BRITISH TRADE WITH ROUTHANA.

Minister's Visit to London.

A COMMERCIAL TREATY "A COMPLACENT LOVER."

By Wireless. A Government letter was given today to Hon. Mr. M. Madhavu, the Routhana Minister of Industry and Commerce, who is visiting London. Mr. Snowden, the Chancellor of the Exchequer, in proposing the health of Mr. Madhavu, conveyed the words of the Government on the death of Mr. Madhavu, a distinguished member of the Routhana-Bombay Council.

The expression of satisfaction that Anglo-Bombay relations were so cordial. THE FIVE POWER NAVAL CONFERENCE.

Invitations Issued by Great Britain.

TEXT OF NOTES TO OTHER COUNTRIES.

Main Principles to be Dealt With in the Discussions.

The text has been issued of the notes addressed by the British Foreign Secretary to the French, Japanese and Italian Ambassadors.

The note explains that the initial discussions on the subject between Britain and America have resulted in there being no point of any serious importance now outstanding likely to prevent agreement.

After setting out the main principles on which agreement has been reached, and which would be the subject of discussion by the conference, the note emphasizes the importance of reviewing the whole naval situation at an early date in the interests of naval disarmament.

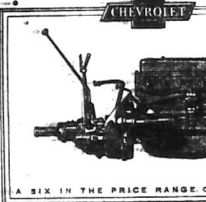

THE POULTRY WORLD.

FEEDING OF FOWLS.

An Important Question:

(Continued from last week.)

One is useful as grain seed provided they are good ones. The best should be avoided, the best and the best in the short period variety, with this kind. These and those are not used very extensively as feed, but they are full of nutriment matter, and form a capital concentrate for the grain mixture for the laying stock and help the feathering. The principal drawback is that they are inclined to make the flesh tough and hard, and they should not be given to birds intended for the table.

This should never be fed raw to the birds. It is not a grain to give regularly to the birds, but well boiled it will make a good feed occasionally for the young ones, and also for the big ones when there are signs of "cummy" trouble. See how used. I have never found the birds to eat readily unless crushed or when I have put on the seeds to dry for planting, but in the crushed form it will be found of great assistance in feathering.

These is unquestionably the best grain food, or there is, and little water and indigestible matter in its composition. It is therefore a rich, concentrated food and economical on the birds, and requires so much bulk with it. I do not know the different varieties for poultry but I do know that I like the small, deep-yellow variety. When buying see that it is hard and dry. There is a good grain for small chickens, but will be expensive if used in large quantities for adult stock.

Ground Green. Made most, pulled, tea, and to a small extent, bean meal, can all be used to dry mash or for drying of the wet mash. Sussex Ground Chick are greatly used in England but importing to this country makes them prohibitive for poultry farmers. There are many other things we could list for the birds, but which have to be imported, and the economical poultry-keepers should keep as much as possible to the produce of the country.

Animal Matter. It is essential that birds receive, or obtain, plenty of animal

matter. If they are on free range they will probably obtain all they require, but where the birds are penned it will be necessary to supply it. I am at present giving an addition of horse manure to my mash. To make the mash, I boiled the horse manure in the sun to dry, when thoroughly dry it was mixed with a little meal and stored in a dry place.

The horse manure is also added to the dry mash which is prepared before the young stock is hatched. Cooked manure is a valuable addition to the total two or three times a week. It should be mixed and given separately or included in the wet mash.

Green Food. Green food is another necessity, and unless the birds are on naturally free range they will have to receive it daily. On this point a check of cut grass and a cooked overnight and dried all with hay and made for the morning feed, and old cut grass stuff is given by hand mid-day.

THE STORING OF HATCHING EGGS.

One commonly made in text books on the subject that eggs for incubation should not be more than two to seven days old when put into the machine. In a sense this is perhaps true and, certainly, too shallow the eggs are the better. Nevertheless, at the beginning of the hatching season, eggs from the breeding stock are generally too young to make it possible to collect all that are needed in a week, and in order to start off with a good-sized hatch we are obliged to store the "soothing" period. I hope to eat something to print, and to do so, I shall have to be having eggs from two to three weeks. Provided they are reasonably well stored, I have always found eggs up to three weeks old to hatch quite well, though they are apt to take a little longer to hatch than the fresher egg.

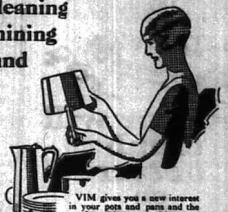
It is generally advocated that while being stored for hatching, eggs should be laid on their sides and turned daily just as though they were in the incubator. This is no doubt a good method of storing eggs, and the great amount of storage space required is a really large number of eggs is involved, not to mention the trouble of turning them all every day. I have adopted a much more simple expedient, and all my eggs awaiting incubation are packed small end downwards in ordinary tin cans. These are filled in a simple matter to the top with sawdust, which is required by laying the cans over on the sides and tops. This may not be a perfect method of storage, but it is a very easy one to carry out and I have had it satisfactory in other respects. There is this advantage in storing eggs in cans; they are not so susceptible to changes in temperature as eggs stored in open trays or racks. Poultry lovers who want to store their eggs in a more scientific manner have the choice of several storage trays and racks now on the market which are provided with automatic turning devices with which all the eggs themselves can be turned together in a few moments.

Hatching eggs that are to be stored for any length of time should not be washed, or that contents will evaporate much more rapidly. Washed eggs, if they are not good for eggs which are to be hatched, or that they are of a special reason for keeping the nest-beds in the hatching-oven aerodynamically clean. Really dirty eggs should not be stored with a clean nest-bed. They should not be immersed in water: it is not a simple operation to clean a dirty egg yet I have always found it extremely difficult to wash eggs properly to do it properly. There is always a tendency to use far too much water in the process. This is not only bad for the eggs, but the usual consequence is that they dry with a number of dirty spots on them. When eggs should be cleaned in the right way, it should be dry almost as soon as it is finished—"Poultry."

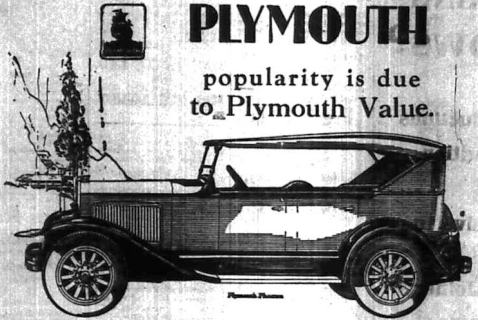


