SHOULD KERICHO HAVE A BRANCH RAILWAY?

Settlers Preparing Case for Consideration.

A SIX YEARS' PROGRAMME.

The Special Correspondent of the "Standard" who recently visited the tea areas, deals this week with a wider aspect of development. The settlers of Kericho are advancing a case for a branch railway to serve the district. In support they point to the progress of the area. An unofficial economic survey suggests that European settlement will provide at least 11,000 tons of freight annually by 1935 and great hopes are centered in the expansion of native production.

PENSIONS FOR AFRICAN RANKS.

CENTRAL AUTHORITY TO CONTROL COMMON SERVICES.

High Commissioner with a Statutory Council.

KENYA LEGISLATURE ALTERNATIVES.

Three Plans for Unofficial Majority with Body of Nominated General Members.

Sir Samuel Wilson's Report was issued on Saturday in Britain, India and East Africa. He proposes the establishment of a Central Authority composed as follows:

A High Commissioner.

A Central Council of twenty-one members including officials and non-officials from each territory. The High Commissioner and his Central Council will deal with the following transferred subjects—Customs, Railways and Harbours, Posts and Telegraphs and Fundamental Research.

Complete co-ordination of Customs, Posts and Defence is proposed but not, at the moment, Railways—except that all departments would be brought under the direct control of the High Commissioner. He would decide when the psychological moment had arrived for Railway unification.

The finance of the proposed Central Government, under the scheme, is provided by a contribution from the customs and the whole of the postal revenue of East Africa.

Sir Samuel Wilson, while making no decision, suggests that Nairobi is the only suitable place for the Central Government from the practical point of view. Sir Samuel states that his scheme was agreed to by the Acting Governor of Kenya and the Governor of Uganda. Sir Donald Cameron, however, as Governor of Tanganyika urged the importance of setting up a highly authoritative Committee or Commission in London to give an opportunity to those who disagreed with the Hilton Young proposals on native policy to express their views and make their recommendations. By this means a greater measure of agreement might be obtained on the vital question of native policy.

He puts forward three separate proposals for a new constitution of the Kenya Legislature. In none is it possible for the European Elected Members to carry a measure against the wishes of other combinations such as Government plus Indian representatives.

The reconstituted Council would also include a body of representatives nominated by the Governor irrespective of race to represent general, including native, interests.

IMPORTANT MOVE BY KENYA GOLFERS.

Reconstituted Body to Govern the Game.

DECISIONS WHICH ARE LIKELY TO HAVE FAR REACHING EFFECTS.

Affiliation to Royal and Ancient.

An important step was marked in Kenya golf circles during the recent amateur championship gathering at Eldoret, when the formation of the recently reconstituted Kenya Golf Union was held. The meeting took place on Saturday, September 21, coinciding with the opening day's play in the championship. Several interesting points with regard to the Union were discussed and recommendations made in the minutes, which are to be considered at the various clubs. Among those present at the meeting were Colonel Biss (Honorary Chairman), Messrs. E. Gray (Treasurer), A. K. Othman (C.R.G.), A. Holden (Mathews), Hughes and Churchill (Lawyers), Easton (Nairobi), Mackay (R. & F. V. Taylor (Nairobi), and F. L. Halsey (Nairobi), honorary secretary.

It was explained by the chairman that since the Eastern Africa Golf Union had been discontinued the new body had to be put on a proper basis and that that meeting had been convened for the purpose of studying an executive, adopting a constitution and discussing various matters concerning the better governing of golf in Kenya.

It was agreed that the next meeting of the Union should prepare a constitution on the lines of the Eastern Africa Golf Union for adoption by the K. G. U. The following executive was then elected: President, Mr. A. C. Tumballi; Committee—one delegate from each affiliated club: Hon. Sany Mr. W. L. Gilbert.

Open Meeting: The following dates were fixed for open events for 1933: Royal Marshalls Cup—King's Highway; Nairobi Inter-Club Tournament—Eldoret; Fife's Championship—Second week end of October; Hill Valley Championship—Chimani. It was further resolved that responsibility for any other events under the auspices of the Kenya Golf Union must be undertaken by the Hon. Secretary in writing and that the K.G.U. will be held liable if the application is accepted. It was proposed and agreed that the Kenya Amateur championship of 1933 should be played

on Mathugi golf course during the first week-end in August.

Local Rules. Considerable discussion took place on the necessity of arriving at a uniformity among the various clubs in the methods applied in smoothing the greens. It was eventually decided that the following suggestions be put up to members for their opinion and that the matter be further considered at a later meeting: (1) That the lines of the putt with the least of the putter only; (2) That the greens may be smoothed across the line of the putt with the head or shaft of the club.

A Recommendation. Before discussing the question relative to a ball lying on the edge of the brown it was proposed that the decision of the meeting be put forward as a recommendation to clubs: "It was then proposed 'that a ball lying on the edge of the brown may be moved to a point not more than 12 inches from the edge of the brown.'"

An amendment "that a ball lying on the edge of the brown may be moved further from the edge not more than 12 inches from the edge of the brown."

A further amendment was proposed to the effect "that there is no local rule governing a ball on the edge of the brown."

After voting the second amendment was carried by six votes to three, and now goes forward as a recommendation from the Union to affiliated clubs.

Another proposal was "that a ball on the brown may be cleaned but not changed." In regard to inter-club matches a suggestion was made that they be played single and foursome. It was recommended "that they may be foursome or foursome matches as sanctioned by the club." was laid, and the original motion carried by six votes to two. It was agreed that after the meeting, all inter-club matches be one point for singles and two points for foursomes.

Attention to H. and A. A. constitution section "that the Secretary be asked to apply to the

Royal and Ancient Club for affiliation "was made.

Steel Shafed Clubs.

The Acting Secretary read a letter from the Members Golf Club suggesting "that the Kenya Golf Union should permit the use of steel shafed clubs. It was decided to call to hold this over pending R.G.U. would be advised as to the ruling of the parent body on such matters.

Sunday Play.

The question of Sunday play was noted following the reading of a letter from the Church of Scotland Mission asking the Union to consider the possibility of Sunday play from championship and other events. It was decided to call the Secretary to inform the writer of the Union's policy regarding getting away four shafed clubs and business on any time except week-ends made it impossible to accede to the request.

A statement of accounts showing a credit balance of Shgs. 21.10 with Messrs. H. Jacobs & Co. limited by the Secretary. A small payment it was pointed out, was made to the Secretary for the cup and the expense of printing for the Union's programme may be met by entrance and affiliation fees for this year.

It was agreed "that the entrance fee for the amateur championship be Shgs. 10/-, and the fee for affiliation of clubs to the K. G. U. be Shgs. 40/-."

With regard to the custody of the Cup it was decided that the championship Cup be held by the Secretary for the Union until the end of the season. It was also resolved that the Hon. Secretary be asked to obtain a photograph of the championship Cup and to obtain estimates for repairs to be presented to future winners.

COFFEE MEMORANDUM FOR COMMISSION.

Recommendations by the Ruiru District.

UNHAPPY MEALY BUG STORY.

Stress Laid on Urgency of a Proper Research Policy.

The Ruiru Farmers' Association, composed principally of coffee planters, has prepared a memorandum for the Agricultural Commission.

It was stated, on the authority of a Government expert, that Mealy Bug had already caused a loss of two million pounds in Kenya and stress was placed on the need for co-ordinated and organised research.

The planters complain of inadequate representation of the industry in the Legislative Council.

Phillips and Mr. Glasford had drafted a memorandum to be called on Mr. Hobson to outline the different branches referred to in the memorandum. Mr. Hobson said that as no representations had been made from settlers concerned in branches of the Office of Planters' Union, which scheme contemplated the establishment of a Coffee Board of Chartered Industries having a legal status, with membership common to all coffee planters, such a body would be charged with the control of the industry, the laying of cesses, and the issue of licenses etc. By this scheme the industry would constitute annually a very considerable sum towards providing the essential services.

Difficulties Facing the Game Department.

METHODS OF POISONING.

For many years the Kenya Game Department has been faced with the problem of depredations to crops and livestock caused by wild animals. Numerous attempts have been sent in by settlers and natives for assistance or information regarding these pests.

During the course of an interview by the "E.A. Standard" it was stated by the Game Warden that each problem was to be tackled separately, as the habits of the animals varied considerably. Shooting is hardly possible, and there remains, therefore, only one effective method, — poisoning. In the article below, details are given as to the best methods to employ.

(E. A. Standard) Special.

There must make the poison more readily than whole fish is set. One loaded teaspoon of poison is sufficient for the whole of a small section of an oat, barberry, or sorghum crop.

There is a danger in over poisoning, as it causes vomiting in the animal and thereby the loss of weight. 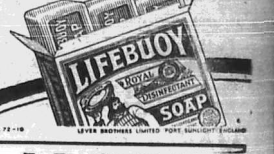

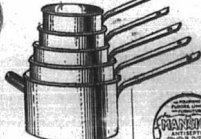

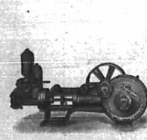
