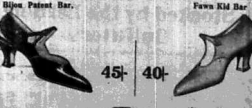

INCREASED CHARGES AT THE COOL STORES.

Government Attempt to Avoid Loss.

POWERS OF SALE AND LIABILITIES CONDITIONS.

In the operation of the Government Cool Stores at Kisumu it has been found that certain of the regulations need supplementing. The last issue of the Kenya "Official Gazette" contains the new regulations which will come into force on January 1, 1921. The changes which have been made are not drastic.

The schedule of charges has also been amended as it was found that the Stores were running at a loss. The original charges not being sufficient to pay for the cost of

keep in accordance with a regulation which was passed by the Members Chamber of Commerce. The increase in charges will fall mainly on those products best able to bear it. In such cases the increase made has only been a very small one, and should not be considered as a 25% increase of butter is 25 cents or approximately one cent per pound for the first week, while subsequent weeks the increase amounts to only one tenth of one cent per pound.

New Powers.

In the new regulations the Chief Officer is given power to sell or assign any produce in the store which has become unfit for food, provided that where any produce is marketable the Chief Officer shall not do so and the proceeds of any sale after deduction of any commission to the Cool Stores shall be handed to the owner of the produce on application of the producer.

Charges shall be made by the Department of Agriculture as shown in the Schedule. Payment of these charges is to be made to the Chief Officer and Inspector prior to the removal of produce from the Cool Stores premises.

When in the opinion of the Chief Officer and Inspector the charges already accrued on a consignment of produce have become equal to 50 per cent of its marketable value of such produce shall be entitled to be disposed of by the depositor a sum not exceeding 50 per cent of the charges should this sum not be paid within seven days of the demand, he shall be entitled to sell all or such portion of the produce as may be necessary to recover all charges on the whole consignment.

The responsibility of Government for any loss or damage that may be suffered in respect of any produce accepted for storage in the Cool Stores shall be no greater than the responsibility of a holder under section 151 of the Indian Contract Act. It is not considered as if Government be liable to pay compensation for loss of produce which is ultimately proved that the loss or damage was due to negligence on the part of Government or its servants.

For cases of minimum weight Sh. 15. 1/2 for the first week of part of week, and thereafter Sh. 25 per case per week or part of week; instead of 75 cents and 20 cents respectively.

Cheese and Butter not Packed as Above.

Sh. 1/50 per cent per week or part of week, and thereafter Sh. 50 per week or part of week, instead of 1/100 per cent weekly respectively.

Wool and Hides.

Sh. 1/50 per cent per week or part of week, and thereafter Sh. 20 per week or part of week, instead of Sh. 1/2 and 25 cents respectively.

Beef.

Sh. 2/50 per quarter for the first fortnight or part of fortnight and thereafter Sh. 1/2 per week or part of week; instead of Sh. 2/25 and 75 cents respectively.

Mutton and Pork.

Sh. 2/25 per carcase for the first fortnight or part of fortnight and thereafter Sh. 1/2 per week or part of week; instead of Sh. 2/25 and 75 cents respectively.

Fruit.

Sh. 1/50 per cent per week or part of week, and thereafter Sh. 25 per week or part of week; instead of Sh. 1/2 and 20 cents respectively.

Vegetables.

Sh. 1/2 per cent per week or part of week, and thereafter Sh. 50 per week or part of week. (No charge.)

Fish.

Sh. 1/50 per cent per week or part of week, and thereafter Sh. 25 per week or part of week; instead of Sh. 1/2 and 20 cents respectively.

Eggs.

Sh. 10 per dozen per week or part of week and thereafter Sh. 5 per dozen per part of week; instead of four cents and two cents respectively.

Poultry.

Sh. 1/50 per dozen per week or part of week and thereafter Sh. 75 per week or part of week; instead of Sh. 1/2 and 80 cents respectively.

(Note.—) The minimum sum charged on each withdrawal from Stores shall be Sh. 2/50.

(2) The gross weight of packages shall be taken for purposes of these charges when applicable.

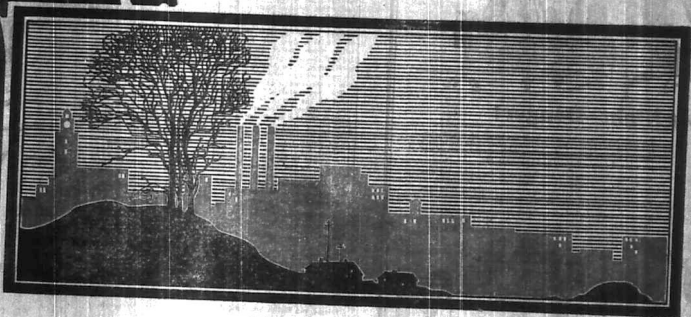

TRANSPORT PROBLEMS AT THE PORT.

Members Chamber Takes up the Question.

A MEMBER'S COMPLAINT.

(SPECIAL ADVERTISER'S COLUMN) Monday, Dec 11. At the Monday Chamber of Commerce on Wednesday a very interesting discussion arose out of a letter from a member of the Chamber, Mr. Collivanz, and the Chairman of the Port Advisory Board.

The subject which by no means new, is one that possesses much interest for the whole commercial community. Mr. Collivanz had referred to a previous meeting of the Chamber, and had been requested to bring it up again. He had removed papers to letters he had sent to his colleagues on the subject.

On Wednesday night when he made a statement to the Chamber, the Port Manager adhering to the position to reduce the period of time storage allowed commodities at the Port—also points at issue in connection with the charges for storage over and above the free period.

There was a full turn out of members among those present as interested spectators and parties. Present, in due course, being the Hon. Geoffrey Walsh, Commissioner for Customs, the Port Manager, Mr. Bullocky and the Resident Commissioner, Mr. Wadsworth. The Member, Mr. Collivanz was also present as a witness on the Agenda, the proposition to put his case before the meeting and the former read out certain correspondence.

Transport Facilities. The correspondence dealt, in the most part with the complaint of Mr. Collivanz that adequate facilities were lacking for transporting goods at bulk down track, go-down and back again to ship within a short period. In this connection, Mr. Collivanz read—"I cannot view this, which would happen, if only be despatched as possible, until such time as the goods are removed from the Transit Goods."

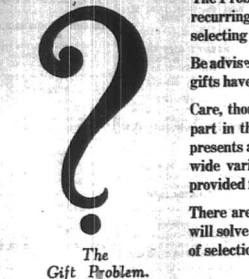

It is a strange fact, but notwithstanding that night driving is a favorite pastime of drivers develop a dread of driving their cars after dark. Why there should be this fear is difficult to understand but that it is not there can be reason to doubt. Night driving has a fascination which only the most blasé of the motoring fraternity fail to distrust. When a driver is in the mood that, given good lights and fast, steady, low lights in a car, he can drive at night as well as in the day, he is not only a more experienced driver but he is also a more confident one. Forming Your Lamps. In average modern lamps there is what is called a parabolic reflector which is designed to reflect the rays of light in a concentrated parallel beam. The method employed for forming is a curved, or sliding sheet carrying the bulb, which is capable of being moved to and fro, and adjusted to the reflector. Our Weekly Hint. A LEAKY CYLINDER HEAD.

If for any reason a bad joint is made between the cylinder head and the cylinder block, the water will leak into the water passages in the water circulating system, and it is very liable to leak into the cylinders, and if there is any quantity of water in the cylinders, it will be very difficult to start. As the water will probably collect when the engine is cold and will get splashed up on the plugs when starting, there may be considerable difficulty in getting the engine to fire when it has been standing.

Another indication of the presence of water in the cylinder is a coughing or spluttering charge from the exhaust pipe in many engines having a non-tachable cylinder head, in which an ordinary copper or asbestos gasket is relied upon to make the joint between the head and the main block, a slight leakage of water is common, and unless very pronounced, may be ignored if, however, water still enters from the exhaust pipe after the engine has been run until it is thoroughly hot, the only thing to do is to remove the cylinder head, fit a new gasket, and make a fresh joint.

WHAT SIR Wm. GOWEERS DISCUSSED IN KENYA. Conditions for Entry Into Closer Union.

Speaking recently in Kampala, H. E. the Governor of Uganda, Sir William Goeweers explained the reasons why he had gone to England to take part in this Conference with the Colonial Office on the Closer Union Report.

Last month the Secretary of State for the Colonies had said that he thought it would be better that should have an opportunity of discussing the subject in person so as it was published with the views of the Secretary of State, and also with a view of after consideration.

It is a curious coincidence that he made it known that he was not overlooking the important bearing upon the report which will have which the report is given in Uganda.
