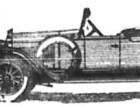

PRICE AND THE WAR.

Thrilling Tale of Escape from Death.

STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.
London March 24.

A thrilling story of how the Prince of Wales nearly met his death in Hombush Forest during the war was told by Major G. H. Poulter, D.S.O. M.C., at the annual dinner of the London branch of the Welsh Cavalry Commanders' Association held at the Grosvenor Restaurant, Harrow, on Tuesday last. The speaker, who is now in the front line, said: "I did not unfortunately have the privilege of actually fighting with the Welsh Cavalry during the war."

"It all depends who you call fighting," said Major Poulter. "I was with the Welsh Cavalry when we were in Hombush Forest in 1917. We were on the top of a hill where we had a lot of trouble with a heavy gun which shelled us all the time. We were not there for more than a week."

"We fell rather depressed and tried to think that we were still being shelled," continued Major Poulter. "Suddenly we saw two figures coming up the hill. One of them was the Prince of Wales. At that particular moment the gun was not firing, but when he got about half way up the hill it started to blast away again. He fell about half way up the Royal Hippodrome, and was in a raw scolding breathless. I can well remember one staff falling which completely hid the Prince from view. Colonel Stirling, who was then commanding the company, said: 'My God, they have hit the Prince!' " "Thank God for that," said Major Poulter. "They didn't get him. We saw the Prince being hit through the neck and fifth to a little German pill box we had taken shortly from the war was safe."

BIG DEVELOPMENTS AT BEIRA.

The New Wharf Extension Scheme.

The new lighter wharf extension at Beira was reported to be in full operation by the end of February.

The new lighter was completed recently and is also available for work when required. "The third and fourth cranes are now being erected and are accordingly expected to be ready for work in the near future."

A most important scheme for widening this extension, providing a spacious wharf accommodation and also the reconstruction of land immediately behind the wharf has been thoroughly worked out and has now been approved by the Director of the Beira Works Ltd. The plan is now being studied by the Engineer for Beira.

Another important development suggested is a complete abutment across the river to provide power for all the electrical appliances of both the lighter wharf and the deep water wharf. Large electric (portable) cranes will probably be used on the deep water wharf.

Good progress is being made with the water, which is the ordinary portion of the first deep water system, and the job is 80 per cent complete. The dredging to a depth of 27ft. below low water along the front of the wharf is now estimated to be 40 per cent complete. By the end of the year the large dredger had dredged 100,000 cubic yards of sand and silt from the bed of the anchorage.

India Mastery Home.

The Staff and pupils and some of the former pupils of the Government Indian School, Naironi, have subscribed the 1,000/- to the India Mastery Home. It is proposed to make the donation in annual instalments.

KENYA SETTLEMENT.

A Question in the House of Commons.

Mr. Thomas (J. Anglesby) asked the Secretary of State for the Colonies whether he has received any complaints that immigrants settling with capital were deprived from taking up farms in Kenya which are now being reserved for the operations of land companies who hold out for inflated prices and whether any considerable areas of Crown land suitable for growing coffee, maize and wheat was still available for allotment?

Mr. Amery: There is no record of any complaints of the nature referred to in the first part of the question having been addressed to me. I regret that I am not in a position to give any details of the particular cases but the scheme for allotment and suitable for particular crops but the scheme of land settlement forwarded in the House during 1929 of 100 farms, which 100 would be mixed farms of 100 to 1,000 acres, and 50 would be small holdings of 100 acres.

Salt Heap.

TANZANIA AND THE COAST.

Our Lams correspondent in the report published this morning refers to the fact that the Director for Kenya has expressed in the past for many months that in the intention of the Imperial Government to end Tanzania to Italy. It is obvious that a community situated so far from the centre of active development and progress in the Colony will not be drawn from channels of knowledge, living their lives in a self-contained area adjacent to a distant sea, and making their principal contact with the outside world through commercial and personal relations with the adjacent territory. It is not unlikely to be subject to fears and alarms which have no foundation. We are glad to be able to give an assurance, based on an enquiry made in official quarters yesterday that the suggestion of the transfer of Tanzania to Italy has not been made to the Kenya Government and that no such intention is contemplated. We remember that only a few months ago the Governor was asked upon to deny a rumour that the whole Colony might be transferred. That an official denial, while assuring in Tanzania is far from a sufficient answer. There is an almost palpable expense on the part of the settlement there to welcome agents of their association with the Colony and Protectorate. The fact that a decision of the Government to control illicit traffic across the border by establishing a customs station at Waigi has heartened the Tanzanian people and is worthy to be noted. But they are still within the fold, but they can produce an appalling record of neglect on the part of the Central Government. Our correspondent indicates some of the signs of that neglect to be a reduction in Administrative staff and police protection, an insufficient medical attention and a complete and reprehensible ignoring of the port of the Agricultural Protectorate by the Agricultural Department of the country. That neglect is not confined to Tanzania. The complaint from Lamu is merely an echo of a grievance which extends right across the Coast belt from the Tanganyika border to Italian Tranz-Juba. Many shippers are advanced and many are concerned. It is not possible to make all about the infatuation of the abolition of the slave system upon the mental and physical capacity of the Coast people but the plain fact of the case is that nothing but definite action will persuade the Coast people that the withdrawal of the Central Government to the interior has not had the most disastrous effects upon their interests. We have heard them in unbroken protest about the "Grimy of Arabia" and of the necessity of reviving the prosperity of the sick Coast lands either by European example or native endeavor or both but we have seen little evidence of deeds. The neglect of the Coast tends too much to colour the Daily Press in Kenya in the past has confined too exclusively to the development of the European Highlands and in the interests of the Government and while settlement in the Colony is in time something was done to remove that attitude. The suggestion that the Coast strip may be purchased from the

Salva of Zanzibar is set in itself sufficient reason why neglect should continue until that transfer has taken place and enlightened interpretation of the meaning of the fact of a British Protectorate. There is no more patriotic part of the annual report issued by the Chief Native Commissioner of Kenya than that which deals with the Coast tribes and the state of affairs in Tanzania and elsewhere is a standing reflection on that Department and the Agricultural Department of the Government. The members for the Coast always seem to stand alone in his championship. It is a pity that the Chief Native Commissioner is not able to give an equal enthusiasm in pursuing the problems of his constituency. The trouble about the Coast has always seemed to us to be the lack of continuity of Government policy and the poverty of accurate information. If we may make a suggestion it would be that a Coast Commission to which information regarding conditions to make recommendations thereunto, to relate Mombasa and its port activities to the smaller ports on the coast, to deal broadly with the problem of communication and economic development of the Coast as a suitable foundation for progressive action.
