UP-COUNTRY GRADING OF WHEAT AND MAIZE.

Objections of Department of Agriculture.

The question of up-country grading of wheat and maize was raised in the first resolution to be brought before the Convention of Associations on Monday. The resolution from the Executive, read with report that the recommendation of the Wheat Conference that the up-country grading of wheat should be adopted by Government, was not adopted by Government.

Major Joyce, in submitting the report on, explained that the effect of the recommendation had not been adopted by Government, which would have introduced when it became necessary or desirable. When the report of the survey of the Port was still further advanced, it was decided that the Wheat Conference by vote to three. At that time the Director of Agriculture opposed the decision of the vote but the arguments were not considered as they were strong to alter the opinion of the delegates. However, these recommendations were not adopted by Government.

It was a feeling that if people attended from considerable distance and spent a long time in discussion, and good recommendations by such societies, they would spend their time if Government refused to accept their recommendations. Mr. G. Peterson and Mr. Newton supported the resolution.

The Hon. Alex. Holm, the Director of Agriculture, said he would like to see attention on the part of the Department of Government to handle, in any way or to set aside the value of one resolution passed of such conference. It was the first time in two and a half years that he had been unable to recommend to Government the adoption of a resolution.

He explained that the Government would be able to handle the wheat and maize by the up-country grading, which would be necessary in view of the possible change in the conditions of wheat between the time of grading and the arrival at the port. 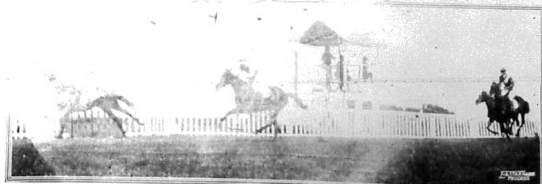

SUMMARY OF CROP REPORTS FOR NOVEMBER.

Good Rains Lead to Improved Prospects.

The Department of Agriculture has issued the following report for the month of November, during which it will be seen that crop prospects are generally better than in the previous month, although certain further reductions in the estimates are necessary.

While considerable changes have taken place in the individual estimates, correspondingly there is a little change in the aggregate totals of yields as compared with the previous month's report. The total maize crop is now estimated at 1,201,471 bags, a decrease of 5,066 bags as compared with the October estimate. The wheat estimate is increased by over 5,000 bags. A further increase in the coffee crop is estimated. The total crop now being at 173,319 tons, an increase of 4,013 tons when compared with the October estimate.

The weather conditions throughout the Colony were generally favourable during the month, and in most districts the average rainfall for November far exceeded. As a consequence, dried tree heath has been reported in the prolonged drought conditions which prevailed earlier in the year.

In several districts a very heavy hailstorm occurred during the first week of the month, and the rain during the month has been reported as being sufficient to permit of a good crop. Pasture in the districts already mentioned is being recovered, which is a very important feature of livestock and milk yields. The weather is also reported to be in full swing in most districts and the winter season estimates are being secured.

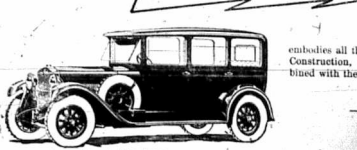

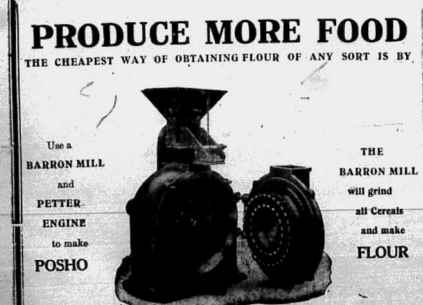

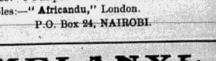
