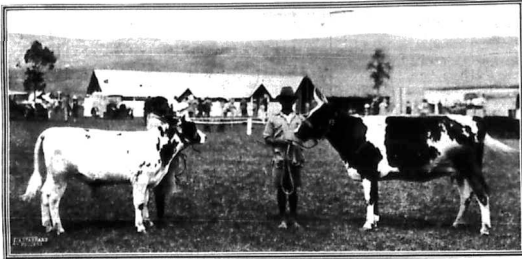

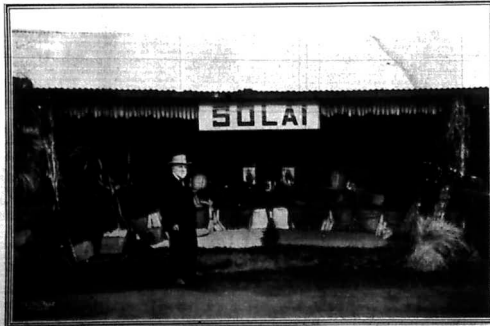

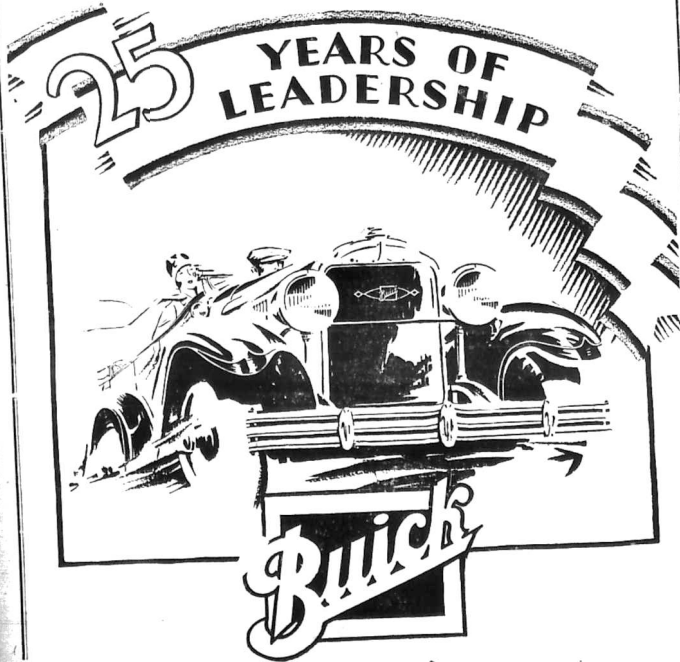

EDITOR'S NOTE.

A few articles on Soils and soil conditions are being included in this issue just now. The most interesting is beginning to get of getting the soil for the next season. It is hoped these articles may be of assistance to them.

Soil Conditions.

The gardener or the farmer has not the means at his disposal of studying from the supposed or the most important organisms in a decided way. The use, of course, examine his leguminous plants in order to find out whether they have the nodules containing the nitrogen-fixing bacteria on their roots, and if these are not present, he can set out to inoculate the soil with the bacteria of the particular root required, either by means of purchased cultures or with soil from a field where the same plants are growing with an abundance of nodules on their roots. He can also observe the nodules and the thymophages with which the remains of dead leaves or plants are decaying in the soil, to form humus with all its beneficial physical and chemical effects on the soil—namely, the improvement of its water-holding capacity and its beneficial effects on the activities of the living organisms of the soil, which may be briefly described by the general term of biological processes.

It is difficult to observe those two somewhat abstract features—biological activity in the soil has not only an immediate practical importance, but is also a key to the better understanding of the unseen processes, many of which are quite as important as those which we can partly follow. For example, it has been shown that the presence of healthy leguminous plants not only furnishes food and lodging for the nitrogen-fixing bacteria that are commonly associated with the respective species, but also appears to stimulate the activities of other nitrogen-fixing bacteria in the soil. These latter are more independent of the presence of specific higher plants than the former, but they are also found in the soil of many other plants, and their activity may be stimulated by the presence of certain living plants, or retarded by the presence of others, especially if continued for a long period.

The physical operations, and substances affecting soil conditions are enumerated as follows:—
 (1) **Water.**—Water can be too much or too little. It may be too much to move a movement of water in the soil, or too little to moisten the soil or to give or to hold in the soil. 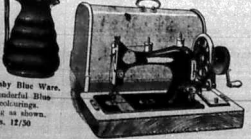
