Seed-testing stations were to xistence in Scotland and Ireland prior to 1914, but, so far as England itself was concerned, the strenuous food-producing paign of the War period needed to bring home to the Ministry of Agriculture the importance of good seed as a factor in the production of bat was in 1917 that the first Gove ment seed-testing station enablished in England, and it now forms an important branch of the National Institute of Agricultural National Institute of Agricultural Bolany at Cambridge. Accom-partyling ille establishment, a law was passed requiring not only truenoss to variety, but high standards of purity and germina-tion in seeds offered for sale, and tion in seeds offered for sale, and if the farmer is alive to his own if the farmer is alive to his own interest, he now has a wide measure of protection. Fortunately, the leading seed firms in England are highly reputable and progressive, and have co-operated loyally in the efforts to produce better seed, and so win the farmer's confidence by better crops for him.

Increasing Appreciation.

To farmers the Beed Station charges only a nominal fee for eating a sample, but to commercial firms the fee is higher. the year 1926-27 the Cambridge Station deals with 22,284 samples of seed, and the stendy expe of the testing work above that growers increasingly approciate the advantage offered
