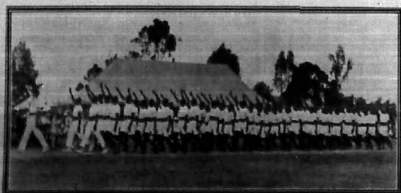

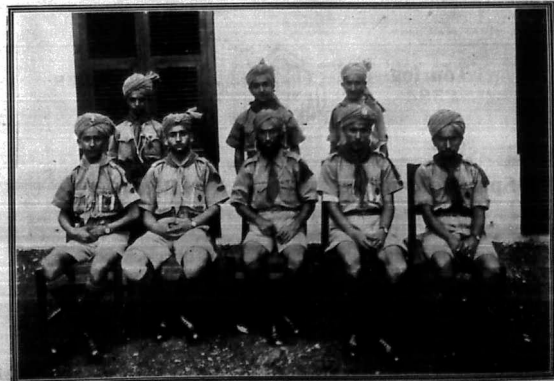

PALACES INSTEAD OF REDUCED RATES.

Criticism of the building of palaces for the housing of railway officials in Nairobi and of the construction of new headquarters of the Administration were voiced recently at a meeting of the Kenya Railway Builders' Association at the Club Hotel, Nairobi.

Colonel Durham, while regarding the building of palaces as being not unbecomingly, thought the introduction of the measure, a quite premature. He would not be misled by transporting money westward. After all, there was no road between Mombasa and Nairobi. There was only one back.

"I have gone to considerable trouble in examining figures," said Colonel Durham, "and have found that at least fifty per cent of the people who were in the motor buses were for nothing but to see the motor bus."

Compulsory insurance.

DEBATE ON A MOTION FOR CONVERSION.

"I never insure my car, and never was to." This admission was made by Mr. Ernest Carr, Nairobi, at a meeting of the Kenya Chamber of Commerce on Thursday during a discussion on the proposed compulsory insurance to issue instructions to the Government to issue a resolution that the construction of such buildings be entailed.

It was obvious that such expense was bound to cripple the country. If the railway found that big profits were being made, rates ought to be increased to the extent of the Colony's export trade. New railways had broken away from the control of the country, though they were not "back" roads. The extension of federation there might be a return to control to some extent.

We cannot afford to undertake a railway policy and a big road policy at the present time. It should be necessary to limit our resources to a policy of developing roads to railways. He felt that the country could not afford to keep up roads.

Major Biscoe replied that there was no objection to his country-riding, and a certain number of white people had not while he had been in the country. Many of those people were not insured and the only thing of which they had was probably a £100.000 Policy; they had £15. In an accident, damage to such a large number of people might be done. The rate would probably be worth the other man's while because if that was the case, the person responsible, if not insured, would be unable to pay.

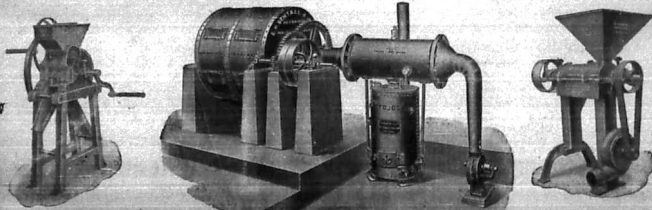
