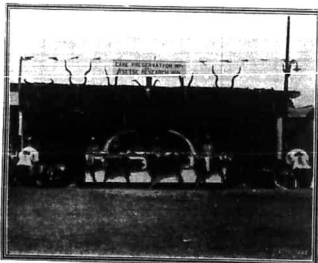

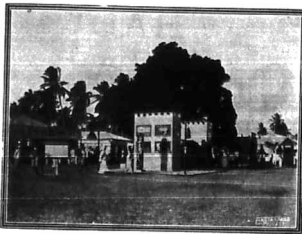

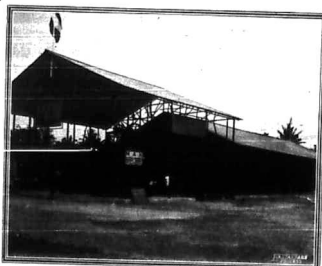

Governor's Reply to Critics of Report.

REASSURING THE NATIVE.

Ginny Problem Caused by Industry Talk.

His Excellency the Governor of Uganda, Sir William Gowers, replied to some of the main criticisms of the Cotton Commission Report in an address to the Uganda Legislative Council last week. His reply was direct and candid.

Sir William explained that Government had agreed in 1927 to the principle of Co-operative Cotton Haying Associations on receiving an assurance that such combination would not be used to depress the price to the grower. He added that the institution of Associations had aroused hostility and distrust among the Natives fostered by Indian middlemen. It was most desirable that this should be rectified and it seemed nothing short of the fixation of a minimum price would give that reassurance to the Native.

The Governor announced his intention of inviting representatives of the industry to a conference with him in person. He hoped a "modus vivendi" would be reached for 1930 but it would be impossible in the time to bring in legislation to give effect to many of the Commission's recommendations without causing disturbance which he was unwilling to contemplate.

NATIVE HOSTILITY AND DISTRUST.

A reply to the criticisms of the Cotton Commission Report formed the main theme of an address to the Uganda Legislative Council by the Governor on Friday evening. Sir William Gowers explained the Government's attitude towards the cotton industry and the Natives. He said that the Government was not prepared to accept the Commission's recommendations without causing disturbance which he was unwilling to contemplate.
