ANTICIPATING A NEW LOAN.

Legislative Council Delays Consent to Government Offices.

Key's Legislative Council was asked on Tuesday to sanction the expenditure of a sum of £420,000 for the proposed new central office and approaching roads in Nairobi, and for the new Law Courts.

The Colonial Secretary stated: "That this Council hereby approve the expenditure of a sum of £420,000 upon the purposes specified in the Memorandum for the purpose of the new Law Courts and the new Central Office."

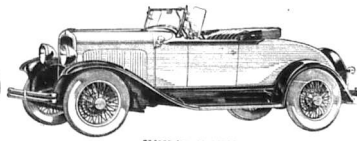

PROGRAMME OF PERSONAL ACQUISITION SCHEME.

In the Legislative Council on Tuesday, Captain Hon. H. R. Schwartz (Nairobi South) asked: "Can Government state when it is intended to put into force the scheme for the building of houses by Civil Servants, which scheme was approved by the Government more than a year ago?"
The Colonial Secretary replied: "The scheme for Government houses to European Civil Servants to enable them to acquire their own houses has now received the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies in principle, and is being made ready for the start of the scheme. The Government has now received consideration, and it is hoped to bring the scheme into force in the near future."

Asking out of the reply, the Hon. J. O'Brien (Nairobi South) asked if, when the scheme was put into operation, Government would continue the present practice of leasing from civil servants their own houses at much higher rental values than was justified on their capital cost.

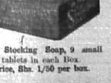
