**The Antarctic Tragedy.**

**DEATH OF PARTY DUE TO EXPOSURE**

(Hester's Special to "E. A. Standard.")

London, Feb. 13. Commander Evans declares that the deaths of the people composing Captain Scott's party were due to scurvy. The suggestion of being back the bodies Commander Evans said that the best judges of this would be Scott's constant companions for the last two years. "Had we ourselves been in the place of the victims we would have wished that our bodies remain where we gave our best efforts in the cause in which we believed an earnestly."

The bodies were found in a cave in a snow-drift where Campbell's northern party had lived a primitive existence for six months. They had taken regular exercise in the shape of physical drill. Their only literature was a copy of David Copperfield a chapter of which they read every day.

Despatches from Christchurch state that Petty Officer Evans was the first to die. He broke down with a nervous fatigue on reaching the pole. The fate of the party was largely due to the fact that he had assisted in most of the return journey and either could not be assisted by the crew or was unable to push on. Every ounce of food was consumed before their death. There was only a small quantity of tea found which was used to make the bodies. Captain Scott was found sitting with his back to the tent pole. However he had and the pole he had used his fingers possibly with the object of writing an earnest appeal. Dr. Wilson Scientist and Lieutenant Bowers were found in their sleeping bags.

**SUGGESTED EXPEDITION.**

The New Zealand High Commission over in London has suggested that the Government could assist the New Zealand Government's steamer "Thames" if it were directed to send out an expedition to search the glaciers bodies, Victor at Lyttelton, New Zealand, states that Commander Evans hoped that people would not insist upon being further informed as the public use of the harvesting material would do no good, and he desired to alleviate as far as he could the distress of the relatives of the gallant men.

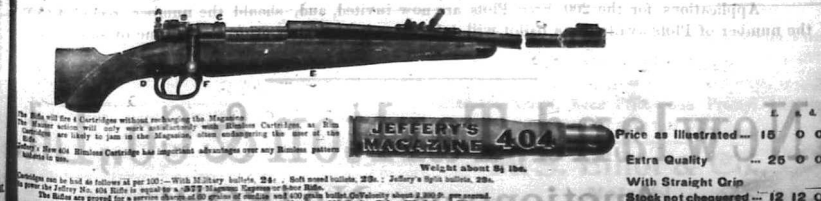

#### ANSWERS TO CORRESPONDENTS.

Under this heading the Editor will be pleased to deal with letters asking for information or advice.

#### PASTORAL VS ARABLE FARMING.

As distinguished from pastoral farming, the system of arable farming demands on the part of the farmer a much wider range of knowledge, the exercise of greater energy, and a more constant attention and assiduity. It requires to understand the whole art of tillage, and all the operations of sowing and rearing, and the selection of the implements and machines necessary for that purpose and how to use them, and the preparation of the soil for the particular crops he intends to grow.

It should also be understood how to choose the crops to be sown, how to select and prepare the soil, how to apply manures, how to prevent or cure the diseases to which crops are subject, how to protect them from the attacks of insects, and how to prevent them when grown from the damage which they are exposed to in an element of tillage.

It is also necessary, except on those farms situated in the immediate neighbourhood of large towns or cities, that the farmer should be conversant with the requirements of the consumption of a large portion of the produce by cattle and sheep, and he must also possess a knowledge of the various stock breeds, of their relative value and adaptability for his purposes, of the best and management in the best and most economical manner, and of their treatment in health and disease, and of their purchase and sale.

In short, the successful management of an arable farm requires the most complete knowledge of agricultural practice and science in all its branches, combined with sound judgment, energy and good business capacity.

Arable farming also requires the greatest amount of capital that can be employed in the cultivation of the land, and the total returns in yield of crops are greater than can be got either in mixed or pastoral farming, in the proportion to the closeness of the rotation and the intensity of cultivation applied.

It requires at once the greatest employment of labour, the largest investment of money, the highest productiveness of the land, and the greatest knowledge and skill on the part of the farmer, and it may therefore be justly regarded as the most difficult and the most profitable of any farming system.

The size of arable farms is, as a rule, limited by the amount of labour and capital available for considerations that affect efficiency and the economy of their management.

#### FERTILITY IN ANIMALS.

Comparative fertility of various types—The domestic sow will bear an average of 10 to 12 piglets at a time, and it is said to be on an average at intervals of 11 to 12 months.

But when we pass to mammals of a lower order, we find a great contrast. Under favourable conditions the mouse, rat, rabbit and guinea pig are practically always prolific. An experienced rabbit breeder informed me that a doe-rabbit may sometimes produce as many as eleven litters in a year.

John Board, a young rabbit may have young when it is six or eight months old, and it brings forth five to eight at a time. In others, it may have six litters in a year, a pair might be the ancestors of twenty millions in five years.

It is not merely the frequent succession of pregnancies but the number of offspring at each birth that make the fertility of these lower mammals so great. The rabbit often have five to eight young, the pig may have eight to fourteen, and that does not indicate the great fertility, fourteen embryos having been found of one time in a rabbit's uterus and as many as twenty in the pig.

The largest known number is in the opossum in which Selenia counted twenty-seven. Different degrees of fecundity—it is difficult to arrive at satisfactory conclusions as to comparative fecundity. It is reported to wild animals statistics are lacking and in regard to many conditions, many of them, it is difficult to be taken account of, that the results of statistics require to be treated very cautiously. The temporary sterility of a female may lead the observer to think that she is barren, but it may be due to quite artificial causes and may disappear when the animal ranges hands.

From an inventory of 100 to 150 in certain Fergana fifty or sixty two (also may be expected) the Herd Book of the Experimental Farm at Exeter showed for a period of eight years an average of seventy-five per cent. from hundred cows, for sheep the degree of sterility is higher and 82 per cent. seems not uncommon. In contrast to such high figures, but per cent. have to recall the case like that of the elephant which does not breed so capriciously, this additional sterility is due to a naturally low degree of fertility.

Fertility as a heritable character—When we compare the productivity of rabbits and wild rabbits of pig and deer, of the dog and wolf, and so on, we are led to the conclusion that certain domesticated forms are much more prolific than their wild relatives. This is notably the case with ducks and poultry. It may be due in part to the direct influence or the abundant nutrition secured in the domestic environment, it is in some cases due to the continued selection of the more fertile.

To take a contrasted pair of cases, the half-domesticated ferret is said to be much more prolific than the polecat, of which it is simply an allozy variety, and this is probably a direct result of artificial conditions; on the other hand, it is quite certain that the fertility of pigs which is very great to start with in the wild state, have been increased during domestication, in selecting the more fertile for breeding from. It is certain that it can be increased still more by the same means. This Messrs. and Phillips have shown in regard to Poland China pigs: (1) that there has been an increase of 20 per cent in the number of the litter in the twenty years between 1862 and 1902 and (2) that the size of the litter is a character definitely transmitted to the mother to daughter. The latter is a fact well known to pig-breeders who select as breed sows the progeny of large litters only—and further only those numbers of such litters as are provided with large numbers of teats (the maximum number possible is sixteen).

Buffon pointed out that domestic animals breed earlier and produce more young than their wild relatives and that they sometimes breed earlier. Darwin also was emphatic in pointing out that increased fertility has followed domestication. "With hardly an exception, our domesticated animals, which have long been habituated to a regular and copious supply of food, without the labour of searching for their own food, are much more fertile than corresponding wild animals."

"The wild sow is remarkably prolific, for she often breeds twice in the year, and produces from four to eight sometimes even twelve young at a birth; but the domestic sow regularly breeds twice a year and would breed often if permitted; and a sow that produces less than eight at a birth is worthless. And the same is the law for the butcher's better." "Ranks offer abundant evidence of increased fertility from domestication; the hen of the wild Gallus bankiva lays from six to ten eggs, a number which would be thought nothing of with the domestic hen. The wild duck lays from five to ten eggs; the same one if the course of the year from eight to one hundred."

Of much importance is Darwin's conclusion: "In some cases, as with the pig, rabbit, etc., and with many plants that are raised for their seed, the direct selection of the more fertile individuals has probably been interested in their fertility; and in all cases this may have occurred indirectly, from the better chance of the more numerous offspring produced by the more fertile individuals having survived. But with cats, ferrets and dogs and with plants like cereals, cabbage, and apparatus which are not raised for their prolificacy, selection can have played only a subordinate part, and their increased fertility must be attributed to the more favourable conditions of life under which they have long existed."

Very important work has been done by Professor Karl Pearson and others who have investigated heredity by statistical methods. Thus, taking the subtle quality of fecundity in thorough-bred race horses, Pearson and Brinkley-More have shown that it is inherited between dam and daughter and also through the male side. It has also been shown (e.g. as regards man) that fecundity is a heritable quality. In other words, exact proof has been given of what might have been inferred on presumptive evidence from cases, like those of poultry, where domesticated forms have attained to a remarkable degree of fecundity.

Many breeders have noticed the heritability of a tendency to bear twins, and this would it were not for the population that many have against breeding from twins which are sometimes, because they are twins, below the average in vigor. In this connection we may recall the fact that the various domesticated animals which are specially selected for their fertility, and in which we produce twins. A twin birth may be expected from mares about once in a thousand litters, in cattle about once in eighty litters.

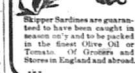

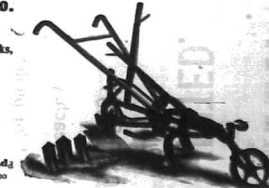

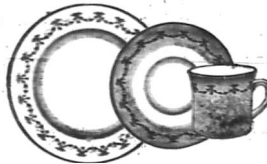
