MORE HOME COMMENT ON WILSON REPORT

Colonial Office Evades Its Responsibilities.

"SOMETHING MUST BE DONE."

Suspense Creating Despair and Demoralisation.

Further comment on the Wilson report has appeared in certain of the British newspapers, which comment is not entirely of a critical nature.

The "Saturday Review" says the report is a useful work, and it is something to know that it is assured of fairly general support in East Africa. The journal, however, states that it evades the real problem, and further it contends the Colonial Office will be unable to decide on a native policy.

The "Spectator" pleads that the time has come when something must be done. Kenya, it says, has most acute problems and suspense is causing despair and demoralisation. The editor is an educated person and when the natural leaders have a stigma placed upon them, they are driven to a sullen morosity. The paper contends the interests of the natives being made a pawn in the political game. There will never be a satisfactory treatment of native unless it is based upon the genuine goodwill of the settlers.

LONE ATLANTIC FLIER MISSING.

Not Yet Arrived Off Irish or English Coast.

A LOW-POWERED ENGINE.

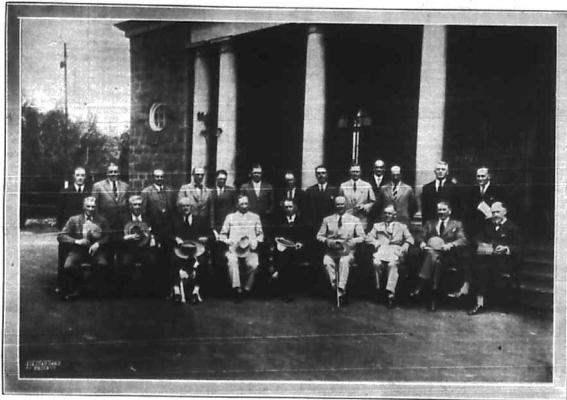

EDITOR'S NOTES.
As there has been no sign of the rain season, gardeners who have been putting the ground ready for planting and sowing. Mr. Hillier who is one of the pioneer gardeners in Kenya and who has probably grown many vegetables in this country than most people, has kindly contributed the following notes on vegetable growing. Should you wish to see further particulars, I am sure Mr. Hillier will gladly supply them in his next article.

A Few Hints To Vegetable Growers.

FRUITS AND VEGETABLES THROUGHOUT THE YEAR.
I would like first to stress the importance of the ground being well prepared prior to the rains. Good ground, and particularly where one has black coffee soil, should be dug 18 in. deep and left rough for 4 or 5 weeks before sowing. It is also advisable to dig 18 in. deep and to sow seeds in the furrows. This will help to retain the moisture and will also help to break up the soil.

will now proceed to the sowing of the early vegetables. When you have prepared the kinds of vegetable seeds you want, prepare a small bed or two near the House or River, sow the seeds thinly in furrows 1 foot apart, half the seeds in one furrow. Dig the soil round the seeds and water in. This will help to retain the moisture and will also help to break up the soil.

the green and purple. The seeds are very early vegetables. 

