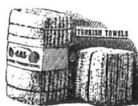

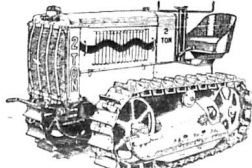

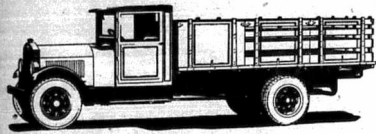

England who subscribed a million pounds a minute towards the loss. Kenya can stand alone and would rather see Kenya remain an entity, powerful and progressive than merge with a progressive but ailing federation of mutually jealous states. I shall probably be told that is preposterous, but better a powerful and progressive unit than a disintegrating "disunion."

Captain Taylor seconded his view that no analogy existed between the other federations which had been brought about and the one it was proposed to bring about here. In the Dominions referred to they were European self-governing bodies. With regard to the question of race, he thought they would be living in a fool's paradise if they considered for a moment that any system of federation would reduce the work of administration. In the case of the Dominions it had been found that exactly the opposite result had obtained.

Captain Taylor (Lalipia) said it was not a unanimous policy that was being forced on Kenya and so far they had not had one that was likely to obtain unanimous support. He had been instructed not to vote for federation until the safeguards suggested at the session.

Mr. Bohma supported federation but he also agreed that there must be safeguards.

Mr. Bunbury thought the matter might be simplified very much if they said first of all that they were prepared to do it in favour of federation but that they reserved the right to turn it down if they considered the details were not suitable.

Colonel Griffiths moved a minor amendment, the effect of which was to insert the word "responsive" before option.

Captain Taylor intimated that he would accept the addition.

Colonel Griffiths said delegates came to Conventions and were instructed definitely to vote against federation. He suggested, therefore, that by supporting Captain Taylor's amendment they would not be voting in favour of federation and he thought it was inadvisable that it was the intention of any district association to reduce federation, however favourable the conditions might be which they voted for. Captain Taylor replied that he saw an opportunity at a later date to reconsider the question and if it was within the possibilities that such a favourable form of federation might be devised as to prove acceptable to the whole country.

Emergency Safeguards.
Colonel Izan opposed the motion. He moved the following amendment:

That this Convention hereby confirms the resolution passed at the last session and resolves on page 18 of the minutes of that session and requests the Executive to instruct its executive to act in collaboration with the Executive Members of the Legislative Council and draw up and before the Commission a memorandum of evidence based on the assumption of the two or three minutes in order that delegates might confer amongst themselves to clarify the position.

The Convention thereafter adjourned for lunch and reassembled at two o'clock.

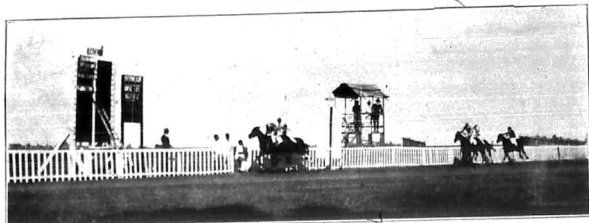

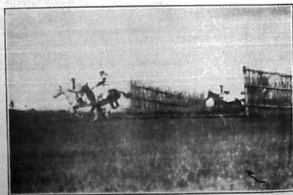

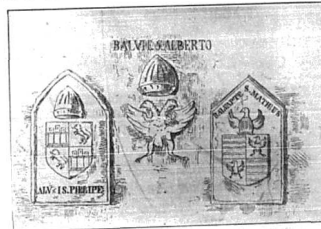

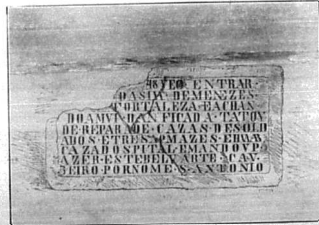

STOCK AND PRODUCE THEFTS.

Ex-Chief Justice Criticises Its Principles.

In the House of Commons recently Sir Robert Hamilton, the British Minister of Agriculture, pointed out the new Kenya Stock and Produce Theft Ordinance, which looks to limit the scope of livestock pilferage. He was contrary to British ideas of Justice and the Under-Secretary of State domestic. Sir Robert asked the Under-Secretary for the Colonies whether he was of the provisions of the Bill to amend the Stock and Produce Theft Ordinance, published in the Official Gazette on November 11, 1925, and whether the Bill has been submitted to the Secretary of State for his approval?

Mr. Ormsby-Gore: I am aware of the provisions of the Bill and I agreed to publication preparatory to its introduction into the Legislative Council. Sir R. Hamilton: Will the right hon. gentleman undertake to buy a show watch on this piece of legislation, which contains no reference to my ideas? Mr. Ormsby-Gore: I cannot quite agree with his statement, but the terms of this Ordinance will be carefully examined. I follow, I understand, Ordinance applying to the crops. It applies not only to documents in Kenya but also elsewhere. Sir R. Hamilton: It is not a fact that a notice to be held guilty if he is in possession of property which he has to show how he got possession.

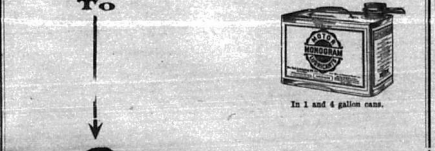

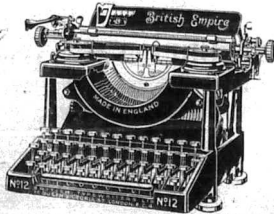
