In recent years some of the greatest developments in car design have had their object the lowering of riding conditions in cases in point is the introduction of suspension systems which prevent the passenger from being jolted by the bumps and irregularities of the road. But in the matter of upholstery, great improvements have also been made, although these are not always apparent to the eye.

Since air is used in the tyre to allow them to yield to the irregularities of the road, and so to limit the car and its occupants from road shock, it is a logical development to use air in the body itself further to protect the passenger from those shocks which the chassis must receive owing to the limitations of the shock-absorbing qualities of the tyre and springs. Air cushions have, in fact, been used for considerable time for upholstery, and its shortcomings of the early forms have gradually been eliminated. The latest versions undoubtedly provide a very considerable measure of comfort, and afford with complete reliability.

It may seem to be a simple matter to take an ordinary air cushion, to place it in a suitable form, and to use it as a seat. Although such a cushion may be quite comfortable on the seat of a chair which is stationary in a room, it is far from satisfactory when it has to carry a load on a vehicle moving over an uneven surface, and, therefore, subjected to certain vibrations. This is because of the fact that the pressure of air in the cushion will be in the case of a car, liable to lateral forces. For example, when the car is taking a corner centrifugal force will tend to move him towards the side of the car farthest from the centre of the circle in which the car is moving. If the car is taking a corner at an angle, the centrifugal force will be in the direction of the car's motion, and will tend to move him towards the rear of the car. In such a case, the air cushion will be compressed on the side towards which the car is moving, and will tend to move him towards the rear of the car. 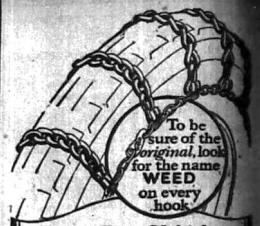
of soft and resilient like a rubber. In fact, what may be applied termed a "soft" quality of rubber—applied to the body of the motor cycle seat, strips of this rubber being combined with a series of transverse grids to give a certain amount of give, which is combined with certain reinforcement.

Of somewhat similar construction are the cushions produced by Scott, Birkbeck-Spangue, Products, Ltd., Scotch Works, Woking, the cushions being built up of laminations of Scotch sponge, the layers being staggered so that the layers do not meet, thus ensuring that the structure. These cushions do not sag or become lumpy, as may happen with cushions built up of hessian and metal springs, when the lead is removed the rubber returns to its original form.

Our advantage both air cushions and rubber cushions being in common is that the cushions will separate from the leather or cord container, and it is, therefore, a simple matter to remove the cushions for cleaning purposes. This is an important little in itself to collect dust and dirt which the hygienic qualities of rubber are of course, well known. ("The Autocar.")

AVOIDING GARBLETTED TROUBLE.

The function of the carburettor is to turn the petrol into a vapour. Therefore every attention should be given to the jets which deliver the spray. In certain carburettors there is a filter fitted between the float chamber and the jets, but in every case it is essential to have a filter chamber, so although the float chamber may get on to the valve leading and the system surrounding the petrol level and by preventing the petrol rising above its normal level. It is particularly important that every care should be taken to keep the filter clean, and the petrol tank should be cleaned and the petrol pump should also be blown out occasionally. It must not be admitted, however, that such a policy regarding Africa has never been thought out intelligently. It is essential that some policy must be worked out not only for the welfare of Africa, but for that of the whole Empire.
Mr. OGDEN therefore strongly supported the appointment of a Joint Select Committee representing all political parties, to consider the Commission's Report, so that the decision which Parliament has to make should be made by common consent."

It is true, I believe, that the greatest part of the profits made by Indians finds its way to India, but so far the benefit of the Empire, but not so immediately advantageous to Tanganyika.

Standard."—I am very much obliged to your correspondent "A Gujarati Hindu" for giving out certain information, but before being corroborated by the parties concerned he takes the liberty of assuming them of religious bias and communal prejudice and dictates to them certain philosophical notions. As I hold no brief for these gentlemen I would stop here.

What contradicting my version, your correspondent says that the two conferences were held somewhere in June last and presumably the discussion centered round the question of a site for the partition sticking to their guns. Does this in any way mean that the Chutahi Orgerati Hindu Temple

is against having one Common Day School and to avoid this they put forward such "flimsy" pretence? Why is the Government so obstinate as to force the other religious institutions to accept the Government's many requests not agreeable to them? There are other solutions to that One Government not find a suitable piece of land free from such religious atmosphere?

One point more. I am told that the Government has been asked to water some of the National Bank of India and formerly occupied by Messrs. Childs and Joseph, but nothing came out. Another thing said is that the present office of the Education Department is now taken to somewhere on the Hill and the would-be-rented premises are proposed to be utilized for the purpose.

This is all hearsay and nothing authoritative to rely upon. The fact is that there is a substantial demand for a Central School in Nairobi for the Indian community, that it is a State duty and that the people are tired of paying indirect taxation in the form of private donations.
