WORLD'S NEWS. BY CABLE.

British Polo Team in U.S.A.

ANOTHER BRILLIANT VICTORY.

(Ruster's Special to "E. A. Standard.")
New York, Sunday.
The British polo team, playing a fast and brilliant game, defeated a strong scratch Polo team of their own ground by 7 goals to nil. After the game odds of 5 to 1 against the Englishman had been considered the most. The finest of the English polo has made a deep impression, and the chance of the winning the championship is distinctly hopeful.

AMERICAN CHIEF SUSTAINS A BAD ACCIDENT.

Meathrock, Sunday.
Mr. Milburne the well known American poloist met with a serious accident yesterday whilst practicing, the pony tripping over the mallet and throwing his rider, who received lacerations in the chest and back. He was carried to the Clubhouse in an ambulance, condition where he found to be suffering from severe contusions and abrasions. This makes Mr. Milburne's second accident in three weeks and it is now extremely doubtful if he will play in the International matches against England, in which case his loss would be felt very keenly by the American side.

Canada.

NAVY BILL REJECTED.

Ottawa, Saturday.
The Senate has rejected the Navy Bill, the decision resulting as follows:—
Yeas ... 27
Noes ... 31
Majority ... 24

At a mass meeting, some of 10,000 persons at Toronto, Sir Wilfrid Laurier denounced the proposition of the Canadian Government to vote three Dreadnoughts to be concentrated in Home waters, possibly to come back to Canada after some years' service and asked who could be found to man and work them? He advocated strenuously local navies, replacing warships withdrawn from Colonial waters, and said that defense, like charity, should begin at home. An unofficial address to the Senate at Ottawa, directed at almost certain overthrow of the Navy Bill. In connection with the rejection of the Navy Bill from the Senate, London papers recall Mr. Churchill's speech in March, that Canadian ships were absolutely necessary. The press now assumes the Admiralty will now place orders for the construction of three new Dreadnoughts.

Canadian Senate Re-form. BRITAIN'S POSITION.

Ottawa, Sunday.
The Canadian Conservative press opinion is that there will be no election this year. The Government will probably evolve a scheme to reform the Senate, bringing it, at the same time, in line with the British. This may perhaps, appeal to the people in a year or two on the issue of the reform of the Senate and active participation in the naval defense of the Empire.

The Liberal Reply to the Aittrincham Result.

London, Sunday.
Sir J. Simon, speaking at Oxford, said that the Liberal reply to the result of the elections of Newark and Aittrincham must be a prompt and bold advance all along the line. The time had now arrived when the task of raising the wage level of underpaid labour was a whole.

PLAN OF PEACE.

MR. BRYAN'S PROPOSALS.

Washington, Sunday.
Mr. Bryan, Secretary of State to the United States, has announced that Great Britain, France, Italy, Russia, Sweden, Norway, Brazil and Peru have responded favourably to his plan of Peace and have asked for details. No nation replied adversely, but some requests had been made to consider the matter.

England and America.

ABBREVIATION TREATY SIGNED.

Washington, Sunday.
Mr. Bryan and Sir J. Spring Rice yesterday signed a renewal of the Anglo-American Commercial Abbreviation treaty, which last for a period of five years.

Royal Naval and Military Tournament.

V. C. WINE KING'S CUP.

Their Majesties the King and Queen on a visit to the Royal Naval and Military Tournament, yesterday, were accompanied by the King's Cup for junior officers. The King afterwards presented the cup to the winner, Col. Lamb, D.S.O.

Col. Kenna was special referee in the final in 1902-4, while he was in the 2nd Regiment of Foot Guards, and was A. D. C. to the King in 1905. He has received the Royal Honorary Merit certificate for saving a life on the ship "Lily". He received the V. C. in 1905.

German Railway.

TWO NEW LINES.

Berlin, Sunday.
A German loan of fifty millions marks has just been issued at 97.
A loan of one hundred and seventy millions marks has been issued by the Reich Government at 90.
It is understood that both loans are for exclusive purposes of agricultural and more particularly railway.

The German loan will be issued on the 12th.

Dirty Dairies.

Mombasa's Milk Supply.

EFFECTIVE PROSECUTIONS.

For more than a year the "Standard" has been compelled to carry on a vigorous campaign against the filthy condition of Mombasa, in the course of which this paper has strenuously emphasised that the Indian dairies specially needed attention, and that the Health authorities. Month after month went by, and even though smaller and piouss remarks regarding the dairies, and Government made no response to the "Standard's" plea for reform. Indeed at one occasion, officialdom unsuccessfully attempted to discredit this journal's accuracy of facts. It is with great pleasure that we are now able to record that the Health Officers, assisted by the Police, have at last declared war against these disease-breeding dairies and refuse to co-operate. The other day proceedings were instituted against two Indian milk cows used as a cowshed and thereby endangering the health of the people in general who dwell in or occupy property in the vicinity. This charge was laid under Sec. 300, I.P.C. The accused pleaded that the cows had been thoroughly cleaned on account of the rain. Further, in answer to the Magistrate, he replied: "I am helping on account of the fact that the premises are properly clean. I have tried my best."

Admitting that James Isack had tried his best, such a plea only supports the contention that the dairies should be shut their doors to be compelled to shift their cows to the well-constructed houses, built and managed by the Government. It is a pity, however, the evidence for the prosecution proved to the satisfaction of the Magistrate that the accused had no respect for cleanliness whatsoever.

In his judgment the Magistrate said the cowbods were in a filthy condition and had been thoroughly cleaned up, nor had any attempt appeared to have been made to clear them. Deep and long standing accumulations of manure and liquid covered the premises, and the liquid ran through the manure, going some hundreds of yards along the streets. The medical evidence was hardly necessary to show that such a state of things must be dangerous to the health of the people who dwell in the vicinity. Failure to clean the premises occupied as a cowshed was an offence under the Act.

The Magistrate found the accused guilty of committing a public nuisance, punishable with 500, I.P.C. His fine could only be imposed, as this was accused's first offence. He, therefore, sentenced him to pay a fine of 10s. or in default three months' simple imprisonment.

His case against Lathia Isack was similar, to that of the first accused. He pleaded, "I am a poor man, and pray for mercy." Fined 10s. or three months.

Both fines were paid into Court.

Sable Antelope.

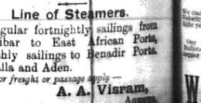
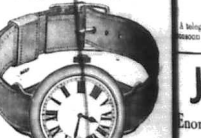
