**TANGANYIKA MEMORANDUM FOR SIR SAMUEL WILSON.**

High Commissioner Plus Central Legislature Advocated.

**COMMON ROLL IDEAL REJECTED.**

**Strong Protest Against Suggested Transfer of Any Part of the Territory.**

The European non-official committee in Tanganyika representing planters and commercial men from every part of the territory, sitting in Congress in Dar-es-Salaam have agreed upon a memorandum to be presented to Sir Samuel Wilson.

The memorandum favours the immediate appointment of a High Commissioner, but qualifies that by asking for the establishment of a strong Central Legislature preferably based on the elected principle. The appointment, it is suggested, should also be subject to abandonment of the idea of advisory bodies except perhaps as a temporary measure in East Africa, but certainly not in London.

Representation similar to that of Kenya is advocated. The Congress rejects the civilian franchise scheme and the proposal to attempt an agreement to introduce the common roll.

Strong protests were entered against any proposal to transfer portions of Tanganyika to other territories.

**(STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.)**

Dar-es-Salaam, May 15. The Congress of Associates which is sitting here has adopted today a memorandum which will be placed before the Hon. Secretary of State for the Colonies.

The memorandum is based on resolutions which, with one exception, were passed unanimously. In the case of the exception there were only two dissentients.

The memorandum agrees to the immediate appointment of a High Commissioner, but expresses the opinion that he must be assisted by a strong Central Legislature as early date and that the Legislature should preferably be elected by the people.

The Congress disposes with the system of advisory councils proposed except as a temporary measure in Africa and only as long as it is approved by any similar body in London as suggested by the Commission's report.

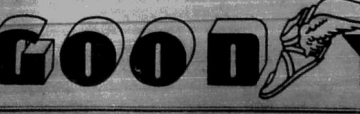

### THURSDAY, MAY 14, 1926 Developing the Empire.

We publish this morning some extracts from one of the most useful, most important and most significant of all the documents which emerge from the printing press of the East African Government—the annual Trade Report of the Commissioner of Customs for Kenya and Uganda. For those who have the time and the facility for the study of statistics, the Trade Report for the three East African Territories tells a story of progress, of faith, of enterprise and of courage. Today we deal with Kenya and Uganda. The story of 1925 and the preceding years in the twentieth century history of the two territories occupies 170 pages. Year by year the statistical information becomes more complete. Led by such facts as the picture which is conveyed by the holder's signature, the combined value of the exports and imports of the two countries last year aggregated 417,800,000, an increase of 20 per cent and three quarter millions over the preceding twelve months. Of this figure the imports were over eight and a half millions, having increased by one million pounds in the year. Exports from both countries were valued at 40,000,000, almost equally divided, with a small balance in favour of exports. So far as Kenya is concerned, 1925 was by no means an uneventful year. Taking only the large figure again, we find a decrease in the main traffic of 200,000,000, and off-set stationery, an increase of 275,000 in the value of the wheat surplus exported and an increase of 14,000,000 in the revaluated and revaluated and industry of Magadii. In 1925 a story for two years suffered an excellent recovery assisted by the capable financial policy of the Government during the artificial period. The value of the cotton crop exported rose by over three quarters of a million pounds, in one case more than doubled and the outlook for the present year is brighter still. The losses of the post-war slump have "been thoroughly digested" by East African markets, over-trading is less in evidence, accumulated stocks have been utilized, the internal barriers has given the commerce of the territories greater facility and in the opinion of the Commissioner of Customs—who is never given to over-estimation—Kenya and Uganda both increased their share of the general trade and the conservative estimate of maximum revenue—still the main source of the income of the two territories—more than doubled. The story told by the Trade Report is a typical record of Empire development. The average annual value of imports between 1900 and 1905 was £381,000. During the five years 1906-1910 it was £485,977, over three quarters of a million by the end of 1910, one and a half millions during the five and of 1915, £2,000,000 at the close of 1925, £2,600,000 at the close of 1925 and rising to nine million to-day. The total import, export and transport trade has gone upwards in the last twenty years from £1,750,000 in 1905 to £19,000,000 in the year under review. Secretary of the Government was unable to make a statement on the subject, saying that pending the removal or variation of the present Protective Customs duties and Railway Freight? Government work was so urgent. In May 1927, the Government informed the Government of Kenya that a resolution had been passed by the Legislative Council to the effect that the Government should secure the agreement to the removal from Table "D" of the First Schedule to the Customs Treaty of British goods, such as bananas, gum, skins and grains, and to the effect that the Government should be asked to consider the removal of such goods from the list of commodities to which special reference is made in the Treaty.

The Government of Kenya is of the opinion that the Government should be asked to give the fullest consideration to the representations made but that they were awaiting the report of the Committee appointed to inquire into and report upon the matter.

(A) The reason for the rise in cost of commodities in Kenya, and particularly in the East African Dependencies, is the cost of living in relation to the cost of production. Last year the Government of Kenya and Uganda met in conference of the three territories on the subject of the protective duties on butter, ghee, bacon and ham, wheat flour, sugar and timber, and with several questions affecting the Customs Tariff.

This Government replied to the effect that it was prepared to participate in such a conference. The Government of Tanganyika was not present at such a conference. The reason this conference did not take place. In December 1925 the attitude towards the proposed removal of protective duties on the above mentioned commodities was again taken up by the Government of Kenya but no definite action was taken at that time. It is not clear how long it will take to see the result of a conference.

A Kenya Committee. In February last the Government of Kenya decided to appoint a Committee that a Tariff Commission should be set up for the purpose, inter alia of investigating the question of the continuation of the present protective duties. ANNUAL TRADE REPORT OF KENYA AND UGANDA. Total of Imports and Exports £17,500,000 in 1923. INCREASE OF NEARLY £3,000,000.

Kenya Exports Affected by Climatic Conditions but Sharp Recovery in Uganda.

The annual Trade Report for Kenya has recently been published. It gives a general survey of the trade position of Kenya and Uganda. The most complete information is furnished in the form of extracts from the Commissioner's Report, accompanied by explanatory notes. The annual value of imports and exports of Kenya and Uganda in 1922 was £17,500,000 as compared with £14,500,000 in 1921 and £13,200,000 in 1920. The value of merchandise cleared for export in Kenya during the year was £20,000,000 as compared with £17,000,000 in 1922 and £15,000,000 in 1921. Exports. So far as the export trade in Kenya is concerned, an increase of £2,000,000 in the value of domestic exports in 1922 as compared with 1921 is noticeable. The conditions have been dissimilar from the extension of the railway to the interior. The value of exports of Kenya and Uganda in 1922 was £20,000,000 as compared with £17,000,000 in 1921 and £15,000,000 in 1920.

Imports. The annual value of imports in Kenya is shown, an increase of £2,500,000 in 1922 as compared with 1921 and £1,400,000 in 1920. A welcome expansion of the value of imports from neighboring territories both in domestic produce and in imported goods is noticeable. THE RAINFALL POSITION. Comparison Between Present Season and Last Year. STATISTICS TO END OF APRIL.

Eldoret, for example is only able to get 30.0 inches of rain in rain, Nakuru had had up to 30.0 last year, whilst Thika was in almost similar case. 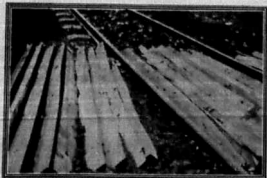

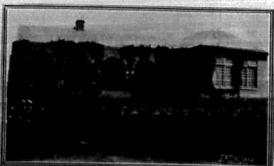

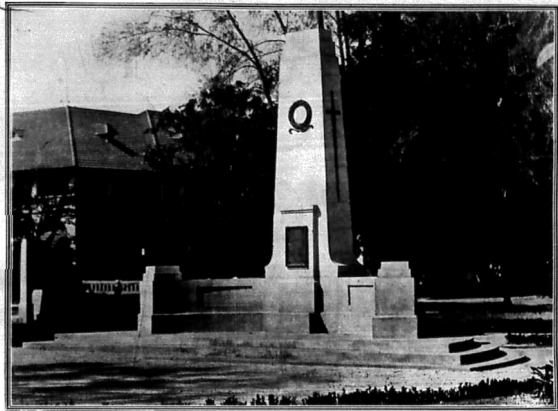

CRITICISED.**

**"Absence of Spirit  
of Corps"**

When a motion asking for the approval or payment of claims of extraordinary expenditure came before the Uganda Legislative Council recently, the Hon. Dr. H. H. Hunter took exception to the procedure followed and proceeded to analyse and criticise the schedule of expenditure presented. He considered that this additional expenditure ought to have been brought before the House in the form of Supplementary Estimates. There were several instances on which the public would have liked definite information. An sum of £36,000 was asked for. It was not so many years ago that the Grant in Aid amounted for the whole year to £20,000. He agreed that when the 1926 estimates were being prepared, the entire industry did not appear to be in a very good position and all expenditure was cut down to the minimum, and there were therefore abnormally good reasons for the additional expenditure.

He referred to salary increases granted to certain officials. "On the question of an increase of pay to the Commissioner of Police, I would like to comment on the present condition of the Police Force in Uganda."
