The Offside Rule in Football.

WHEN DID IT COME INTO

A correspondent sake for infor-mation with regard to the "off-side" rule in football. Was there such a thing in existence when football first started and, if not, when did it first come into the rules. Again he asks when it was altered to having one man between the forward and the goal, and when it was necessary to have two.

\*So far as information is available the offside rule has been in the offside rule has been in operation for the past thirty to forty years. Whether it was in use when years. It certainly would be interesting to know when the rule was first introduced into the game.

The new law with regard to oft-side came into operation in the season 1925/6. At a meeting of the International Board at Paris on June 18, 1925, it was decided, on the proposal of the Scottish F: A. that a player shall not be offside if two (instead of three) opponents are nearer their own goal line.




