Agriculture. Crop Report for September.

The first crop report—that for September—based on the figures obtained from farmers under the "Calendar" system has been issued by the Department of Agriculture. It is as follows:—
In relation to the first crop estimates, the "Calendar" system, which introduced the position as at September 30, 1928, it is suggested that the figures should be used with caution. It will be readily understood that crop estimating by produce is not easy, and demands considerable judgment and experience. It is therefore probable having regard to the inexperience of correspondents that the results obtained in this first attempt may not be as accurate as may be expected in subsequent reports, when correct and verified entries in their procedure are made. In the view it is considered that the estimates rendered are reasonably accurate, and furnish valuable figures of the season's production. It is, however, regretted that the numbers of monthly reports received are still inadequate, and a further appeal is made to producers, particularly those with large areas under cultivation, to send some Crop Correspondents and their names the Department for serving at estimates of the crop with the greatest degree of accuracy.

Some districts, notably Trans Moira and Uasin Gishu, responded well to the Department's appeal for monthly reports. Up to date 149 reports have been received in the appeal, but there are still 148 districts in arrears. It is also observed that a large number of correspondents who submitted reports in August failed to do so in September, under the impression that, as they had no change to report, the September return would not be required.

Such impressions should be dispelled and correspondents should consider the position monthly independently of their previous estimates and whether any change has occurred or not reports should be made to complete the results given between the August and December reports and alterations varying from crop to crop per acre.

This and numerous other causes are responsible for monthly variations in the crop, and such fluctuations necessitate regular monthly reports from all correspondents.

ELDORET HAVINE.—The area under maize increased by 4.4 per cent as compared with the previous year and an estimated yield of 2.8 bags per acre is returned. What remains stationary, a small increase in the Cereals yield is recorded. Drought conditions and damage by locusts are reported.

KIAMBU.—Weather conditions continue to be dry and a consequent decrease in 4.6 per cent in the Coffee yield is estimated.

KEICHO.—Normal conditions are reported and an increase of 18 per cent in the Coffee yield is anticipated.


MACHAKOS.—As to the present drought has been reported in this District. Station

KEIUU-LINDINI.—Favourable conditions have prevailed in the area under maize. The crop has increased by 22 per cent and an average yield of 12.5 bags per acre is estimated. The Coffee crop is expected, on being 22.5 per cent below that of the previous year.

LALIPILA.—The area under wheat has increased by 12 per cent and an average yield of 2 bags per acre is expected. Drought conditions have been experienced throughout the season.

SAVABIA.—The total area increased by 11 per cent and a yield of 2.2 bags per acre is estimated.

FROM NYERI TO KISUMU BY CAR.

Experiences in Northern Frontier District.

A RETURN JOURNEY.

In interesting and successful motor trip was recently undertaken by Messrs. P. A. MacDougal, of Nyeri in late July last for Kisumu in Italian Southland. The party was accompanied by a motor-car, and the route was for the most part untraveled, especially from Uasinaiya towards Kisumu. From Nyeri to Kisumu is a distance of 250 miles, the country is a wonderfully well watered, and rivers and streams being common. Many of them rising near the Uasinaiya hills to the west of this, and these are bridged, in spite of the fact that the greater part of this area is unhabited except by a few nomadic tribes, such as the elephant and rhino. From an agricultural point of view, the country with its many rivers and wonderful soil would be ideal were it not for the belts of tsetse fly which occur at intervals. The altitude is about 3,000 ft.

After leaving Nyeri the road went across country which is to all intents and purposes quite flat, following the route of the old coast railway down to the Walle of Mts. Kenia, an important place in the road-making days.

The road from here on is broad and well signed with a roadstead surface, and the car was "let out" for miles.

Some East African Recipes that will Help.

No. 4: The Shenzi Chicken.

BY A KENYA HOUSEWIFE.

This tough skinny, and somewhat tasteless member of the "chick" family needs a little more dressing up than one of our large plump European birds. Nevertheless, it can be made very palatable as the following recipe will prove.

CHICKEN POT ROAST.

Joint the chicken and wash and dry the pieces. Place some fat in a pan and fry until each piece is browned nicely. Add salt, pepper, and 2 tablespoons of chopped onion. Pour over all a pint of boiling water, cover tightly, and allow to simmer very gently on top of the stove or in the oven for two hours. Add more water from time to time if necessary. Thicken gravy slightly and serve sliced chicken.

PRESSED CHICKEN.

Joint and skew 2 or 3 chickens, according to size, until the meat falls from the bones. Cut all the meat in neat slices, discarding all skin and entrails. Season with salt and herbs and fill carefully with the sliced chicken. Season the bread lightly and butter to stand in a rool place over night.

CHICKEN PASTRY.

Take a chicken, remove the meat from bones, and chop. Measure. Add to it a small quantity potato, and 1/2 a small finely chopped onion. Flavour with salt, pepper and a little sugar. Place tablespoon on rounds of

pastry, fold over, press edges to either and bake. The broth may be used for soup, or as follows.

NOODLES.

Break an egg into a bowl. Add a pinch of salt and a dessert spoonful of cold water and beat well. Add flour until it becomes a stiff dough. Remove to a floured board and knead in as much flour as possible. Roll out as thin as paper, and allow to dry for a few minutes. Flour the surface and fold four times, then roll up tightly. With a sharp knife, slice thinly. Shake out and allow to dry until brittle. Place in a tin and stored in a cool place, these noodles will keep indefinitely. Slice 1/2 ounce in chicken broth, or use as a substitute for macaroni.

CHICKEN STEW.

Prepare the stew as for pot roast and fry brown on all sides. Place in the bottom of a casserole 1 cup of fresh butter beans, or old ones which have been soaked over night (heretics may be used). Next put in the chicken, then a layer of sliced onion, and on top a layer of tomato. Season and pour over with water, adding more from time to time if necessary. Simmer gently until the hen and beans are done.

CHICKEN PIE.

1 cup cooked chicken, 1/2 cup sliced cooked potatoes, 1/2 pint of chicken broth, 1/2 cup sliced cooked carrots, 1 tablespoonful chopped onion, 1/2 cup sliced mushrooms, 1/2 cup sliced chicken livers and pour over the other ingredients. Place in a pie dish, cover with pastry and bake.

KENYA SCHOLARSHIP FOR OXFORD OR CAMBRIDGE.

Proposed by the Kenya Society.

APPEAL TO MEMBERS.

In the course of a circular which has been sent to the Hon. Secretary of the Oxford and Cambridge Society of Kenya an appeal is made to members to support an appeal Scheme for the provision of a Scholarship for a Kenya boy.
The circular states that the proposals to endow a scholarship at one of the Universities are discussed at the last Annual General Meeting of the Society in December, 1927.

The Proposal.

The proposal is that the Kenyan Education Fund of £1,000 should be agreed by the Oxford and Cambridge Society of Kenya and that the sum, or more, should be obtained by subscription and voluntary contributions of members of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge in Kenya and that a Cambridge boy should be made to obtain this sum, or more, from such persons during the years 1928, 1929 and 1930 and that the amount should be placed under the control of Trustees appointed for this purpose at the next Annual General Meeting of the Society.
It is stated that the selection of the scholar should be left in the hands of the Committee of the Oxford and Cambridge Society of Kenya with the assistance of such persons as are present at the Cambridge dinner to which the selectors will take their consideration, character, scholarship and athletic ability into making their selection. It is also given preference to a candidate who was born in Kenya and is in need of financial assistance.

An Appeal.

The President and Committee hope that every member of the Society will either make a donation to or give an expression of opinion to the Scholarship Fund, the National Club of India, Nairobi, and that members will endeavor to obtain new members of the Society.

A Quarry Site.

TOWN COUNCIL TURN DOWN APPLICATION.

The Town Planning Committee of Nairobi Town Council recently received an application from a quarry licensee for a quarry site in the Veterinary Quarantine Reserve.

On the advice of the Municipal Engineer, it was resolved to recommend that this site should be reserved for municipal purposes, and it may be necessary to exercise of Powers, or possibly grant a municipal quarry, and therefore the application should not be granted. The Council adopted the recommendation at Tuesday's meeting.

Possible use of a Death Ray?

Sound waves to lure insects to destruction.

In a further section of the same issue dealing with the possible use of sound waves in the control of Agriculture says:

Destruction of Fleas.

Newly hatched fleas are most rapidly killed when contacted by sound waves. They are then both vulnerable and die and move very far in a day so that the operation can be repeated with very little loss of time. It is, however, quite possible for a young flea to be hatched from an egg which has been laid on a surface which is not vibrating. applied on their bodies might be used to lure them to a point of destruction. It would be of value if the vulnerable parts of the bodies of insects were explained. There is no doubt in our minds that a beam hanging on a tree in the evening is far more readily killed by spraying than is a locust resting on the ground.

Locusts as Manure.

Dealing with manure which flies should not be present against the use of the present system of laying down in Kenya is the use of manure. Quantities of the insects are collected and used as soil. If sprayed, half-priced locusts may be consumed, and as a result manure may be made cheaply of using the locust. Manure could collect many tons of locusts and use them as manure. A ton of locusts is as valuable to a farmer as a ton of manure and often may be just as readily harvested.

A Retrospect.

In looking back at the problem which presented itself it is quite evident that the organ on which we have been dealing is not adequate to deal with the enormous task effected in the Colony. It is also a fact that however articulate the committee may have been, there was only one action at organization and cooperation as the part of a Farmers' Association. Now that the actual handling of locusts is known and the damage they can do has been experienced, the recollection however dim it may seem, will undoubtedly act as a spur for concerted and wide spread action in the future. In native areas also the supply of locusts has been broadcast, and should continue until the very next opportunity it is hoped will cooperate.

In order adequately to tackle such a problem the first requirement is an efficient intelligence

which will observe the approach of swarms, note the areas visited, and lay traps accordingly. It is commensurate that information rapidly by a central organization. On receipt and verification of such information that central organization should proceed to prepare for locusts that are not a few days with in the area within four or five days. It is not just sufficient to move up apparatus and plants, but a surveying machine, a number of laying ground, water on the ground should be noted, if necessary a tank and may be set, proper concentration sites should be chosen so that the area may be properly patrolled and a full equipment of insecticides and plants should be available. The importance of getting areas rapidly under control cannot be too strongly emphasized, as subsequently there are certain to be not a few stragglers to matter how good the original intelligence and the subsequent work.

In a reference to the relation between the Government and the owners of the land infested with locusts it is stated that as in the present Locust Bill the land owner is responsible for destruction of locusts. By means of local organizations in the settled areas the community will assist when an owner finds the infestation too severe for his own unaided efforts.

On Coven land the Government will have to pay for destruction. In Native Reserve the problem is much more complicated. The aid of the native authority evidence should be invoked, on pressure from the Department of Agriculture. In order that the Department may properly exercise this pressure it should very closely examine all native areas and keep aware under observation. The organization for destruction in native areas should be in the hands of the Administration with as much assistance as can be afforded by the local organization.

It is important that Provincial Commissioners study this problem and derive the means whereby they can mobilize a sufficiently strong native effort to cope with the pest. Verbal reports of infested areas and the appearance of locusts should be met with a small monetary reward. It has been suggested that grain has been exchanged for locusts.

Building Regulations.

TOWN COUNCIL AND A GOVERNMENT OPERATOR

For the purpose of further examination of the draft building regulations under the Public Health Ordinance which have been submitted to Government by the Council of Nairobi, it is proposed to appoint a small committee to examine a provisional set of the P.W.D. and to advise the Council on the merits of the Medical Department (sanitary) and the Municipal and Town Planning Engineer. The Town Council has been asked to agree that a member of the Municipality staff should also serve on the Committee.

The Mayor, Mr. T. A. Wood, explained to the Council on Tuesday that the proposed by-laws would probably be for the country in general in view of the service of local government.

Councillor Brown suggested that a representative of the East African Association and the East African Institute of Architects should also be appointed to the Committee.

The Mayor pointed out that any by-laws would not be applied to buildings being published for public notice but that Architects and builders would have an opportunity of criticising them.

The Council agreed to nominate their Building Surveyor and a member representative of the public and to confer with Councillor Brown's suggestion.

Following the request by the Town Council from stockholders from Alessandro Ciani to Nairobi Road to repair their stretch of roadway, the Vice-Council recommended that the engineer should be paid, and the stretch should be repaired. If it is found that it is not possible, it should report as the best course to adopt—either to reconstruct or to seal the stretch.

The Council also recommended that temporary repairs should be carried out on Campes Ribeiro Avenue and on Whitehouse Road near the junction of Victoria Street, and on the main entrance road to the garden area. The Council adopted the recommendation on Tuesday.

GOVERNMENT OFFICES GARAGES.

Town Council Opposed to New Policy.

A RECOMMENDATION

A few weeks ago the "Standard" questioned whether the erection of the imposing garages outside the Supreme Court House was the beginning of a programme of garage-building for Government Departments in Nairobi.

The answer was forthcoming at Tuesday's meeting of Nairobi Town Council when the Town Planning and Public Health Committee reported that a letter had been received from the Executive Engineer Public Works Department, stating that he had received instructions to erect a garage for the Architectural and Forest Departments on vacant Government land in the township.

After discussion, it was resolved that the Council be opposed to the policy of erecting such garages in connection with the various departmental Government activities on vacant Government land in the township.

It is recommended that Council be requested to approve the plan of the former Council's approval of the proposed site. It was resolved to recommend that the Council be asked to make the landlords to make their own distribution arrangements among their various tenants, the price of the meters to be set at 50/- each, the land to be supplied by the Corporation as is defined by the Corporation, and the Corporation taking no responsibility whatever for the internal system.

The recommendation was adopted by the Town Council on Tuesday.

Cost of a Drain.

QUESTION OF SOURCE OF FIELDS

The Municipal Engineer reported to the Works Committee of Nairobi Town Council on Tuesday that the drain from the Nairobi Market to the Municipal Council was urgently required attention. The cost of making a proper drain to wards, the river would be approximately Shs. 5,000/-.

Road's New Name.

GOVERNMENT SUGGESTION ADOPTED.

It was suggested that the present road from Ngara Road to the junction of Forest Hill Road, now named Kyanba Road should be re-named in view of the fact that Kyanba Road also extends from the War Memorial at Malindi northwards. According to the Council's proposal, the obvious name for the road leading from the top of Swazey Road and Ngara Road straight through Malindi should be Fort Hill Road, which leaves a gap in the Kyanba Road from approximately the Cemetery to the War Memorial at Malindi.

It was therefore recommended that the present Kyanba Road from Ngara Road to the junction of Fort Hill Road near the Cemetery should be re-named Park Road.

The Town Council adopted this recommendation on Tuesday.

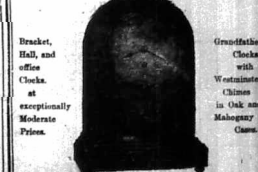
