COASTAL SERVICE SCHEME

Big Three-Engined Multi-Seater Monoplanes on Order.

Renewed interest in aviation in East Africa is indicated by the fact that a new company known as "Wilson Air ways, Limited" is about to be registered in Kenya.

The Company's first machine, a Moth, was due to arrive in the Colony yesterday. Two larger machines are on order-both three-engined monoplanes of the saloon multi-seater passenger type.

> One of the most interesting features of the scheme one of the most interesting reatures of the scheme is that Wilson Airways will introduce a coastal-service, probably by conversion of one of their machines for water work, and a service confect-ing the Coast ports and Zanzibar is contemplated.


