for out station work is as free as a feather to set the law. For example, a Settler writes on a number of boys in Mombasa for plantation work along the Coast some distance away. Out of every twenty boys written on, one or two disappear. The unfortunate Master proffers his list bearing the names of the boys written on at Mombasa and calling on his party of workers ready to go, hoping there to be up to the name of the desired for the information of the police. His hopes are however quickly disappointed as hardly one boy can remember which name he gave as has a claim in Mombasa and thus a flaw disclosed which no clause in the Ordinance can remove. I would suggest that Masters besides writing down the name given by the prospective labourer, which is invariably made up on the spur of the moment, also write down a brief description of the boy's appearance. Of the class of Native, who will take on labourer work away from a town, is about ten per cent. have a distinguishing mark or marks on their person, some of which are Blue, or white, or black, or on the face or stripes on the body. So invariable is this rule that it would be quite possible for a policeman to be caught merely by the description of his peculiar markings. In countries where the pass system is in vogue it is quite easy to register a native from a written description. A "Master" recently suggested to me as a proposal that all Natives, who take on labourers work for a month or more should be tattooed, but I am afraid if such a suggestion was adopted it might lay ourselves open to the accusation of committing atrocities. But, joking apart, I would ask of our East African employers, who are thought to some better extent of registering labourers than merely by the name.
