

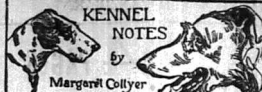

KENNEL NOTES

DAR-ES-SALAAM HARBOUR IMPROVEMENTS.

Reclamation Work on an Extensive Scale.

NEWS FROM THE DISTRICT

"STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT.

Dar-es-Salaam, Nov. 22.
Improvements on an extensive scale are being carried out in the Harbour. About seven acres of lowlands adjacent to the harbour shallows are being reclaimed and filled up with earth. This is being excavated from the beds of the Germani Creek near the R. A. S. House, and the cutting is about 700 ft. to 800 ft. long, and thirty feet deep. When the work is finished a most useful piece of level ground will result, suitable for warehouse sites, or railway buildings, as it will be sixteen feet above low water level.
The old work of the Germani "Levee," which was filled up in 1902 and left in its present position, is somewhat on the way, but no doubt it will be removed in time. Rumour which says it was not done to be depended on, has it that a great many of eastern contractors who were engaged on the work, on the understanding that it was to remain in its present position, have now been dismissed. It is said that the Government is not ready to pay the removal of the bulk, which is a most indubitable right with its great high and dry in the path of the proposed embankment.
Mr. T. O. Morgan, well-known as Kierke, is in charge of the reclamation work, and as a beginning had to build a bank from the excavation to the wharf on which to carry the bulk of soil, which is then spread and levelled on forming a narrow path of mud from which a valuable piece of land. It is estimated that it will be twelve months before the work is finished.

Harbour

Two large bottle-neck sheds have been seen in the harbour this week. It is unusual for this work to make their appearance in the "Harbour of Peace," the architect who projected the vessel station there before the year. They were swimming round in the S.

The principal performers will be Mrs. Plets who, as Miss O'Sullivan, was formerly well-known to Nairobi concert enthusiasts.

A Local Wedding.

On November 14 Miss Joan Taylor, older daughter of Captain J. A. Taylor, R.N., was married to Mr. B. D. H. Arnold, an administrative officer in Dar-es-Salaam. Captain and Mrs. Taylor are very popular in Dar-es-Salaam and the wedding was attended by some three hundred guests. The happy couple are proceeding to some three hundred miles on November 18. Captain Taylor was in command of the III field "Puma" when the German "Empire" was destroyed in the night at Zanzibar by the German "Empire" was destroyed. After an unprecedented spell of dry weather, the rainy season has begun. The road for motor traffic from Mombasa to Dar-es-Salaam has become more and more difficult, motorists having to turn back and knock their cars. Now the Public Works Department has issued a notice that the road is closed for further entries. Rain does not effect the road, the immediate vicinity of Dar-es-Salaam, but they are mostly centred on and about Mombasa. It is expected that the roads would open up soon, but the roads are still very bad for the time, though it is expected that "normal" conditions will be restored in the near future.

THE RENAISSANCE OF THE BRITISH.
Mr. Anson, M.P., speaking at a dinner of the Authors' Club in London said that he hoped the day would come when a single name could be found to denote the British Empire. It was a mark of imaginative statesmanship which English statesmen, at the time of the union between England and Scotland, were prepared to create the national name, and in the face of evidence to have the name of Britain for the united country. A great change was noted when Ireland was given Dominion status. "Providence" had suggested "Ireland" as a name for Great Britain or the British Empire. "Britannia" might have expressed the opinion that the present days of the British people at home and in the Empire were still a unity. The recognition of the equality of the Dominion was bringing the whole of Great Britain together more closely.
A lecturer on "The British Empire" said that it stands for "the people of the boys at Brighton College and Mr. Parnell Whiteley." Mr. Whiteley gave what might be termed a thoroughly "modern" description of the British Empire. He explained briefly this transformation which has taken place in self-governing positions, as embodied by the title "The British Commonwealth of Nations."
The lecture fell into three parts. In the first he traced the history of the self-governing Dominions from their inception as struggling Colonies to their present-day status as equal partner nations in the Commonwealth, both for Imperial and international purposes. In the second part of the lecture Mr. Whiteley dealt with those parts of the Empire in India, Africa, and Polynesia which are not yet self-governing. He then gave an account of the sporting change which is being wrought by the substitution of the idea of evolution towards self-governing. Finally, he drew some conclusions as to the meaning of those changes for Great Britain, pointing out that while the external aspect of the Empire is changing, the central strength of its unity and life were the moral ideas—represented by sportsmanship, responsibility, initiative and public spirit—embodied in the traditions of the Homeland.

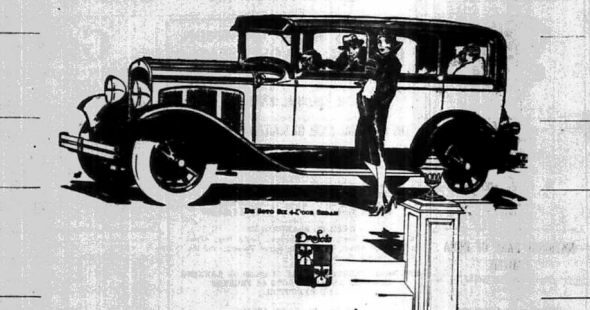

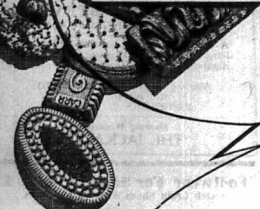

Relation of Capital to Returns. VIEWS OF THE COMMISSION.

System Divided into Three Categories.

During the course of its report the Agricultural Commission deals with the question of credit for farmers...

It is pointed out that the farmer has no access to the usual source of capital, for joint-stock companies engaged in farming are rare.

The Commission, while not in a position to enquire fully into the various schemes, simply places on record its opinion that there is a pressing need for further credit facilities in the Colony...

MIXED FARMING IN THE COLONY.

The third chapter of the Agricultural Commission's Report deals with mixed farming, and it is an important question of Agricultural credit.

The question of credit for farmers in Kenya is a distinctive problem, and the Commission's views are given in detail.

REGISTRATION OF SEEDLINGS.

The following are details concerning the registration of new seedlings and sports in the Kenya Colony.

Horticultural Society's Registrar Book—Registration for this 1924. Any grower or raiser who wishes to register a new seedling or sport must give the following particulars: 1. Name of the variety; 2. Name to be given; 3. Date when first raised; 4. Name and address of grower or raiser.

The application and certificate to be signed by the Registrar must be sent to the Horticultural Society, which sends in the entries for any show, or if showing does not coincide with a show registration may take place at a Committee Meeting, but communicate with Horticultural Secretary.

Vegetables.
In growing all vegetables, the first consideration must be to get the ground well prepared, so that good crops will be raised. The best plants are obtained from seed, and this raggy plants will not give good results, and so-called poor soil. If one has time and space to transplant the vegetables from their seed beds, you will have the best results, and that is stronger, with more roots than any left to the soil, and will repay you with finer results.

The above remarks are for all vegetables which are first raised in seed beds. Also it is stated that few vegetables, very thin stems, and which will be found not so tedious to do, when the time for thinning out comes. Never crowd any of your vegetables in their first quarters. That your vegetables frequently with time during above weather, to keep in check the caterpillars. If these remarks are followed, results will be quite satisfactory.

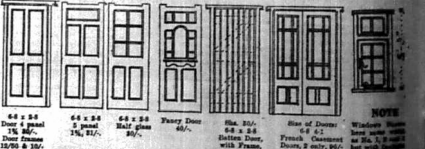
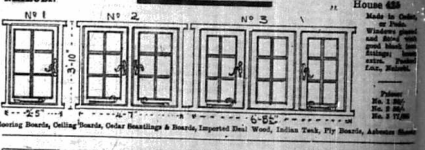

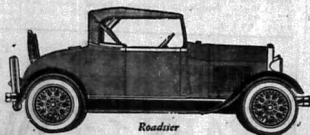

EGYPT'S NOTE TO LEAGUE OF NATIONS.

Question of Treatment of Foreigners.

"CAPTIVATORY" STATES.

Equal Treatment with Her Own Nationals.

The Egyptian Government has submitted a note to the International Conference on the Treatment of Foreigners...

The Egyptian Government adds that it would not, however, be unwilling to consider for a period of transition an arrangement whereby nationals of the captivatory States established in Egypt would be sure of that perfect equality of treatment which will in future be the legal right.

Egypt's Disabilities.

In its note, the Egyptian Government says that the draft Convention, which has been drawn up as part of the work of the League Economic Organization, "incidentally satisfies the legal requirements of the Egyptian Government to settle in Egypt the same treatment as is granted to nationals, but points out that Egypt, so far from being able, like other countries, to grant foreigners the same favourable treatment that is given to nationals in form of discrimination which it is the purpose of the draft Convention to make impossible—obliged to allow foreigners situated in her territory to enjoy special privileges which make them partially independent of the sovereignty of the Egyptian State."

promise to Egypt, which, along with the States that have inherited from that Empire, is still subject to the obsolete "captivatory" regime. "The Royal Government is well aware that the forthcoming Conference is not intended to discuss the question of the abolition or modification of that regime, and that the draft Convention prepared by the League of Nations Economic Committee is designed to deal with other matters."

"Nevertheless, inasmuch as the aim of the draft is to put an end to the differential treatment provided for between foreigners and nationals, to the prejudice of the former, by various countries in least developed States, the Royal Government, which proposes to amend the regulations in regard to the captivatory States in regard to the regulations which apply to the other States, is prepared to consider the case of Egypt, where there is also a differential system on between certain classes of foreigners and nationals, but one which operates in favour of the foreigners."

Differential Regime.

This differential regime, says the note, is primarily characteristic of the captivatory States in the jurisdiction of Egyptian national courts.

"Being prepared to accept the provisions of article 9 of the draft Convention, which concerns civil and legal questions, Egypt avails that the captivatory States will recognize that the time has come to modify the existing regime in the direction of national treatment of the foreigners."

Another feature of the differential regime is that certain classes of foreigners claim a privileged position or regard taxation. The Egyptian Government "is prepared to grant equality of treatment to all foreigners without distinction by accepting the provisions of article 12 in the draft Convention. In all fairness, that treatment is the more that foreigners can see. The theory that the regulations restrict the freedom to engage taxation can only be explained by the fact that, in the political and administrative conditions that obtained in the former Ottoman Empire, discriminatory might be introduced between foreigners and nationals. It is hoped article 12 of the draft,

1921 would undertake to observe equality of treatment."

Mixed Tribunals

Thirdly, legislation affecting foreigners requires the sanction of the General Assembly of the so-called Mixed Tribunals, that is of the court constituted by a majority of foreign magistrates, which have been established in various parts of the Egyptian territory.

As in the case of fiscal legislation, the Egyptian Government is convinced that the Convention would imply safeguarding the legitimate interests of foreigners, and might with advantage ultimately replace the present approval of the Federal Assembly.

The present system interferes with the responsibilities of the territorial Government, would do injury, in not occasional with legislative activity, especially under the parliamentarist system, and might in the long run impair the interests which it is opposed to protect. The Egyptian Government therefore trusts that the Conference will recognize the desirability in the near future of adhering strictly to the system of the draft Convention in the matter of legislation."

Rights Reserved.

Finally, the Egyptian Government states that it, of course, reserves the right to submit other proposals on the substance and drafting of the Convention, and that, in communicating this note to the members of the Conference, it does not intend to ask the Conference to pronounce an opinion on the questions set out in the note.

It merely hopes that, since these questions are closely linked with those with which the Convention has to deal, the latter may be reconsidered or in some other suitable form, express the general agreement with the Egyptian Government as to which it is not possible to submit to the Convention a law between civilized countries that the Convention is to establish, to put an end to the differential regime still existing in Egypt to the advantage of certain foreigners. This regime has not become incompatible with the equality of States, with the state of her legislation and her administrative and judicial organization, and also with the general interests of all foreigners established in the country.

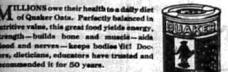

 formed either for trading purposes or for the particular purpose of giving the members of the fund the benefits afforded to the Government in the collective credit of the group or society, each member of which takes some share of the risks involved.
 The Commission is left in a position either to require that some of the circumstances affecting it be removed or to suggest the formation of a new one. It would simply pass on recent its opinion that there is a pressing need for further credit facilities in the Colony and it recommends the Government to institute a specific enquiry into the various ways in which such facilities may be most safely and economically provided with the utmost dispatch.

Livestock Industry.

The Commission is fully convinced of the necessity for building up a system of credit financing if the agriculture of the Colony is to be placed upon a stable foundation.

At the same time, the Commission is satisfied that the realization of general credit facilities in Kenya can only proceed slowly and with friction. The great obstacles to immediate development is the preliminary amount of which has not been fixed and which has caused confusion among the stock farmers in the past. Indeed, a consideration of cattle statistics shows that stock-keeping in the Colony has been almost at a standstill for many years.

While the Commission regards the increase of stock-keeping, particularly the extension of dairying, as a necessary element in the progress of the agriculture of the Colony, it is convinced that such methods should be extended only after most careful consideration by individuals, and the conditions have been considerably improved. The control of dairies as an industry has been attempted in the case here by guarantee regulations and restrictions on the movement of cattle, and by prohibitive regulations and restrictions on the other. The latter methods are of the present time the subject of research by means of which it is hoped a way may be found to produce a more steady industry.

The Commission, however, doubts whether the guarantee regulations have been successful.

or may even be properly considered having regard to the pressure of the multi-tenanted estate in close proximity to the Government settlements. Financing of Reserves.

While the Secretary controlling the Native Reserves may occasionally be called upon to pay one-half of the cost of such a company, the Commission is of the opinion that the Government should not be called upon to pay more than the other half of the cost upon the return of the adjacent land. Behind them are other settlers who will enjoy the protection provided by the boundary fence. The Commission suggests that consideration should be given to the possibility of imposing a rate for a limited term of years upon all the land which receives benefit from such boundary fences. 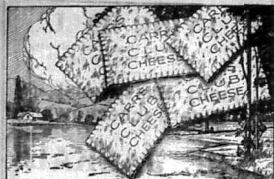

UGANDA FORCED LABOUR.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard."
Sir—The founder of the Christian religion summed up the duty of man to man in the Golden Rule. He said, "Whatsoever ye would that they should do unto you, do ye even so unto others."

In April 1922, in the most unchristianly way of Christian Jerusalem, an International Missionary Conference was held. There can be no doubt that those at that Conference believed themselves to be under the influence of the founder of their religion. They passed a series of resolutions, amongst them one headed, "Protest against Economic and Social Oppression." It began thus: "It is essential that concerted action be taken to prevent economic and social injustice, and particularly those which impede the progress of the world." It then proceeded to list various evils, including forced labour, and to propose methods for their removal. It took my stand on this mission, and I believe it is the duty of every man to do so.

Mr. Ormsby Goe in London last year at the Conference, and considering amongst other matters forced labour, said that Uganda was the only place in the world where the practice of forced labour was still in vogue.

The Bishop of Uganda expressed his indignation at the practice of forced labour for the railway. In doing so, I am sure, he was aware that the question of forced labour was open to challenge. Lord Lugard for years past, following that railway development in our Empire in Africa should make excessive demands on labour, has urged that development be retarded rather than that the evils of forced labour be incurred. Mr. Ormsby Goe in London last year at the Conference, and considering amongst other matters forced labour, said that Uganda was the only place in the world where the practice of forced labour was still in vogue.

The second were sentenced to imprisonment for periods of from three weeks to three months and in one instance the man was sentenced also to a whipping with ten strokes with a cane. Railway construction is a necessary activity if compulsory in the actual process of the work, there are those who have family ties, lands and occupations, and they are not obliged against their will to contribute to these necessities from their homes all over the country. On the whole I am satisfied by the view that Mr. Ormsby Goe has put in the right one. In pointing out that the Kabaka has been the cause of much of the trouble is laid bare by the Bishop.
