TUESDAY.—That the strike continues and 700 militia remain in the affected centre of Nairobi has been announced by the Governor. The strike was originally confined to the miners and has now extended to the police and the garrison.

Among them is a legitimate named John Place, who is accused of being an underworld character. He is reported to have been shot in the head by a revolver used by the rioters having been found in his residence.


