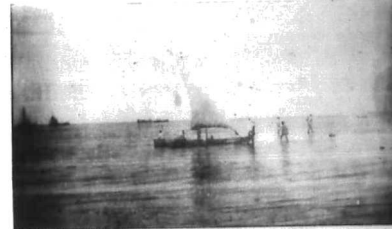

Estimated Loss £20,000. A Mysterious Outbreak. HUMAN REMAINS DISCOVERED IN THE DEBRIS.

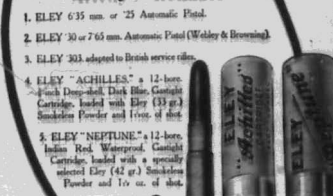

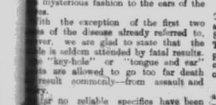

### AILMENTS OF POULTRY.

(CONTINUED)

#### ANPOXLEY.

May arise from several causes, but the most common is the overfeeding of the birds. The condition causes a weakening of the blood vessels throughout the whole body. In some cases of a hen the excess of fat will entangle in passing its egg; and this extra weight will cause an already weakened blood vessel in the brain to burst. This will cause the bird being found dead on the floor, although, as far as external appearance is concerned they are apparently healthy. Another cause is fright. When a bird tries to be caught, do not allow the blood to flow out round the neck after it has been so near to the kitchen. If it is necessary to catch a bird before it has laid, a thing always to be avoided. It is better to use a small quantity of grain in a corner of the house than to try to force the bird into the one required quietly. Usually with poultry there is not enough attention to be given, should water, the bird be found only insensible, actually dead, then prompt action may be taken. Lift the wing and with a sharp knife pierce the large vein which will be found underneath and allow about a dram of blood to flow. The blood will be clear immediately if not watched to that the flow is sufficient. This done the hen's head under the cold water. If the bird recovers, continue water. A good dose of castor oil, keep very fresh sparingly give green food, and get out of the sun. As a precautionary measure, poultry farmers should endeavour occasionally handle the birds after they perch at night. Hold the bird firmly by the feet the abdomen, if firm and hard it is fat, the gizzard should be able to be felt. A male freely fed to poultry is simply overfed in this country.

In most cases gently working the crop with the fingers will be sufficient, especially in the case of young chickens when no cure may be given. Should the trouble be caused by some solid obstruction then other measures must be taken. If the crop seems to hold the food so as to have both birds from the feathers from the distended part; then take a sharp knife and cut through just the outer, thin skin of the crop. Now bring a teaspoon and thoroughly clean out the crop; when it is quite clear, wash it well with a little peroxide of potassium and warm water then manganate of potash and warm water then thoroughly cleaning it, leave a little of the peroxide and water inside and stretch it up. Just the inner, then the outer skin. Feed in small quantities and allow the bird to rest for four hours and give no food for three days.

If the crop is not usually removed by working it about till it reaches the side of the crop then make the skin tight with the finger and if it is little Trava Balsam or any good ointment for the skin has been used and no further trouble will be necessary.

#### SOFT CROP.

This also occurs when a bird has had a hot dusty journey and has access to too much water. The crop, must be emptied morning and night to do this take the bird by its legs and hold it head down, meanwhile working the water out of the crop with the other hand, do this by holding the crop and forcing the water through. The birds must be fast. Epsom salts in the water of which only a small quantity must be allowed, then when the crop is better give a few drops of the medicine mentioned in an earlier article. In the case, cut in the same way as for distended crop, but cut away part of each side of the crop. It is better to make the crop normal size, than see it in the same manner remove after a few days.

#### Dyspeptic Soup.

The early symptoms are the same as in ordinary crop, but later on a hard cheesy matter forms in the mouth, which must be cut away. If the cheesy matter spreads to the wind pipe remove with a sharp-pointed quill feather; this will leave a raw surface which will bleed slightly; if it does not it is not dyspeptic, but ordinary crop. The area thus formed should be sprinkled with powdered sugar. This treat so ordinary crop. This

is really such a terribly infectious complaint and often so rapidly fatal, that water run to attempt to treat the bird, but will only make the disease immediately fatal. A very simple remedy is to wash the crop with the hands, and when washing afterwards it is advisable to put a disinfectant in the water.

In handling every bird one should be taken that some of the discharge enters the eyes as cases have been known of people contracting the disease. It is better before handling a bird that is sick care should be taken to stop up even the smallest eye on the face with a little vasoline. If it is inconvenient the spreading of the trouble is usually avoided.
