SEE CONGO TREATY.

Arising out of the recent action of the Association of E. A. Chambers of Commerce, two questions were addressed to the Government through Legislative Council and the written answers are now available for publication.

Congo Postal Treaty.

The first question, relating to the Congo Postal Treaty and certain Duties, read:—
 (a) Will Government state if Congo Postal Treaty dealing particularly with Customs Duties will be signed in the near future? If so when?
 (b) Has Government yet been approached by the Imperial Government to accede to the said treaty on any of the subjects which may come up for signature?

The reply is as follows:—
 (a) Article 12 of the Convention of St. Germain-Lays 1919 provides that the Greater Powers shall re-assemble at the expiration of 10 years from the coming into force of the Convention in order to introduce into it such modifications as experience may have shown to be necessary.

The earliest date at which any steps can be taken is the expiry of the Convention in the summer of 1929.

(b) The Government is in correspondence with the Secretary of State in the matter.

Flour Prices Reduced

The Poultry World.

Chicken Pox.

Source of Great Anxiety.

Chicken pox still proves a source of great worry to poultry farmers. I am continually getting letters from people asking what can be done in the matter. The Government has now a vaccine for the disease and they are still working on it to bring it to a perfect form. At present the Veterinary Department is issuing the vaccine free of charge, but they state that although every cure is taken in the preparation of the vaccine to guarantee one can grow without the anxiety of efficacy.

The vaccine can be used from the time the chicks are five weeks old, but my experience is that the chicks developed the disease at about three weeks old, and I have found it practically impossible to avoid the infection. I therefore treat my chicks from the day they are hatched with a weakly diluted, but combined vaccine over which, although all my chicks get the disease, the losses are practically nil. I would like to find that a vaccine could be used when the chicks are first hatched, as it is found to be a certain amount of loss in development. The Veterinary Department is preparing for about half a dozen White Leghorn chicks from four to six months old for use in inoculation with the production of a Fox Vaccine. The birds, although not yet hatched, have not been inoculated for fear of the disease being with big combs and performance will be suitable birds for display and exhibition. How long it takes the eggs to be hatched after the setting is done. As you state that the loss was quite satisfactory, I would advise that the undermating had caused weak germs. The fact that incubation ceased at the same time with the chicks would rather point to the eggs having been infected at some time during incubation. I suppose it was not possible that the loss was off 100 long at some time? Another source of infection is a badly made nest. A hen may not perfectly and set the eggs up well through the nest being badly made and allowing the eggs to roll to the side from under the hen. Eggs will be hatched by her soon from the fourth day, but it is safer to wait a week before depending on all eggs being fertilized by the hen.

Another correspondent writes asking for information on the treatment of chicken pox. I had dealt with this above. From your description of the disease growing in the neck, I am inclined to think it appears to be suffering from some form of chicken pox. The great trouble with the virus is that it is not well understood. An incubation of hot water and fresh liniment will be a remedy.

Water as Fuel.

CLAIMS OF BRITISH SOCIETY.

Starting claims were made by Dr. Francis von Helldorf, a Russian, in his address speaking at the World Water Conference in London recently. He stated that at the end of 20 years of study he had discovered a method of using water as fuel.

He said that he was submitting information concerning his process to the British and German Governments. He claimed that he was able to release the hydrogen and then to extract the hydrogen from the oxygen. The hydrogen could then be used as a fuel in the same way as coal used for power purposes.

Dr. von Helldorf said that the low cost of the process would mean the end of coal as a fuel. Dr. E. W. Smith, one of the technical secretaries of the conference, said that no process was 100 per cent efficient. Consequently, he challenged the statement of the Russian. "There cannot be, in my view, a creation of energy," he said. "There may be an increase in efficiency and the use of a better fuel, but the latter knowledge that it is not possible to create energy." Dr. von Helldorf's work was done in Russia.

Dr. von Helldorf said: "For every unit of horsepower used in my machine working on hot water, I can produce sufficient hydrogen gas to work a motor of the same horsepower. I have also made high alterations to see the heat units obtained from every horsepower of energy expended are equivalent to 770 horsepower." The gas will take the place of the engine fuel, he said. "Easting engines and boilers will be replaced, for the gas burner. The gas is readily adapted to any boiler. If the principle is adapted for maritime use, the present boiler spaces will be available for cargo because the plant to produce the gas takes up such a small space."

Life of Devil's Island.

22 CONVICTS DROWNED WHILE ESCAPING.

Twenty-two men in a small boat were all drowned when their craft was wrecked in trying to escape from the French convict settlement of Devil's Island.

Ernest Fives, of the French Barge Agency, makes this statement in a report of his visit to the convict on Devil's Island, and the Paris they ran in understanding to the escape recently. Dr. Bouquet, the Marseille doctor, who mortified one of his patients. "The convicts on Devil's Island," says Ernest Fives, "have, which he hated during their captivity and they are a constant consolation when they are released."

"Their own dream is to escape, but one day another, they all try it. They are used only to swim, the means a wide river, to get into the Devil's Ganges. "If they know a trade, however poor, and believe themselves, they are allowed to live there in peace, but otherwise they are turned over to the penitentiary officials again for punishment." That generally consists of Devil's Island, conditions on Devil's Island, in spite of its name.

There are terrible currents in the sea and only a few who try get across in safety. While I was there, 22 men, seeking to escape in a small boat, were all drowned in the well known island of punishment. The only survivors were those who got to Brazil or Venezuela or other countries of the world.



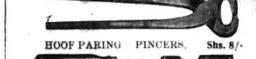

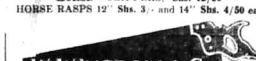

that measure will be shall be able to bring back ready for approval by the Council they must improve upon it.

Aiding the Settlers.
Apart from assistance to settlement, I am convinced that a great deal of assistance from State credit is also essential at the present time to the development of Native reserves. I now intend to see as an instance the present condition of the Kikuyu reserves, where reconditioning after the long period of abandonment must involve something in the nature of capital expenditure. There is great difficulty in securing this for the native reserves because it is not easy to find adequate security for those without, in some way, compromising native lands and Government loans, in connection with the Native Lands Trust Bill, to find some suitable form of State credit in connection with the native reserves for assistance to Government.

Also dependent on the settlement notes of the Land Bank and on the provision of State credit, are the matters before the Council dealing with housing and cattle husbandry. These measures are equally important to the progress of European and African settlement. They have been extensively discussed not only in this Council but in many meetings in other parts of the Colony, and I hope that in these final forms they will receive the support of the farming community. Every experienced settler who has seen this country and who knows I have had the opportunity of discussing those proposals, has advised that measures of this kind are absolutely vital to our progress and that they ought greatly to facilitate the steady migration and settled farming which is essential to the welfare of a growing Colony. The work for the Native Lands Trust Bill and the measures contained within it.

Local Government.
Apart from these which are now advanced and in the Senate Book, are the Local Government measures which are the result of the latest advancement of the Council during the year. As regards the new Municipal organization of Nairobi and Mombasa, I should like to express again my appreciation for the initiative and energy of the Hon.able Table Conference which produced the compromise of the proposals to these measures. The spirit in which both sides have done their best to the Colony and has served the

interests of both the Imperial and the Indian Governments.
I think that a state of sincere frankness should also inspire our fellows to the old Municipal Committee as Members. They have done a great deal under difficult conditions, not the least of which is the fact that they are employed in other capacities. The position indeed has always been difficult for both sides. It was difficult for the Local Authorities and it was difficult for Government. There were certain faults in the system which undoubtedly needed to be removed. But the need for wider and stronger Municipal organization is an reflection whatever on the past services of those bodies and I think the thanks of both communities are due to them. With the increase and swelling up of populations at these points in the heart of Africa it is probable that problems will arise, problems in regard to water, problems in regard to sanitation, problems that in all these respects a new era is now in sight.

With regard to this system of Local Government now passed for the settled areas in the Colony, I would say of it that it is the most important step in realizing the aims in the Central Government measures which are now before the Council. It is the most anxious to assist Local Authorities in the development of Local Government. It does not wish to make this new system merely a ground for new financial impositions and for putting up of the present burden. For from it, I am sure that all Local Authorities, all District Councils, when they come into being will find that the attitude of Government is both helpful and generous. Both in town and country, public services on these bodies will have a great stress on the lines of help in a busy farming and commercial community. For their work will now be associated with much more responsibility and authority, and the manner in which they are to be carried forward for that work will be a test of the results and fitness of this committee for further responsibility.

Before I leave the subject of Local Government, I should like

to once again express a thanks of the Council to Mr. Justice Forster for his wonderful work done for the report. I believe no coming year the Colony will look back upon that work with any other gratitude.

Registration of Votes.
Before I leave these Government measures, there is one other subject which arises in the connection with the review of the subject to say a word in reference to the election which was set out for the year for the State elections of members. 

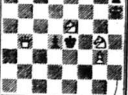

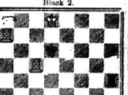

DURBAN CHAMPION.

The Championship of the Durban Club has been won by J. C. Archer, joint, his father, J. C. Archer, being second. It is most unusual for father and son to win the first two places in a tournament, but it may happen again in Nairobi, for G. New Rolls-Royce Engine.

DEPARTMENT FROM BRITISH PRACTICE.

Very considerable interest has been caused by the new Rolls-Royce "F" type steam engine which was demonstrated for the first time in public at the Harrogate Exhibition.

It marks a departure from previous British practice in that the two sets of cylinders are cast as monobloc frame, thus eliminating the numerous cast-iron parts and reducing oil-fuel. Further it results in a much more rigid engine, the blocks becoming a grille to the crankcase.

There are, however, other features which make this product of the famous Darby works remarkable. In the first place it uses one piston than any other standard steam engine, the fuel consumption at normal power and speed being 20 gallons per hour. Again, its reduced friction and low oil consumption, owing to the use of the fuel-injector and oil-injector, and consequently great fuel economy, it is estimated that the new engine will enable a boiler to be constructed which, at an elevation of 15,000 ft, will be 30 H.P. faster than any existing H.P. single-cylinder engine.

It is now in full production and orders for a considerable number have been placed by the Air Ministry. Some of these engines are required to replace those of American make which were imported some time ago, while others are to be installed in machines of the very latest type. These latter are expected to give performance of the most striking nature in this course.

THE MENACE OF INSECT PESTS.

Methods of "Biological Control."

WAR ON WEEDS.

The combating of insect pests and destructive weeds by introducing parasites and the selective breeding of bees as last made possible by means of a remarkable invention, were among the subjects discussed at the fourth International Congress of Entomologists, held recently at Ithaca, New York.

Outing out by the president of the congress, Dr. L. O. Howard, the veteran American entomologist, who may very well be called the Father of Economic Entomology, the following address has been read: "The spraying of man was being very seriously challenged by the insect, and that constant vigilance and effort was necessary to prevent public and destructive pests from overwhelming our agriculture and commerce. To Europe this may sound like a gross exaggeration, but you have had with the destruction wrought by the Japanese beetle, the European corn borer, the grey moth, and the boll weevil in America, all the compelling to agree with Dr. Howard (see an account in the "Daily Telegraph").

Entomologists are turning their attention more and more to what we know as "biological control" methods. For example, the war on grasses of California suffered serious losses each year from the depredations of the weevils. This was a tall and spraying is difficult and expensive. As a result the Weevil Growers' Association has found the money for the establishment of an exportment station where entomologists are employed to study and select such insects as destroy the weevils naturally. These minute parasites are sent abroad in small boxes and are released in the war on grasses to exert on their term field work.

Breeding Parasites.

The breeding of the parasite is a technical and difficult business, and the delegates at the congress were shown all the details of the work by means of a series of lantern slides. It is interesting

to note that this work is subsidised by the farmers themselves, and the orange growers of California have established a number of experimental stations where numerous thousands of a certain kind of fly have been reared that they may prey upon the malarial bugs which infest the leaves and which do the ordinary spray materials.

Certain parts of Australia are overgrown with dense thickets of the tree which has made it impossible to carry on agricultural production. Some of the money has been spent in a certain way to destroy the tree.

Now certain species of insects which have been introduced which are proving successful in the control of the tree. The could insect and a small ant which are helping to clean up the prickly pear-infested land. So encouraging have the results been that the Australian Government is now about to establish a special institute where the intricate problems of weed-control by means of insects will be studied fully.

Dr. Tillyard is in charge of this work, and is being aided by Dr. D. James, a Baltimorean. These two entomologists, both Congresses of the results of their labours to the benefit of their people for the future. They realize that it is not a matter of a few weeks, and elaborate precautions are taken to ensure that the insects which are introduced into Australia to fight the weeds are harmless to all cultivated plants.

If any species, in the course of the experiments, shows the slightest aptitude for attacking any plants other than those in the experiment, it is ruthlessly exterminated.

A Wireless "Damm."

(STANDARD CORRESPONDENT) London, October 8.

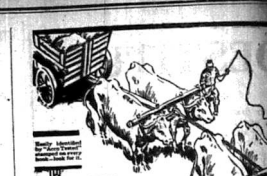

SALTING NUTS AT HOME.
