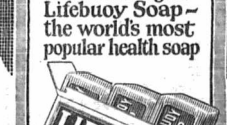

ANOTHER CABINET CRISIS IN FRANCE.

M. Daladier Abandons His Task.

[THROUGH REUTERS' SERVICE.] Paris, Oct. 25.—President Doumergue has re-treated M. Daladier with the task of forming a Cabinet.

A Radical Socialist.

M. Daladier who was Minister for the Interior in the Herriot last year as President of the Chamber of Deputies, was re-elected at the party congress in his presidential address he made a plea for a radical economic forum in the New World where Europe is stressed the necessity of forming a sort of European Federation by a large scale of economic agreements between competing nations.

M. Daladier went on to say that "the economic situation of the Anglo-Saxon hegemony at the present time is such that it is necessary to have a new international organization to meet the situation."

M. Daladier will give President Doumergue his answer by 3 o'clock to-morrow.

Invitation Accepted.

At a meeting of the Daladier leader of the Radical Socialist Parliamentary Party decided to accept the invitation to form a Cabinet, and to invite the Socialist to participate.

The Party Policy.

FORWARD POLICY FOR KENYA AGRICULTURE.

Scheme Sketched by the Commission.

IMPORTANCE OF LIVESTOCK.

Sir Daniel Hall's Tribute to Department and Director.

Sir Daniel and Lady Hall left Nairobi on Friday afternoon on their return to England. Sir Daniel, who is Chief Minister and Adviser to the British Ministry of Agriculture, came to Kenya with the second party of British Association visitors after the South African congress, and accepted the Chairmanship of the Kenya Agricultural Commission at the invitation of His Excellency the Governor.

During their stay in Nairobi, Sir Daniel and Lady Hall have been the guests of His Excellency at Government House.

Sir Daniel Hall granted an interview to a representative of "The East African Standard" before leaving Nairobi yesterday afternoon. He has been most impressed by the marvellous resources of the Colony. Educational development has taken place during the last quarter of a century," he said. "But I think the agricultural wealth of the Colony has only been touched on the surface. Production is likely to grow by leaps and bounds. The opportunities are so great that it will take time and patience, especially in matters like the development of the livestock industry which is so important. And the development of that industry will depend on such factors as fencing, the settlement of the native cattle question, the causal movement of native stock, and the wholesale slaughtering up of disease.

The Native Question.

"I have also been struck by the native question in Kenya Colony, which we have seen in England," continued Sir Daniel. "It is not really a question of 'My crop' or 'a political question' but a question of the cattle and livestock. It is a question of somehow bringing the natives to see that livestock have got to be used for productive purposes and not merely to be kept as tokens of wealth, doing no good to the native himself or to humanity.

"If the present system goes on, with the natives keeping up cattle, the continent will become so much less as a place in which more can live. Some parts already are being depopulated in the interests of 'modern' livestock, particularly goats. Goats have been a great agency of destruction in Mediterranean countries, and if the present system is to be allowed to go on unchecked here it will not only destroy vegetation but will in fact bring the native vegetation down to a great part of Central Africa.

The Commission Report.

"As to the Commission?" When asked if he would be prepared to say anything in connection with the Commission's report, Sir Daniel said:

"It is of that duty to others is perhaps one of the practical difficulties, feeling the more rapid spread of the movement, and we have no denying the usefulness of First Aid knowledge in the conditions of East Africa and we hope that by directing attention to the need, the necessary impulse will be given to the preparation of the organization in the country of this important development in its own life and equipment. There are many practical reasons why such a knowledge should be more general in Kenya. They need not

in connection with his work as Chairman of the Commission, Sir Daniel made some interesting statements in connection with the enquiry, and, although the reports which, it is understood, have been made, it is not possible to say until the Legislative Council meets again, his remarks may be accepted as indicating in a broad sense the nature of the contents of that document.

He referred to grumbles and complaints which the enquiry had brought out, was impressed by the general feeling for a forward policy in agriculture and spoke of the part which the Department and its Director had played in this connection in the past. He also hinted at the fact that he had been in the communication which the Commission will lay before the country.

A Forward Policy.

Despite all the grumbles and complaints which an enquiry of this nature must inevitably bring out, what has been in the end really struck by is the agreement that what one might call a forward agricultural policy is wanted in the country and that the Department of Agriculture, which the enquiry should carry it out.

"The Department has, of course, suffered in the past from want of strength but not from want of will. The work of the Commission has really been to sketch out a scheme of development which can only be realized by degrees as finances permit, but which would, as far as it can be realized, provide for the growing needs of the Colony. It is a question of the impression is that the country has a very good Department and a very good Director who has done a great deal of valuable work for the Colony under very difficult conditions.

"Quite naturally, they have not been able to supply everybody's requirements because the agriculture of the Colony is so unique. There is no information that can be obtained from other countries with a settled and old established agriculture. Everything here has to be found out, and that, of course, takes time and men and research."

Impressions of Kenya.

Sir Daniel reiterated that he had been most impressed by the value and the variety of the country's resources. "We have seen within a very short space of time from tropical conditions to the conditions of the highlands, which reminds one of England, with wheat fields and barley fields the only crop seen."

"Of all the Colonies I have seen this is the one that most attracts me, and is most attractive to the English settler and all I hope for is more and more of it, and that land which at the present time is not pulling its weight in the production of the colony crop."

In conclusion, Sir Daniel Hall expressed his thanks for the friendly assistance and kindness which he had so recently received by explicitly. Despite the considerable task which he was faced with in his stay in the country, Sir Daniel went away feeling that he had thoroughly enjoyed himself for
