### GREAT BRITAIN'S PRESTIGE.

"Must Resume Position in World She is Entitled to Occupy."

The situation at The Hague Reparations Conference is again critical this week. A series of proposals by the other four ma jor creditor Powers were made to Mr. Phillip Snowden, in an endeavour to satisfy his demands in regard to the distribution of reparation payments.

These proposals have been definitely rejected by the British Chancellor of the Exchequor. He declined to accept them and stated that he expected more satisfactory suggestions. He was still prepared to listen to reasonable proposals and expressed the opinion that it would be criminal to end the negotiations as long as there was a chance of a fruitful assettlement.

The proposals were described as ridiculously inade-quate, as they amounted to only 20 per cent. of the British claims. Mr. Snowden further said that British was not prepared to accept concessions at the expense of smaller States, while, he hinted, France and Italy were getting the



The Secretary of the Kenya Advisory Committee (the Deputy Trade Commissioner) has during the year continued to work in conjunction with the London Trade Information Office in giving assistance to incoming settlers. 
