members which had been constituted by that title in the Kenya country.

In October 1918 the committee was sent against Nandi tribes. The operations lasted until June 1920 and were very heavy losses both to men and stock to the tribes. In the same 1920 operations were undertaken against the Embu tribes for acts of hostility and to induce them.

A medal and clasp were given for all the above operations.

1906.

In January 1906 a force was sent against the Nandi tribes who defied the Government and tried to murder the District Commissioner. Heavy losses both in men and stock were sustained by the company.

1900-1910.

Operations in "Northland" against the "Mad Middle" and "Red" tribes with clasp was granted for these operations.

NOTABLE SUCCESSSES BY AMATEURS.

"Mercury Mary" and "The Country Girl."

GOOD BREVIEWS.

The opening performance of "Mercury Mary," the most modern musical comedy produced in East Africa, took place at the Theatre Royal on Friday evening last. The effort was an ambitious one, requiring a large cast and elaborate scenic arrangements. It was well congratulated on having secured the services of so many talented artists.

The debut of any amateur show is usually a trying experience for producers and actors alike, and it is not to be expected that those to whom the stage is a hobby rather than their usual work will always carry through without blip or hitch. Friday night's performance which being excellent in the first act, however, failed to give the same satisfaction towards the end of the work when the company are made to dance in their parts and have had more experience before their audience.

The first act went with a rare grace and verve and put the audience in thoroughly good humor.

The second act for the most part was disappointing. Often the players were uncertain and there were several occasions when the stage was entirely deserted. At one point when a comedy sketch was presented there seemed to be no adequate means of fixing the scene and it would have been better to omit it. There are, however, a few points in the play which which in the second half, but occasionally tends to become tedious largely because of an unskillful straining after humorous situations. The reason for two parts which is never quite adequate and which the play would have been improved by cutting down their appearance to the least minimum consistent with the continuity of the story.

The leading female roles were admirably sustained by Dorothy Summers, as Mary and Mabell Blackwell as Anne. The experience of the former was evident in all her work, while in the very attractive "Dinah" scene of "The Country Girl" she was particularly strong in the very amusing "Dinah" scene. Cyril James as Jerry Warner played with ease and confidence. His singing with Mabell Blackwell in two duets was delightful and he gave again had the opportunity of displaying his very great talent as an amateur dancer and. The audience clamored for more after he also showed in some excellent dancing.

The specialty dancing of a pair of members of the ladies chorus was another in some of their numbers, particularly the "Dinah" dance at the opening of the second act. They were not quite so fortunate in one or two other numbers including that which went to a "Dinah" ending of "Thinking of You" and "Give a Little More" could be thought to be an advantage.

In addition to those who appeared on the stage, there were many workers of much hard work throughout the show. J. J. Perry and H. Gibbs are to be highly commended on all their work. The main clerks responsible for the production are J. G. Taylor and the traces of his experience were to be seen through out the show. The orchestra was under the able direction of Miss Irene Marshall.

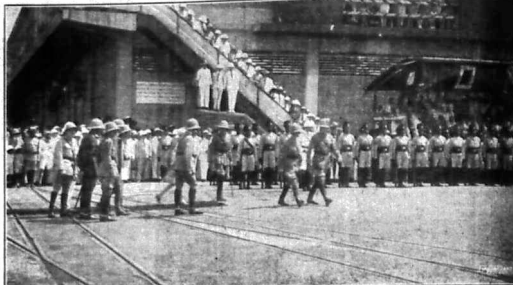

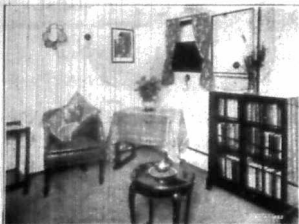

About Stockings.

FROM SILK TO ARTIFICIAL SILK.

The fact stockings were undoubtedly made of silk and it is probable that the use of woolen yarn became popular when the stocking loom was invented in 1500, says the Manufacturer.

Cotton stockings were introduced later in the century for wool silk; but silk stockings were not introduced until the 18th century, and cotton stockings with elastic tops were generally worn in summer. Stockings are now made of silk, wool, cotton, artificial silk, and mixtures of the last with cotton and wool. It is interesting to notice, however, that the one popular lace trimmings are again being shown in silk, and it is very probable that they will be followed by the cheaper ray thread.

Lace stockings are now being made in various qualities and sometimes elaborate and there is little doubt that they are gradually displacing the cheaper qualities of artificial silk. The objection to cheap artificial silk stockings are that they do not cling to the leg, are warm, and are not so strong as silk.

Printed Stockings. Made with a lining of cotton or wool and an outer cover of artificial silk, are certainly warmer and more durable.

than those composed entirely of the new fibre. These have the appearance of silk and cling to the leg without the unsightly sagging of the silk stockings. They are cheap artificial silk stockings. The majority of the stockings made in Britain are seamless, and by reducing the number of stitches between the top and the ankle. The full-fashioned stockings are made in two parts, divided to shape, and seamless stockings. How can they be made so rapidly, and most of the artificial silk stockings that are sold so cheaply are made in this manner.

The popular legend of a stocking from the loom to the top is a humorous one. It is a good story, but not true. The machinery which produces the stockings is a very complicated one, and it is not a few years ago, and the difficulty has been to make artificial silk stockings. The machinery is very expensive and although the industry is an old one, there is no hesitation in adopting new methods, rejecting machinery or modifying it. There is no little doubt that the objection to cheap artificial stockings was valid in time, although it is only fair to state that these objections are due to the demand for a cheap quality and are not in any way a reflection upon the merits of artificial silk or the knitting.

Queen Victoria especially bought black silk stockings with white tops and feet. Cream-colored stockings were also purchased as were all black, and these stockings were invariably made by De-la-Rue. Silk stockings are now being shown with a fancy pattern in contrasting colors and with lace socks.

of Njirio influence employed from the Massai. Their social life is dominated by a superstitious system of omens which are believed to be of supernatural origin. The work of agriculture and stock raising is a difficult matter to any semi-civilized intelligent individual.

The British are closely allied to the Kikuyu but are less subject to the superstitions, fetichs and magic of the latter. They are both pastoral and agricultural, but are not engaged from a pagan state.

The Nyansa Province is primarily peopled by the Kavirato, a generic name covering the Luo and Shaha Aborigines. The Luo are a large Nilotic tribe inhabiting Central and South-Eastern Kariovinia districts. They appear to be less intelligent generally than the Luo of the Luo and Shaha districts. They are the only tribe in Kenya whose women were so distinct of any body.

A Famous Chief.

The Northern or Bantu Kavirato will be led by their chief Mwanja an old man, whose name will go down in East African history as one of the great names of the century who laid the basis of an organization for civilization in the north of East Africa.

The Bantu Kavirato are an enterprising and industrious people. Education and monetary advances have been in their favour and are eagerly sought. They are rapidly becoming increasingly their political organization.

A Flying Squad in Uganda.

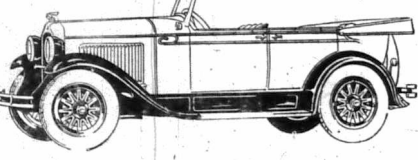

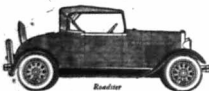

Napier, Sept. 30.

MOTOR DASH FROM LONDON TO THE CAPE.

40 DAYS JOURNEY

Union Racing Experts' Great Trip.

Four Hours Stay in Nairobi on Route.

Mr. Jerry Bowser, the famous South African racing motorist, left London for the Cape on September 1st, 1917, in the motor car "The Duke" to establish a record run from London to Cape Town, on a Chrysler car. It may be recalled that during May of this year Mr. Bowser spent a day or two in Nairobi on his way to the Cape. He did not attempt on that journey to put up any records as he was for the most part making preparations for the run which is now being made. On the 1st of September he set the car on at Brooklands to see what effect the strenuous journey had had on it. A speed of 82 miles per hour was attained on the track and he did an average of 67 miles per hour. He is using the same car for the return journey, although it has now run 22,000 miles.

Records Broken.

Mr. Bowser left London on August 22 and attempting to complete the trip from Cairo to Cape Town in 40 days. He left Cairo on September 1st and arrived in Nairobi on September 23. The journey from Cairo to Khartoum was completed in three days and he covered the distance by at least 500 per cent. from Cairo to Khartoum is generally considered very difficult over the Nubian desert. From Khartoum to Manguilla it was necessary to use the Nile steamer as there is no other means of crossing the Nile.

The run from Manguilla to Nairobi establishes another record. Mr. Bowser set off from Manguilla on September 23 and arrived in Nairobi on September 25, in spite of the fact that the run was made in under favorable conditions, many of the bridges being down between Manguilla and

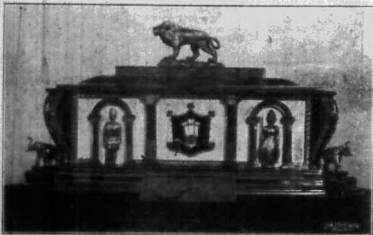

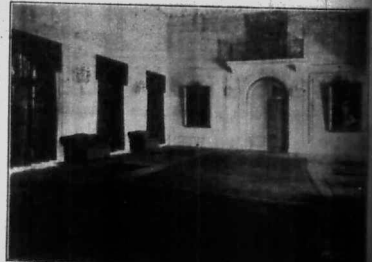

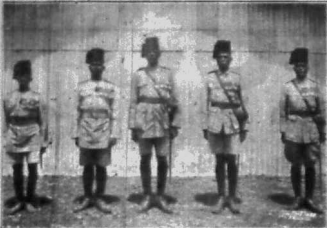

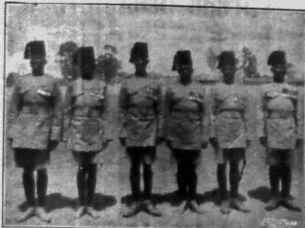
