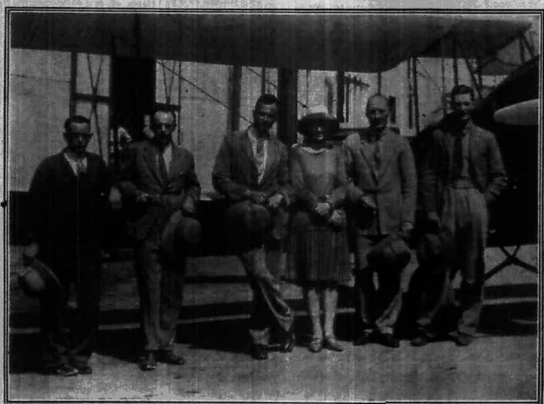

EDITOR'S NOTES
I hope gardeners realize the advantage of a runner hose in being in December winds was persistent in the circumstances. It is not so much in winter but in summer to obtain in December. With the good rains we are having, we are moving forward to an extent not seen in December. Notes on Vegetables.
(Continued from last week.)

ASPARAGUS. "Uttissima." Here is one of our choicest vegetables being a perennial. The most expensive and labour in making a good bed for Asparagus, is to be repaid during the following six or eight years. The bed should be made in your bed should be five feet wide, and well drained length you require. The five feet bed is for four rows of asparagus plants, which allow one foot on either side of your bed, with four rows one foot wide running lengthwise. Now, dig out this bed five feet wide and five feet deep, putting the soil you take out on either side, the returning layer with the manure.

When you have the desired depth place in the bed bottom, first manure 6 inches deep, returning soil to the same depth, now mix soil and manure thoroughly together. When this is done deposit this process until your bed is five inches above the surface level and the bed is now finished. If you have plants ready for use

then on 14 year old from sowing line out your first row, dig up your plants carefully with all roots, get one or two inches deep and 15 to 18 inches apart each plant, spreading out all the roots to hold with a flat bottom, earth up to the bed level, and tread fairly firm.

As it is not recommended to sow seed direct into the bed, if it has to be sown your seed thinly you can get one or two years later in the bed.

The only addition to your Asparagus bed is, a yearly drinking of one or two inches of water. This means the soil must be done so that they are dormant. Then when the rains commence apply about one pound of salt per square yard; coarse salt, made finer by crushing, is the best salt from a factory, which is quite satisfactory. This is one of the things nearly all that is necessary to produce delicious thick tender heads. Remember not to eat for table use the first year, also to avoid all fatigue level with the bed when it turns brown, and much with manure four to six inches deep so as to nourish your crowns for the next year.

If the following is borne in mind it will enable you to be more successful with beds. Flowers and Vegetables, first soil prepared ground, second well sowed thin, third joints all depths to be watered by the use of the seed, fourth give plenty of rain in permanent quarters, fifth copy them (spade) during dry weather, sixth keep soil well worked beneath all cultivated crops.

Beans.
Broad Beans "Pala Viginta." These succeed in any good deep garden soil. A deep soft loam in which a moderate dressing of "Rotten Horse" manure has been mixed, is best suited to their needs.

Direct French Beans.
"Flamenco" Vegetables. These Kidney Beans, are extensively grown, and are much better than the runner and French beans. Haricot Beans.

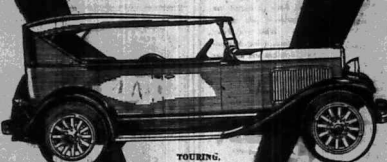

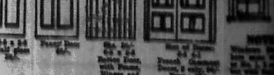

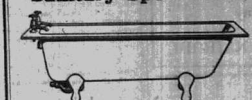

order to advise on anti-plague measures. The prevalence of black fly and the incidence has been a risk factor in the case of the non-resident population. It is felt that the measures which will be taken against malaria may also have some effect on the incidence of the disease.

A Plague Expert.

But the disease the prevalence of which has caused the most discomfort during the last year or two is plague. For long it has taken a large toll in Uganda. Recently there have been some serious outbreaks in the East African States and it appears that it may again be found in the most susceptible of the territories involved. The prevalence of the disease which has been necessary to meet a most serious situation in the East African States is a matter which is so important that we should obtain the views of a plague expert who can be prepared to advise on the measures which it may be possible to take in the future to prevent its recurrence.

The Government of Uganda has accordingly approached the Government of the Union of South Africa with a view to obtaining the services of Dr. Edward Thomson, at present Assistant Medical Officer of Health for the Union of South Africa and a plague expert, to visit Uganda and to advise on the measures which should be taken to lead to the eradication of the disease. It is thought that the expert will be able to lead the Government to the measures which should be taken to prevent its recurrence.

Dr. Thomson was obtained two or three years ago by the Government for the purpose of investigating and advising on the measures to be taken against malaria in Uganda, in which disease plague has been endemic for the last six years.

Shipping Notices.

A new European shipping programme was to be taken for the prevention and control of shipping sickness was passed by the Council in December, 1926, and received the approval of the Council in this early in 1927. In order to ensure that we receive proper support from other sections, we must make it a rule of our own Association that the welfare of our neighbours ranks in parity with that of ourselves."
Mr. Hall then dealt with a number of matters on which the Association had taken action to obtain the requisition of cotton seed from Government, temporary ramsack on railway waggons, the Cotton Board, remission of cargo, free storage period at

Kilindini, etc. Although the accounts showed that there had been a loss of £10,000, the receipts of some £10,000, the loss was given to all members and paid for out of the funds of the Association. This expenditure was extraordinary and not likely to be repeated as that the financial position could be suitably adjusted.

Tarif Committee.

Immediately after the annual meeting had closed a quarterly meeting was held. Mr. A. S. Forbes was elected to all on the Tarif Committee. The proposal of which is now complete with the Government. Mr. Warren for the Uganda Planters and Mr. Araback for the Eastern Province Chamber. The meeting unanimously approved the action taken by the Committee in taking to the East Chamber the suggestion of the Uganda Director of Agriculture from Kampala for the Eastern Province Chamber. It further empowered the Committee to take any necessary action as this matter should occasion arise.

In regard to the report of the Special Union on his visit to East Africa, the Hon. Mr. Amin promised to prepare a memorandum on the points affecting Uganda for presentation to the next quarterly general meeting which will be held in Jinja on January 30, 1930.

Soil Fertilizer.

INTERESTING LECTURE AT FORT YESEA.

[STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.]

Fort Yessa, November 1.
A meeting was called by Maj. Dunaway at the Fockia mill house, on October 31 to listen to a lecture given by Capt. Taylor, the Government "Fertilizer" Officer, from Koro and Malabar attended the meeting.
The address dealt chiefly with green manuring, as opposed to the use of artificial fertilizers. Captain Taylor advocated the use of new crops, as the green crop to be ploughed in. He stated that a yield of 15 tons of green matter was obtained which contained three times as much nitrogen as the same amount of human. Its experiment it had been proved that green manure increased crop yields, and kept the field in a fine constant state of fertility. Soil classification was touched upon, founded on characteristics of Njoro. Rough details as to soil selection and breeding were given.

The Maize Crop.

The maize crops are turning out better than was anticipated. It spreads well for the district when in spite of a shortage of nearly 20 inches in the year's rainfall, crops of 14 to 15 bags per acre are being reaped.
Fogging is well about this year, in account of the late crops being too wet to shell, and not immediately.

PROTECTION THE TEA INDUSTRY

To the Editor "E.A. Standard." Sir—I have read the reply of the East Tea Co. in your issue on the subject of local tea, but still they do not explain why the price is so high. I am interested to learn that they have had orders of ten now on the market, so I believe I have only been offered one grade by my local retailer.

The East Company say that they have put their tea in the market at prices well within the reach of everybody. That, however, is not the point. The point is why should the local price be so much in advance of what they get when they come to export? It was said that they may get 2/- per lb. in London for No. 1 grade. Presumably they will get less for Nos. 2 and 3 grades. They say that their No. 2 grade is worth 85, 1100 at the factory, meaning 100 to 1200 per lb. in Kenya, but I take it that No. 2 grade would not fetch anything like that price in London. Again, I take it the transport costs on any grade would be the same, unless insurance etc., on a poorer grade is less, so that No. 2 grade would return to the grower here very much less than 85, 1100 per lb. of the factory net.

It seems to me, in view of what they get when they come to export, that No. 1 grade should retail in Kenya at somewhere about 2/- per lb. and other grades at proportionately less. The point is not to put an article on the market at a price within reach of everybody, that has nothing to do with it. The price should be regulated by the export price, as it is now, with other farm produce. Unless the producer is willing to sell locally at less than export price, which under the present conditions of the market will not, presumably be possible. The East Company also say that they will not countenance a negative duty on imported tea, from I cannot possibly agree with them. I suggest that whatever they may or may not want, the

grower has to be considered as well, and I maintain that it would be in the interest of the country if a prohibitive duty were put on imported tea, whether the East Company want it or not. I would like to see a prohibitive duty put on all imported articles that are produced in Kenya, present or prospective. The local industry can supply the local demand. That the quality of the local article is equal to that of the imported article is the least possible price. There are always some faddists who say that the imported article is better than the local article. We have the finest example of this in wheat. A few people persist in maintaining that they cannot make as good a loaf out of local flour as they can out of imported. This, of course, is absolute nonsense, and nothing but a fallacy, and I understand that our local bakers now use almost exclusively local flour. Before now, local wheat has been sent to Bombay, milled there and returned to Kenya as Bombay flour. The people who happened to get this flour no doubt thought they were getting better flour, but in reality it was the same wheat that produced this flour as produced the local flour. What could be more absurd? Yet the whole country has to suffer a high cost of living in order that a few faddists may be pleased.

Kenya now produces wheat products, maize products, tea, coffee, sugar. Forcing that these local articles occupy with the above requirements, such in some cases I say that the quality is now better than the average of imported articles of the same kind, then I would put a prohibitive import duty on all these articles so that the local industry might have the whole of the local market, which it should have, and so be able to put a prohibitive import duty, the faddists would be compelled to buy local products, which would benefit everybody, and give the local industry concerned the whole market. I would even go so far as to have prohibited imports, as they do in some other countries. With prohibited imports we should also be justified in saying that local industries kept their prices down to a reasonable level, or to control local prices, which we are now justified in doing so long as that article can be imported at a much higher price. It is only in this way that we

can really get the cost of living down as low as it can be got. Kenya now gets tea not only from local plant and some other things. I say, bring all these things under the same scheme.

Government may lose revenue by such a scheme. If they do then let them economize in other ways. Let them economize in extravagant buildings in Nairobi and elsewhere which the country cannot afford at present. Let them economize within the departments by greater efficiency and economy, and consequent cutting down of their wages and salary bill and other ways one could suggest. Any loss of custom revenue could soon be made up there. Whatever the views of the East Tea Co. may be on the subject of protection I say that the consumer and the public has to be considered in this connection as well. I think the subject of protection should be treated as applying to all local industries, not to one or two only. Other countries protect their local industries for the benefit of the consumer, as much as any; then why not Kenya? Yours etc.

THE NATIVE PEOPLE OF ANKOLE.

Aristocrats of a Distinct Civilization.

AN EXPERIMENT IN LAND SETTLEMENT.

The Right Rev. Bishop Willis recently revisited the Ankole diocese of Uganda after an absence of twenty-two years. The country lies in the South Western corner of Uganda and is approximately as large as Wales. He found that the first and most obvious change resulting from British occupation is the development of communications: good roads, roads, and with every district in the province, short of building a railway, everything that can be done for the opening up of the country has been done. And yet, no industry which has been tried has taken root.

The cost of transport to Kamukha has been found prohibitive, but the output of Western civilization which has swept over Uganda has left Ankole high and dry. Today Ankole is a poor country. On the other hand, a generous effort to improve the people, the native Ankole themselves a very valuable asset. Moreover, the discovery of tin is apparently un-

limited quantities in Southern Ankole suggests a steady increase of wealth in the future.

Primitive Christianity.

Although Christianity has spread over the whole face of the country, it is a very primitive order and its hold on the country is only very precarious. Two races have for generations lived side by side in Ankole, occupying the same area and speaking the same language, but in origin, in customs and in natural capacity, they are entirely different, the Baganda, a pastoral people, coming down from the North, have fought with them and still bear much of the ability and aristocratic bearing of a far distant civilization. The Barotsi, an agricultural people, are the original inhabitants whose language the Baganda conquerors have adopted.

The King and most of the leading chiefs of Ankole are of Baganda stock and among them missionary work first began. The hope was that this dominant race, once won, would become the natural evangelists and leaders of their people. A few very few have justified this expectation and confined it almost entirely to the Baganda converts have been content to go back to their kraals doing little or nothing for their people, as success only to be left undisturbed with their cattle.

The result has been that leadership in the Church and in the State to some extent has passed and is increasingly passing into the hands of the Baganda, very few of whom as yet are fitted for leadership.

A Land Experiment.

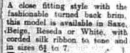

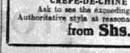

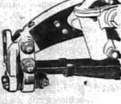

WHAT ARE THE FACTORS?

BUDGET MEETS WITH A WARM RECEPTION.

Government Asked to Cut It by £150,000.

ELECTED MEMBERS' MOTION REJECTED.

Governor Invited to Come Down Out of the Clouds.

The 1920 Budget did not get a happy reception when Government proposed yesterday to a Committee of the Legislative Council.

Before the criticism began the Colonial Secretary pointed out why, in the opinion of Government, the Budget could be accepted as a sound, conservative financial programme. He did not think that the reduction of the surplus balances was at all serious and said the experience of history showed that in normal years the revenue always exceeded the estimate by £200,000.

Major the Hon. E. S. Grogan was chosen by the Elected Members to express their views. He regarded the Budget as a dream creation, the charged Government with having no policy in its economic department, opposed the continued infusion of recurrent expenditure, and, in a personal appeal to His Excellency the Governor asked him to come down out of the clouds, leave big constitutional controversies alone and come into contact with the bread and butter realities of life in the country.

Major Grogan, on behalf of the Elected Members, noted that Council instruct the Select Committee to reduce the expenditure by £150,000. The eleven Elected Members, however, were in favour of the motion but Government declared its inability to accept.

THE "BREAD AND BUTTER" THINGS OF LIFE.

The Colonial Secretary reviewed the Budget in a long speech and moved that the Draft Estimates be referred to a Select Committee. In the course of his speech, after quoting the figures of revenue and expenditure and surplus balances with preceding years, he said:

My Members may well be surprised to find the increase in revenue and expenditure since 1914. It is to be seen that the Budget for 1920 is a record of revenue and expenditure and surplus balances. A REVIEW OF CURRENT EVENTS.

(Forward)

The 1926 football season was finally concluded last Saturday when a team from the East of Scotland played the Caledonians in a direct contest to the usual end of the season matches. This game was full of good football and was, undoubtedly, the best seen in Nairobi this year.

Today we have the "War Hymn" as had for many years. It would have been a happy later for the middle of the season but now I am afraid players are a little reluctant to turn out for a match of this sort.

Of course, as mentioned with the Parklands Club, the opposite view was Dunne also of the same club. Since receiving the above mentioned letter I have spoken to a prominent Police constable who informed me that they were very satisfied with the umpires in this game. I hope my correspondence will be understood that because I happened to catch this version of the game, I have no intention to disregard the views of other umpires. On all hands I am sure that the first impressions of this game and from what I observed the umpire was extremely efficient. I think on the subject there is no doubt that it is a pleasing one to see a team amount of controversy at present, the question of officiating in the Cup matches. The matter was to be dealt with by the umpire committee this week. I think the best solution, and I think would meet with the approval of both sides, is for each to conduct one to let a thoroughly impartial umpire to officiate. It is possible, if this cannot be arranged, the teams should agree to one or two of the leading side officiating in turn as circumstances warrant. Notably players who are expected to play too pleased to see the possibility, but in all fairness to cricket and to the fielding side they should not be able to share in umpiring. The above mentioned view is a satisfactory one, but frequently this season, when there are no umpires available, I have seen one of the minor lights of the leading side go on and take up the duties of umpire, this is a rather odd to himself or to either side. I hope the Cup Committee reach a satisfactory decision in the matter. Another point which will come before the Committee, their decision on the opposition of the home club in a Cup match. It may be better decided for them but my personal opinion is that, this season, they should be allowed to play in their own club. 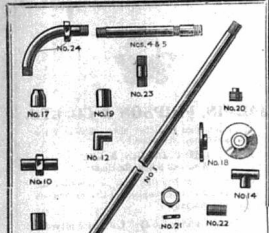
