Immigration Statistics.

RULES WHICH COME INTO FORCE NEXT YEAR.

Regulations in connection with the completion of immigration statistics under the Statistics Ordinance which will be into operation on March 1, 1927.

started some people but they overlooked the fact that our net revenue was only £2,000,000 and that of this amount only approximately two millions represented actual taxation because being made up of payment for services rendered and from other sources. That figure, therefore, is not a true picture of the future because the taxable capacity of the country would increase rapidly in the next five to six years. He was confident that within that time the average settler who to-day felt the strain of 2000 per cent taxation would be more nearly able to bear an income tax in excess of that figure. But it was not from further taxation of the settler that he looked for an increase of revenue in the future; it was from a broadening of the base of taxation. That might sound like an expression of prodigious optimism, actually it was an expression of faith in the economic progress of the native as a result of his contact with white civilization. He was certain that the taxable capacity of the country would increase and that the future would rapidly increase.

Men-Productive Money.
He expressed regret that there should be such a large increase of expenditure in connection with non-productive departments and thought it was a great pity that more should have to be spent on the police and on administrative departments of that kind. He regarded as the abnormal increase of expenditure of that kind it was not possible to increase the number of departments whose products work of greater value to the province than those which were beginning to decline. It was his hope that they did and he hoped that the Government in the immediate future would be able to do something to relieve the country of the financial resources. 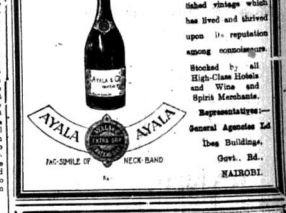
