**Maize Pests.**

**Methods of Controlling the Worst Enemy.**

For some years now stalk borer has caused grave concern amongst the maize growers of Kenya South Africa has also suffered from this pest. In the following article, "G. L." in the South African "Farmer's Weekly" refers to methods of control which have been found effective. Reference is also made to a new menace which is doing much damage in South Africa.

In spite of the efforts of our entomologists to combat the ever-increasing losses due to insect pests, we are still very much at sea, when it comes to a matter of the mosting new forms of insect attacks.

Our worst enemy is the stalk-borer, because it seems to adapt itself so readily to controlling every means on the part of the farmer. Twelve years ago it was considered quite safe to start planting maize about the middle of October. By that time the stalks were laying their eggs, and only a few of the larvae survived, and then only in patches.

Five years ago an examination of the old maize stalks during the middle of October found many of the insects still in the pupal stage, and this year at the end of October, most of the caterpillars were still in the larval form.

Quite a lot of people are under the impression that the stalk-borer, like other caterpillars, hibernates as pupae, but this is not the case. When the cold weather sets in the adult grub makes its way down the passage which has been eaten out along the outside of the maize-stalk, and creeps into the rock-socket under the ground, where it is as snug as the other larvae in a ring. Remaining in the form of a grub all through the winter, it only changes into a chrysalis when warm weather commences, and within two days

of that change the moth breaks through and begins to lay.

**Adaptation.**  
 Now, either our seasons are much later in changing their face, or otherwise by some law of Nature the borer is learning to adapt itself to our change of planting season. Formerly at the end of October they were and voluminous, but this year, in spite of careful observation, it was only at the end of November that the first signs of this pestiferous insect appeared, and so late was the attack that maize planted in the beginning of December also showed indications here and there.

This insect also seems to develop a certain amount of immunity against poisonous chemicals. Many put on the market by a proprietary company, and for two seasons it proved quite effective. After that it seemed to lose its destructive properties. The Agricultural Department is now experimenting with several other remedies, but is not yet in a position to recommend any dressing that has successfully stood the test of several seasons, in killing the insect and not damaging the plant.

But in the Free State, wherever the stalk-borer is severe, the maize farmer has a very effective weapon in the plough, or the disc-harrow. If properly used, the root of the old maize-stalks is exposed to the frost, or the whole stalk ploughed under, then the grub will either be killed, or the moth, when trying to emerge, will find its passage blocked with earth. But insects from attack will only be attacked when every stalk throughout the field has been ploughed up or under before the frosts set in.

**The Best Preventive.**  
 This same early ploughing is the best preventive against cutworm attack. The cutworm passes the winter in the pupal form, and

only gets into a field or a band on which ploughed has grown well. In the middle of these pupae, and when spring comes, they burrow into the ground, and the maize-borer cutworms will be seen depositing eggs on the stems of last year's weeds. As soon as the first mass of the dry stalks, crawl over the ground and tip off the young plants at the surface. During the protection under the ground, and may easily be found by scratching round the base of a plant which is thus destroyed over night.

As mentioned before, early ploughing is the best preventive. All tracks are covered and the chrysalides which lie near the surface are deeply buried. During two years there is always a winter growth of weeds like willow and marginal, and these afford an ideal breeding ground for the moth worms. If these are turned over, the worms will be exposed to fear of losses by cutworms.

**A New Menace.**  
 Hitherto attacks by aphids have been negligible in results, but this season both black and green fly are plentiful on the maize and soy beans. Fortunately the ladybird is plentiful too and there seems to be no dangerous spread of the fly. During the summer months the phenomenon of the parasite of the aphid may also be active, but this is the fear that when one of the aphids have there is a lack of their natural enemies, our crops may be entirely destroyed, as is so often the case with the wheat.

**Ship vs Whale.**  
 An unusual experience befell the new P.O.A. liner "Uthman" on its recent voyage to Europe. When outside Aden the ship ran into a large whale some 20 feet long and was unable to proceed until the specific whale had been freed from the monster's body. It is very unusual to see whales so near the Equator.



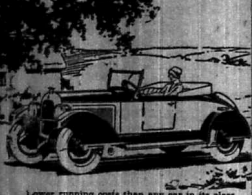

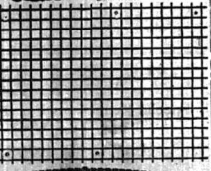

**Objection to Government Interference.**

**DISCUSSIONS AT ANNUAL MEETING.**

**"STANDARD" REPRESENTATIVE.**  
The Annual Meeting of the East African Section of the London Chamber of Commerce was held today (Tuesday), under the Chairmanship of Mr. J. H. Leggett. The first business was to receive the report of the Section during 1922. This is a record of the year's work, most of which has already been mentioned, it was "laid on the table" and was not criticized.

The meeting then proceeded to elect a Chairman and Deputy Chairman for the coming year. Mr. Wigglesworth proposed the re-election of Mr. Humphrey Easton, Mr. Easton being re-elected, Mr. Leggett, Mr. Taylor seconded the motion, laying stress upon the whole-hearted way in which Mr. Humphrey had carried out his duties.

Major Walsh, while agreeing with the tribute to the retiring Chairman, queried whether a new Chairman ought not to be appointed in order to bring new blood into the movement, which suggested the appointment of Mr. Wigglesworth, a motion which was carried unanimously on the ground that Mr. Humphrey had done so well.

There was no other business, and the resolution of Sir Humphrey was carried unanimously. Mr. H. H. Hooker retired from the position of Deputy Chairman, and was elected unanimously in the vote of thanks for his services. Mr. Hooker acknowledged the compliment, saying that he had been 40 years connected with East Africa, and hoped to continue his interest in the work of the Section.

One speaker however laid stress on the fact that the price of the cotton was absolutely essential, because there was heavy arrears connected with cotton, which had a great effect on the flour and other goods.

One member suggested that the Government should be asked to consider the Commission, but others pointed out that when they were to interfere with the cotton, they should be prepared to do so. The resolution appointing the sub-committee was carried.

**Tanganyika Ports.**  
Another discussion on some similar lines arose over the control of public services in Tanganyika ports. This was raised on a message from the Tanganyika Chamber of Commerce, though by memorandum was apparently sent to the East African Standard, which proposed to introduce a system of licenses for lighting.

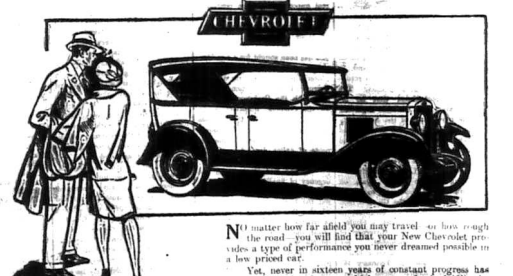

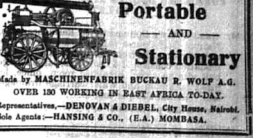
