AERODROME SCHEME.

Still the Liberals do take the field last at their Yearbook Conference this week and therein they have the advantage of seeing the show first of all competitors, and these are the show fronts as far as we have got them.

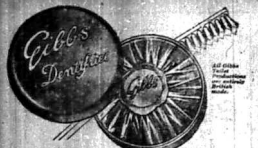
