The Week's News.

HOME.

a meeting of the British Empire League on Monday, Mr. Samuel announced that after a consultation with the various Dominion Governments he proposed to issue a circular in the name of Parliament on the Imperial Federation Bill, in accordance with the resolution of the Imperial Conference in 1911. The Conference, New Zealand and South Africa had submitted motions of general approval. The conference, Australia made the definite suggestion that various "flag provisions" should be made in the various articles of federation to be drawn up by the Empire, which the Dominion Governments would have to ratify with regard to ratification only. Mr. Balfour stated that he was in favour of the Imperial Federation Bill, in accordance with the resolution of the Imperial Conference in 1911. The House Secretary again brought read the draft Bill of 1907, with its many amendments, and offered to introduce a Bill should a vote of confidence be forthcoming, of which the result was—

That the five years period now required for ratification in British might be spent anywhere within the Empire and that nothing in the Bill should affect the validity of local immigration laws. The principles were unanimously approved. The House adjourned at 4.15. Mr. Lloyd George will open the Scottish question at the end of January. It was understood that the Scottish Land Act (which would take land values and rents) that the question of a minimum rent should be governed by local conditions. On the housing question the report recommendations similar to the last report.

Tragics. Bombs exploded on Thursday night in the vicinity of the Crystal Palace. The explosion was usually kept when in duration. The Palace was practically no damage done. London Policemen's Wages. The Home Secretary has sanctioned an increase of pay to five thousand London policemen.

Wages. An increase in wages of London policemen is confined to men who completed more than fifteen years service and is designed to deter men from leaving. The move has led a controversy for, several of applicants who have been refused to date from their service being restricted.

others were denounced. There was, however, little enthusiasm shown. The Commissioner of the Metropolitan Police in London has warned that the membership of a union is contrary to the police regulations, and has recommended the promoters of the new body.

Streets on Sale. The price of the Duke of Bedford's London Estate was under three million sterling. The transfer expenses amounted to £30,000.

It appears that the Duke took the initiative in the matter and approached Mr. Malley-Desley, M.P., the bargain being concluded during an interview lasting three months. The purchaser declares that he made a bid in the market.

Fire Outbreaks. A fire occurred on Monday night in a block of flats known as Hyde Park Chambers, Knightsbridge. The upper stories had formerly been used as a warehouse. A woman was killed while attempting to save her money, and three other persons were injured. Magnesium wire was used for a ceiling of two hundred frames and they were being removed from a height of eight yards.

Mr. Lockyer-Langdon, M.P., and other Knightsbridge residents manifested strenuous opposition.

Naval Fire Disaster. A destructive fire broke out at Portsmouth Dockyard on Sunday night and burned the shipyard tower, all masts and rigging hoists. Shipbuilders and soldiers worked their hardest to extinguish the flames, which amounted to a height of one hundred feet, illuminating the whole harbor. The new battleship "Queen Mary" was moored alongside a coaling barge and her safety was in jeopardy through cables falling on the deck. The vessel was towed out of the dock. The fire was extinguished at midnight.

A most respectable feature of the fire is that a number of valuable documents dated back to the time of Nelson and even beyond were destroyed. Another grave outcome was the death of six signalsmen. They were engaged on the same tower and pluckily remained behind to send a general alarm message. They were missing shortly after the flames. A third signalsman managed to escape from the roof and was saved in a similar condition. The fire was extinguished only eight feet away from a number of oil tanks, containing thirty thousand tons of oil. The damage is estimated at £1,000,000. Miscellaneous. King George has sent a telegram to the French President expressing lively satisfaction at the fresh proof of the intimate relations of the British and French peoples. Mr. Poincaré replied that he was glad of a fresh opportunity of manifesting that friendship.

The arrangements have now been finally made for purchasing the Crystal Palace for the public. Lord Kitching's agreement to sell the Palace has been accepted. His Majesty the King has signed a Proclamation intimating that the Imperial Exhibition will be held in the Crystal Palace.

It is stated that the Shakespeare Memorial Theatre Committee have obtained a site in Bloomsbury. The National Theatre will cost £2,000,000.

Mr. Foster Shackhouse has received thousands of applications for participation in the National Theatre scheme in 1914. In order to give the applicants an impartial character he has invited Australia and New Zealand to participate in the scheme. South Africa, the United States and Canada have been invited. The scheme Mr. Shack has been a victim of a motor-car accident at St. Albans.

The Supreme Court of U.S.A. has decided finally a long-pending suit brought forward by the manufacturing leaders of Danbury, Connecticut, who were seeking damages for boycott by the Hatters Union. The decision establishes that labour unions are liable under the Anti-Trust Law, as they are combinations in restraint of trade.

Mr. Clark, the Speaker in the U.S.A. House of Representatives took the chair on Friday evening for the purpose of replying to various Republican members. It appears that three resolutions have been presented to the House, especially the Currency Bill, and the Speaker expressed them in measured terms. He was, he said, the greatest valency lawyer in the country and there seemed to have been a conspiracy on their part to make people believe that business was going to be better.

A Boston Wash, an telegram reports that the Senate has passed the Currency Bill which will have the effect of increasing the money supply, but with amendments designed to prevent any undue inflation of currency, which was professed by Henry Lodge, and other prominent Republicans, holding an increase in the gold receipts on which the paper currency is based, and a guarantee for the value of gold.

A conference between the two Houses will take place on Monday and Tuesday. The U.S.A. Currency Conference will take place on Monday and terminated in the morning an arrangement on all points at issue. There had been a deadlock concerning the composition of the Federal Reserve Board, and this ended in the majority agreeing to retain the Cantalanda Plan proposed by the Board. The report may be presented to-day to both Houses and an effort made for a final passage before night.

Germany. THE ZEMBLER SCANDAL. Prince Henry, says a Reuters telegram from Berlin, in presiding at a meeting of the German National Aviation Club announced that the contributions that had been received totalled £261,710, permitting the derivation of loans from the Government and salaries of airmen. In addition, the funds would be utilized for the establishment of base prices and competition.

The court martial has sentenced Lieutenant Foerster to imprisonment for forty-three days for his assault on a sailor on a launch, the commander, whom he hit over the head with his sword. Reuters' Strasbourg correspondent says a scandal was caused at the court-martial during the Foerster trial, when Colonel Becker deplored to having warned his officers to be careful if they failed to keep calm as to vigorously against civilians they were summoned before a court of honor. He instructed his men accordingly and it attacked to men to use their weapons and if attacked to bring down their assailants. The Colonel is himself awaiting trial by court-martial.

TASKENT IN HIND LIFE. Reuters' Posen correspondent states that at the Castle of Gagra, Count Misiagayki, a member of the Reichstag, has shot his wife, the Countess, and a nephew.

The Countess was shot on the night of the 21st, on hearing a noise, which he took to proceed from burglars, he went to restrain with a gun and shot the Countess. His wife, however, was not in the room at that time and a nephew of the Countess was in the wife's bedroom. Both were shot dead. The Countess immediately reported the affair to the Public Prosecutor and demanded an investigation. Reuters' Posen correspondent states that in regard to the castle shooting affair, it appears that the nephew was staying with Count and Countess Misiagayki and that latter had been for some time suspicious of the relations between his wife and her nephew who was the son of her half-sister. On returning from a party at the castle on the morning he noticed his wife's room lit up and hearing a noise therein went to investigate, taking a sprayer gun in his hand. He found the couple together and shot them both dead.

The history of the Count and Countess reads like a chapter from a romance. The Count fell in love with the beautiful Countess and attempted to marry her in 1893 by shooting, owing to her father's opposition to it, she was engaged to the Count and the Count was married. The marriage was a happy one for some years, then the Count began to object to his wife's friends. Eventually she left her husband, who devoted himself to shooting, hunting, and sports and painting. The Countess recently inherited a large fortune.

and her friends advised a reconciliation, but the friendship of the Countess, who was thirty-eight, with her nephew, fourteen years younger than himself, was not to be broken, and she remained in London on Monday a tragedy.

A Boston telegram from Posen states that a judicial enquiry has been made into the circumstances surrounding the castle tragedy. The head of the Countess testified that the nephew was spending the evening at the castle and drank a quantity of wine. He wanted to borrow some money from his uncle or aunt. After the Countess had retired the young man came to her room, seized the Countess's nightgown, and was returned to his own room when the husband arrived. The tragedy then occurred. The Count, in his evidence, stated that on finishing open a search for the body he found the two together in the bedroom and he fired under the influence of an uncontrollable fury.

Reuters' telegram states that a dramatic outrage has occurred in a reform named Krenowitzer, a new history book, both in the U.S.A. and in Germany. The book is prepared in all present volumes.

GERMANY AND BRITAIN. Reuters' Berlin correspondent states that Count Bismarck has withdrawn an overbearing message by a book, just as the British attitude towards Germany is becoming more and more hostile. He attributes the British attitude towards Germany to the traditional British hostility to Continental Power. He maintains that this attitude is unjust if it is applied to the case of Germany, since her aims are fundamentally different from those which have animated Britain's rivals in past ages. He declares frankly that it was a mistake for Germany to join in the anti-British Continental coalition in the time of the Boer war. Referring to Mr. Chamberlain's overtures for an alliance at the opening of the Boer war, Reuters says that absolutely binding engagements would have been necessary and this would have brought Germany into antagonism with Russia.

FRANCE. MONSIEUR LA FÉDÉRATION. "La Gazette," the 24th June picture which has had such a remarkable career, has been ceremoniously handed over to the French Ambassador at the Ministry of Education in Rome. The Minister, Signor Giolitti, in a speech at the presentation, said he hoped the art treasure would form another link of friendly Franco-Italian relations. The French Ambassador only replied, thanking the Italian Minister for his exquisite courtesy. King Emmanuel and many notable Italians have viewed the picture. The French Government have decided to exhibit it in the "Ecole des Beaux Arts," charging admission, which will be devoted to Italian charities.

Mr. Churchill, who is visiting Paris, is inspecting the progress of aviation. He visited the aerodrome during the week-end at Buc and saw over forty armed military balloons, which were being used by several British officers who accompanied Mr. Churchill made flights.


