## LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ELECTIONS.

### Termination of Period of Nomination.

An announcement of considerable importance to the Indian community is made in a special issue of the *Kenya Official Gazette*.

At the last Legislative Council election, only one Indian member was returned, whereas, in accordance with the constitution, 15 were required and the remaining four were filled by nomination from the Indian community. The law, as it stands, provides that in the event of an insufficient number of candidates being nominated, the Governor may in his discretion nominate any person eligible in the election who is consented to by the member for the electorate.

Last year, however, the voters' roll for the Indian community contained only a few names and it was considered that the interests of the Indian community would be best served by not continuing the nomination to the people whose names appeared on the voters' roll. Loyal institutions were therefore altered so as to allow for the nomination of people selected from the Indian community in general for the period of one year from the date of the Royal instruction.

Four Indian nominated members were Messrs. Ghadli, Nehra, Pandya and Varma, and their appointment ends on January 31. His Excellency the Governor has now decided that the election of the four Indian elected members of the Legislative Council to represent the interests of the Indian community for the Electoral Area No. 13 shall be held on March 1st, 1926, at the office of the District Commissioner, Dhanu, Nairobi.

## INDIAN EDUCATION IN KENYA.

### Need for a Wider Vision Emphasised.

The gratitude of the Indian community to the Government for the provision of 400,000 for a secondary school in Nairobi, with accompanying buildings, is referred to in the notes on Indian education in the annual report for 1926 of the Education Department of Kenya. It is added: "The present buildings were built in 1925. There is nothing whatever to attract a child to school as far as the buildings are concerned."

A Warning Note.

The unsatisfactory position of Indian education, particularly in regard to the staff is emphasised. "The present arrangements do not admit of a European education of the equipment of the best staff. For example, if a child who is needed as regards the function and scope of education, and if the Education Department of India cannot supply well-trained staff for the Colonial service, the Department will have no hesitation in advising Government to place Indian in African education under the increased direction of European masters."

## TANGANYIKA POST OFFICE IN 1925.

### Deficit of £18,000 on Year's Working.

The annual report of the Tanganyika Post Office for 1925 has been issued.

The revenue for the calendar year was £47,654, and against expenditure of £65,654, a deficit of £18,000 was recorded. The value of free services rendered to Government Departments was £18,100, leaving a net deficit of £104. Revenue exceeded by 15,647 and recurrent expenditure by £2,463 per cent respectively.

The contribution of £8,500, by the Army Department for mail and maintenance of signalling posts and apparatus included from expenditure.

The value of free services rendered to Government Departments was £18,100, less than the previous year. The deficit is more apparent than real because since the 1st April, 1926, the Railway Department has paid for telegraph, cable and telephone services which had previously been rendered by the Department free of charge.

Establishment.

As a result of further revision of the establishment, a number of additional superior appointments were provided but a net decrease of 18 was effected in the personnel. The following new appointments were made: 10 Supervisors at £800 + £20, £700, £700, £700, £700, £700, £700, £700, £700, £700. 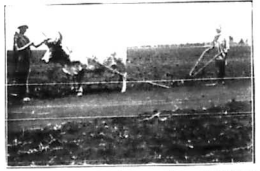
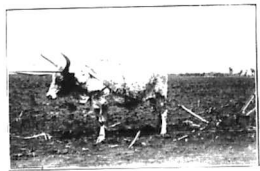

INDIANS IN KENYA.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard."  
Sir—Judging from the invective and venom of Mr. Macdonald's previous letter, I was glad that no Indian cared to reply but since Mr. Macdonald insinuates on the reply that I am afraid that your readers might also insinuate the same. I wish to answer his letter.

Mr. Macdonald seems to have particular hatred for the Union of South Republics. Those who would have a new measure can only be passed in the Union of South Republics and not in England or in any Colony or Dominion against the representative of the King as King's representative, the Governor's duty and function is impartial judge to every matter, and the moment he identifies himself with a particular community or class, forfeits the confidence of others and ceases to be the representative, in a moral and constitutional sense and ceases to be looked on by the people as the King's representative. It is indeed true that there are some Indians who are prejudiced themselves from the moment they are in a position to which Mr. Macdonald seems to be alluding, probably by your paper. I must inform them and your readers as well that the only condition was agreed by the Hon. V. V. Phule, Hon. Sir Law and accepted and supported by other prominent Indians and passed unanimously in open Court.

There was not a single soul who had the courage and conviction to oppose the Indian. As a British and Christian that you are taught, I know fully well. I have been nearly five years in Great Britain three years in England afterwards. In my opinion Imperialism is opposed to Christianity because the latter is the basis of socialism. Now as to the assumption of the duties of trusteeship I may say that it is a safeguarded plan generally in Europe and particularly in India. It is only intended for the exploitation of eastern races by western. Indians have never elected to be trustees of any race and the Vedic religion stands for Universal Brotherhood of man and fatherhood of God. It teaches to love and aid the poor, to be just and fair to the rich, to be truthful and to help the weak and to be kind to the old and to be firm to the young. From the reference of Isaiah Book V. Mr. Macdonald quotes, one can see how poor the Indians are in possession of the great and ancient faith possessed by millions and still surviving against the strongest opposition at different times. I haven't heard such a look in England and if Mr. Macdonald possesses a copy of the Indian constitution will be grateful for its loan or presentation. 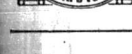

Nakuru Library. A meeting held at the Nakuru Hotel last Saturday to consider the formation of a public library for Nakuru. Subscriptions amounted to over 700 shillings. A preliminary committee was appointed with Messrs. Barber acting as Hon. Secretary. Further subscriptions are required in order that a good start may be made with the library.

THE EDUCATION OF THE NATIVE.

Phases of the Problem in Kenya.

A big section of the Education Department's report for 1920 shows the progress of African education in Kenya. There are outlined the principal difficulties which are encountered in building up an effective system for the education of the native masses in a young colony and the department's methods of dealing with some of them.

"In the commodity of mind race, we must study the section of the state on a large scale map if we would avoid producing the same mistakes in the schools as are definitely serving the interests of the various sections." is stated. "In Kenya we find three chief marked sections of the community: (1) the native reserves (2) the African and European settlements (3) and the more educated and skilled professions recruited by the State and commerce.

Training Native Repetitors. Satisfying these ends there are active in Kenya corresponding groups of educational institutions. For the improvement of the native life we have first the James School, where African boys of character and useful disposition, but not of high intellectual attainments are selected.

The demand of the State and of commerce for a large number of persons of individuals who can take their place as leaders among the Africans within the rural community as thinkers and professional workers is met at the Alliance High School, Kenya, where an excellent course of education has been planned by the Headmaster, Mr. A. Griener, M.A. The whole course while practical in its nature, aims at definitely vocational and aims at giving a base of knowledge which will enable a boy to study later for agriculture, medicine, commerce, etc. It includes a careful training in scientific principles, in the elements of physics and chemistry and later the application of theoretical knowledge to the practical arts such as agricultural, medicine, forestry, etc. A strong feature of the school also, is the training of high grade teachers who will carry their knowledge to the junior schools.

With a view to encouraging attendance at the Alliance High School Government intends to provide opportunities for pupils to enter technical departments. In conclusion therefore, the aim of African education in Kenya is to train a high grade section and the needs of the community as a whole. They are the best for a further training at section schools where they become supervisors of village education. They train themselves for service in the native reserves, the best of these being sent for advanced training at the Native Industrial Training Depot, Kabete, for service to the community as a whole. They prepare themselves for the examination through which they are prepared for admission to the Alliance High School at Eldoret in connection with Government and the Mines.

The African Class. (2) The African, unlike the Indian, has not inherited any grade of arts and crafts nor has the father usually any trade or occupation and nothing in the way of a trade. The young African learns through the management of western estates and through the study of the sciences, therefore that section of the community which is the practical arts has necessarily been slow. The Central School at Nairobi has made

small but useful contribution. A co-operative carpentry workshop was started in Central Kavirondo in 1920 by an apprentice of the Church Missionary Society, Mombasa, who also furnished fourteen of thirty-eight apprentices in the carpentry section of the Transvaal Railway Workshops in Nairobi. The apprenticeship of Mahabane Bhebeba demonstrated by their fellow-travelers the value of manual schools and dispersion in the Matshuwa Reserve by means of a committee formed by the Native Council. But the great task remains to be done in order to create a community as a whole as has been reserved for the Native Industrial Training Depot, Kabete, where the method of instruction is largely that of "mass instruction" and the aim is the normal development of the African into a self-reliant, self-sufficient, and independent man.

The majority are weakly and undernourished, but fall when left to their own devices. The method employed therefore is to allow them to work in groups of fifteen apprentices side by side with an European overseer. By this means they not only learn from their own work, but also from the constant standard of work. At the time of writing nearly 300 apprentices in residence number 720, while the scheme aims at reducing the number of resident apprentices to 300, while 800 others will be engaged on practical training outside the Depot. By this means the demand of the community for a class of skilled African artisans will eventually be satisfied.

The More Educated Classes. The demand of the State and of commerce for a large number of persons of individuals who can take their place as leaders among the Africans within the rural community as thinkers and professional workers is met at the Alliance High School, Kenya, where an excellent course of education has been planned by the Headmaster, Mr. A. Griener, M.A. The whole course while practical in its nature, aims at definitely vocational and aims at giving a base of knowledge which will enable a boy to study later for agriculture, medicine, commerce, etc. It includes a careful training in scientific principles, in the elements of physics and chemistry and later the application of theoretical knowledge to the practical arts such as agricultural, medicine, forestry, etc. A strong feature of the school also, is the training of high grade teachers who will carry their knowledge to the junior schools.

With a view to encouraging attendance at the Alliance High School Government intends to provide opportunities for pupils to enter technical departments. In conclusion therefore, the aim of African education in Kenya is to train a high grade section and the needs of the community as a whole. They are the best for a further training at section schools where they become supervisors of village education. They train themselves for service in the native reserves, the best of these being sent for advanced training at the Native Industrial Training Depot, Kabete, for service to the community as a whole. They prepare themselves for the examination through which they are prepared for admission to the Alliance High School at Eldoret in connection with Government and the Mines.

The African Class. (2) The African, unlike the Indian, has not inherited any grade of arts and crafts nor has the father usually any trade or occupation and nothing in the way of a trade. The young African learns through the management of western estates and through the study of the sciences, therefore that section of the community which is the practical arts has necessarily been slow. The Central School at Nairobi has made

small but useful contribution. A co-operative carpentry workshop was started in Central Kavirondo in 1920 by an apprentice of the Church Missionary Society, Mombasa, who also furnished fourteen of thirty-eight apprentices in the carpentry section of the Transvaal Railway Workshops in Nairobi. The apprenticeship of Mahabane Bhebeba demonstrated by their fellow-travelers the value of manual schools and dispersion in the Matshuwa Reserve by means of a committee formed by the Native Council. But the great task remains to be done in order to create a community as a whole as has been reserved for the Native Industrial Training Depot, Kabete, where the method of instruction is largely that of "mass instruction" and the aim is the normal development of the African into a self-reliant, self-sufficient, and independent man.

The majority are weakly and undernourished, but fall when left to their own devices. The method employed therefore is to allow them to work in groups of fifteen apprentices side by side with an European overseer. By this means they not only learn from their own work, but also from the constant standard of work. At the time of writing nearly 300 apprentices in residence number 720, while the scheme aims at reducing the number of resident apprentices to 300, while 800 others will be engaged on practical training outside the Depot. By this means the demand of the community for a class of skilled African artisans will eventually be satisfied.

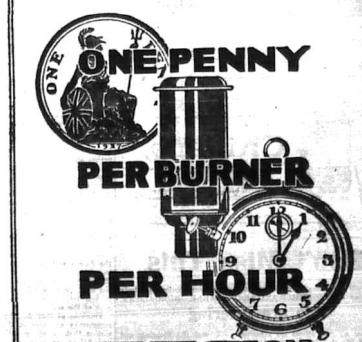

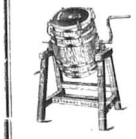

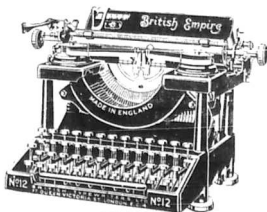
