Bares Rothchild's Proposed Plans.

DEPARTURE FROM EUROPE.

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT.] London, December 13.

...The following are the official plans for Baron Rothchild's East African safari which will be carried out by Mr. Captain Mitchell and Captain Wood, the pilot and mechanic, are flying a three-seater "Fokker" aeroplane from Zurich to Catania. On Saturday they will arrive at Benghazi and will complete the journey to Cairo on Sunday. They will stay at Cairo until December 31, when they will fly to Alexandria and take the service to Bahr. Rothchild is to be accompanied by his wife and will fly via Amoyee, Khartoum, and Khongor, to Benghazi which they expect to reach on January 4. They will land on the Derwent plain on January 6 for the purpose of shooting game, viz., ibex, buffalo and rhino. They will fly round Meroe, Khartoum and Khongor, to Bahr. Rothchild and Captain Mitchell are great sportsmen and will be accompanied by two young men, Messrs. Kemp and Killam, who will be in charge of the "Fokker" aeroplane. The return will be made from Nairobi in time for the party to reach Victoria by March 15. The aeroplane will be hand for travel only for the purpose of the looking or hunting game.

FLOODS IN THE THAMES VALLEY.

Position Expected to Improve Shortly.

NO FURTHER RAIN.

["BY WIRELESS."] Rugby, December 23.

This is the view taken by the Thames Conservancy after a study of levels and flow today. In the upper reaches of the river, near Maidenhead, there has been a fall of one or two inches. Below Maidenhead and Reading there has been a rise of from one to two inches but this is the normal result of raising the situation higher in the lower reaches. It is expected that by another day the water will be down to normal levels. The Thames Conservancy has decided to close the locks at Maidenhead on Thursday night to the floods which are expected to pass on Saturday.

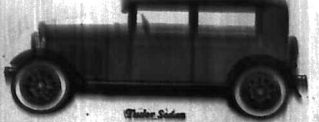

GOVERNMENT PURCHASES SYSTEM.

Subject Again Before Nairobi Chamber.

DELAIED INTEREST.

When the subject of Government purchases was mentioned at Thursday's meeting of the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce, Mr. B. F. Mayer stated that the report of the sub-committee which had been appointed was not yet ready on account of Mr. Bergman's absence.

The Chairman (Mr. W. Tyson) said that correspondence on this subject had passed between the Chamber and the Colonial Secretary of the Director of Public Works. The Secretary had letters which had been sent by him to both of those officials; and notice had been sent to all the institutions in November 1925 informing them that copies of its despatch were to be forwarded to the Trade Commission at the same time as to the Treasury, and asking that this should be done as it was found to be of great benefit to the commercial community.

F.W.D. Delays.
The following reply had been received from the Director of Public Works:

"It is regretted that owing to the system which was adopted in forwarding copies of notices to the office of His Majesty's Trade Commission there was a certain delay between the posting of the notice and the dispatch of a copy to the Trade Commission."

"Arrangements are now, however, being made that in future a copy of every notice will be forwarded by this office to His Majesty's Trade Commission at the same time as to the Treasury, and a copy will then be in the hands of the Trade Commission several days before it is posted to the Crown Agents. There will thus be ample time for business firms to advise their home offices about the order.

"It is mentioned that certain notices are altered or cancelled after they have left this office. In such cases, which are not of frequent occurrence, the Trade Commission will be notified and will have to deal with all interested parties."

The Chairman said that the trouble in the past had been that copies of the notices had been

sent to him that it had been impossible for him to refer to them before the meeting.

Mr. A. Davis asked why copies should be sent to the Chamber of Commerce instead of to His Majesty's Trade Commission.

Home-Made Sweets.

(By a Kenya Housewife.)

Plain Toffee and Guard Sweet.
These are easily made at home and generally appreciated by all ages. They are made with very little expense, and when made with good ingredients can do us no harm.

Hot Toffee.
This is the cheapest and easiest to make. Take four tablespoonfuls of water, a pound of the best brown sugar, a teaspoonful of vanilla or lemon essence, and a good pinch of cream of tartar. Boil all together until when a little is dropped into cold water, it sets hard. Pour into a well-greased tin, and mark off in squares with the back of a blade.

Butter Scotch.
Take one tablespoonful of ordinary granulated sugar, two tablespoonfuls of golden syrup, four ounces of butter, one tablespoonful of boiling water, and a good pinch of orange, two tablespoonfuls of cream of tartar. Boil all together until when a little is tried in cold water, it is quite brittle.

The syrup should not be stirred more than is necessary while it is on the fire, and if any sugar crystallizes on the side of the pan, it should be removed with a brush dipped in warm water. If the crystallized sugar is scraped off the pan, it may cause the rest of the sugar to go gritty.

Hot Toffee.
Melt half a pound of diamonds sugar with two tablespoonfuls of boiling water, and add a pinch of salt. Remove from the fire and add two tablespoonfuls of butter. Stir well and re-boil until the syrup will set when tested in cold water. Stir in the nutmeg-milk, chopped almonds, or walnuts—and pour into a well-greased tin. Mark off two squares, and when quite cold, wrap each piece in wax paper there in an eight-inch jar.

If liked, chopped dates or raisins may be added as well as, or instead of, the nuts.

Chocolate Fudge.
Into a large pan place a level tablespoonful of granulated

sugar, a level tablespoonful of sweetened cream, three tablespoonfuls of milk, and a dessert-spoonful of vanilla. When the syrup is on the fire, stir as little as possible, but be careful that it does not burn. Boil until when a little is dropped into cold water, it sets hard. Remove from the fire and add vanilla essence, still hot. Stir until quite smooth. Pour into a buttered chocolate tin, and mark off in squares.

Dessert Sweetmeats.
Selection of macise or oranges, strawberries, mulberries and raspberries, and so on.

Make a syrup by boiling together one cup of water, sugar, half a cup of boiling water and a pinch of cream of tartar. When the syrup will cover the back of a cold spoon, drop the fruit or nuts into it and remove with a fork. Place on a well oiled paper to set.

Decorate and arrange should be dried, the pulp left in the mixture and kept into small balls or ovals. Cool with fine sugar and when the outside is quite dry, seal carefully with plastic sugar. Place on a well oiled paper for the glass to set. Store in an airtight jar or the glass will go dull and sticky.

LOCAL SITUATION IN TANGANYIKA
Institution Assisted by Abnormal Drought.

NO DISQUIETUDE.

The following paper relating to the local situation in Tanganyika is placed on the table during the session of the Tanganyika Legislative Council assembly held at Arusha.

A return to the season of higher temperature has brought with it a real meteorological return of locusts to the westward, however, for such a projected period from April, 1926, when they swarm orbited over the Highlands and Southern Provinces) except the formation of former periods (as recorded and in consequence upon a continuation of the dry abnormal weather cycle which persists, prevailing conditions equivalent of the normal area of occurrence of locusts (the desert country of Southern Sudan, etc.), favourable to the persistence of the pests in this area (Kenya and Tanganyika) of temporary availability.

Value of Rainy.
The effectiveness of the local tropical climate which proved of considerable destructive power in May, is dependent upon rapidly dry weather favouring locust multiplication, but the reverse, wet weather, gives the advantage in the natural enemies of locusts, particularly the locust grasshopper fly. A look in the prevailing drought cycle and a return to normal seasons throughout the Territory would, it is considered, favouring the natural controlling factors of locusts and facilitating conditions biologically favourable to them, very far to end the present locust menace of Eastern Africa.

The behaviour of the breeding swarms of November, 1925, has much resembled that of the swarms of November a year ago, the main concentration of eggs being being to the South, and scattered individuals or side swarms flying well to the interior of the Territory from over the entire range (East to West) of the

northern boundary. The present invasion need cause no undue alarm (epidemic). It is to be recalled however, that the single invasion of 1922 (the second serious invasion) occurred in the end of January when dense swarms of the newly winged and pale coloured the Territory spreading, however, damage to Territory crops of limited amount in proportion to the present. The progress of this January invasion was effectively dealt with and major operations were completed in August.

In East Africa.
The locust stores held in the Territory by the Department of Agriculture is maintained for combating measures include:—

1. Thirty four tons of Arsenic of Soda.
2. Twenty motor power sprayers with water and poison spray tanks (for poison solution spray).
3. Ninety poison dusting guns (for dry powder application in waterless areas) and supplementary arsenic containers (South African Type).
4. Fifteen hundred hand pumps.
5. Supplies of poison antidotes.
6. Arrangements are in hand to obtain same throwers of a type similar to those that were successful in the recent measures against locusts in Palestine.

When available, manpower will be used in the campaign mounted and extended by the proved mechanical means referred to above. The existing staff, which is now employed in determining the spread areas, will be supplemented by officers recruited from other appointed Temporary Locust Officers. The planning committee is carefully requested to co-operate with the work on the lines of those sketched above in the last locust campaign. The Officer in Charge of Anti-Locust Measures, the Zoologist of the Department of Agriculture, who is at present making his headquarters in Mombasa, will be pleased to reply to any enquiries regarding control measures.

REGISTRATION OF LAND TITLES
Commercial Views on the System.

MAJORITY REPORT.

A sub-committee of the Council Chamber of Commerce was constituted to prepare a memorandum on the subject of the registration of land titles. The Committee consisted of Mr. C. A. Tannhill, Mr. T. A. Wood, and Mr. E. Harrel.

At Thursday's meeting of the Chamber a memorandum, representing the views of Mr. Tannhill and Mr. Wood, was read. In this, matters were given to the consideration of the Chamber by Government. In reply to the "questionnaire" they stated that in regard to the principles governing the present system of registration was required, but that definitive details should be considered before the second question as to the desirability of the introduction of the Torrens System, they expressed the difficulty of a reply in general on this question. Mr. Tannhill, in reply to the third question they mentioned several of the objections to the system of registration prior to 1918. Reference was also made to the abnormally high stamp duty of two per cent at present obtaining in the Colony. The difficulty for former in preparing an opinion as to which system should be adopted was mentioned in reply to the fourth question.

A Minority View.

Mr. E. Harrel, the third member of the Commission, said that the report had not been signed by him as he did not intend to sign it. He had been dealing with the matter since 1924. Many very high technical points were involved. He would prefer to send in a minority report, which could be considered with the majority report submitted by Mr. Tannhill, at the next meeting.

It was agreed that Mr. Harrel should submit his report and that this should be read together with Mr. Tannhill's report at the next meeting of the Chamber. It was also agreed that the Annual Chamber of Commerce should be asked to add the subject of the registration of titles to the agenda, for their last yearly session to be held in January.

It was probable that England would take 10,000 tons which would mean that last year's market would have to be taken to the value of 5,000 tons. The only way to avoid this was to export and advertising was very expensive.

Turning to the question of fact that under the present system coffee planters are taxed 30/- per ton and get little in return. The scheme would have the effect of increasing their numbers, and such duties would have the effect of increasing their numbers. It was pointed out that it was estimated that some 120,000,000 are invested in coffee in Kenya and that an industry of that magnitude is well worth looking after. A scheme was introduced, and Government contributions for the welfare of the coffee industry (amounting probably to £5,000 next year) were already indicated. Travelling laboratories could also be provided to carry out treatments of the coffee.
