AFTERMATH OF FAMINE IN RUANDA.

Many of the Natives Merely "Pathological Specimens."

MISSION DOCTOR'S STORY.

Dr. J. E. Church, of the C.M.S. Mission, at Gahini, Ruanda, who has been working in the heart of the great famine-stricken area of the Belgian Territory and whose appeal at the beginning of the year first directed attention to the plight of the Natives, records in the following special article the steps successively taken to improve its situation.

(Special to the "East African Standard" by Dr. J. E. Church, Ruanda.)

The famine in Ruanda is now over or less over. The long rains of March to May fell again and a second harvest, not only with a month of green and again a crop of peas and beans and sufficient maize to be stored until the start of next October and November, but also a fine crop of wheat. The arrival of these crops the migration of people from East Ruanda into Uganda ceased and the famine-stricken area of the Belgian Territory is again a land of plenty. It is naturally large numbers of poor natives who are in a dejected, emaciated, and with no desire or energy to work and this has constituted a great deal of Relief work.

The Belgian Government has had well in hand, and it has been our privilege at Gahini to see East Ruanda to continue our cooperation with them in this vast work of Ruanda relief related to a population of 200,000.

Food Kitchens.—About 1000 miles in addition to the 3000 miles of the Belgian Territory which was affected area, a relief work was started. The Belgian Government had the starting point, on receiving uncooked food, boiled it and sent it to the relief work. The relief work was supplied daily with well-cooked food, on a mountainous hill to the mothers and little children.
