GEN. SMUTS' STIRRING RHODES LECTURE.

Settlement, Empire's Best Aid to Civilisation.

ANNUAL AFRICAN CONFERENCES.

East Africa's Place in Continent's Destiny.

General Smuts, who is Rhodes' Lecturer this year, has selected Africa as his subject. In the first of the series, which is published below General Smuts devoted his attention to white settlement in East Africa.

The great Imperial Statesman supported wholeheartedly the policy of co-ordinated and accelerated land settlement throughout British Africa as the soundest contribution the Empire can make to the civilisation of the African peoples.

He attacked the criticisms of the school which believes in the policy of "Africa for the Africans" pointed to the success of settlement in Rhodesia as a proof of the wisdom of the aim of Cecil Rhodes and urged the application of a progressive policy in the other parts of the continent.

AN OXFORD HONOUR.

General Smuts received a great ovation at the Oxford University for the ceremony of conferring upon him the honorary degree of Doctor of Civil Law.

Before leaving for his visit to America, General Smuts will be received by the King at Sandringham.

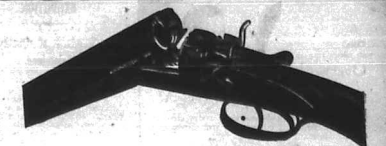

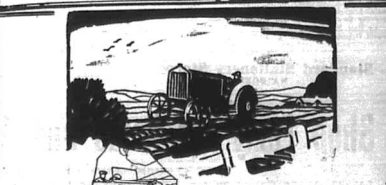

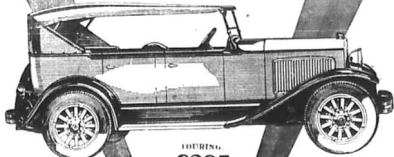

CASE FOR MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE.

Evidence Placed Before Recent Commission.

BOARD AS ALTERNATIVE.

One of the most interesting recommendations in the Agricultural Report concerned the political appointment of a Minister of Agriculture. Alternatively, the Commission proposed a Development Board with wide powers.

The following extract from the Report gives the case in favour of a Minister and indicates the evidence the Commission received.

When the Report of the Agricultural Commission was published, the summary of the recommendations was reproduced for the easy information of the Colony. It is not possible, however, to obtain a proper appreciation of the Report without a knowledge of the views of the Commission as expressed in greater detail. It is therefore proposed to publish a brief series of articles extracted from the Report.

In its opening paragraphs the Commission expresses its sympathy for that having regard to the drought, the export of live stock has been highly satisfactory. Although, on the whole, no serious increase has yet been considered, as the serious drought has not been so severe as in 1929. However, it is checked and there is some prospect of a better year.

The Minister is recommended to retire from active participation in the Government. In the following sections the Chairman states the reasons which have been presented to the Commission, with the administrative consequences that would ensue without consent and without regret to the fact that responsible Ministers do not meet Ministers on a basis of equality.

Case in Favor:

The Minister should be nominated by the Governor on the advice of the official members of the Legislative Council. It is recommended that the Council has a term of office of three years. WORLD'S FASTEST 500 MILE RACE

A Fine Contest With Many Thrills

NUMEROUS RECORDS FELL

The first 500-mile race of the British-Brazil Drivers' Club, which took place on Saturday last, October 29th, proved itself to be an outstanding success.

As it was, so many people were inclined to forecast a dull event. They were completely wrong. Not only did a very satisfactory proportion of the cars complete the full distance of 500 miles, but they did so on a scale hitherto unapproached for a race of this character in any part of the world.

Records fell throughout the length of the race. By the time several cars reached about the new 1000, and subject to verification by the sporting authorities this will be given in due course.

The chief features of the race are: "The Motor" were a de-

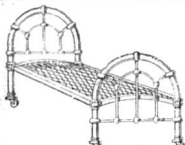

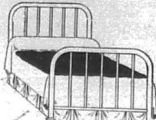
