MINOR DISTURBANCES.

London, Dec. 30. Latest information received by the Colonial Office from the Government of Nigeria where disturbances have recently occurred, is to the effect that the general situation is now satisfactory. In the Calabar province the situation is steadily improving and the work of pacification proceeding.

There is still some unrest at Aro and Umuahia, on the left bank of the Cross River but all roads in the province are safe and the port is open.

Reports from Owerri say that North Owerri and South Owerri are peaceful. Some rising in the Owerri division is being dealt with. There has been no serious opposition elsewhere at present.

The Coffee Market.

KENYA PRICES MAINTAINED BY SCARCITY.

The following report of the London coffee market supplied by Messrs. John K. Gillis and Co., Ltd. of London, is dated December 11.

Due to the balance of the crop offerings of East African countries, small as to their quantity at the moment and for some time past, Kenya coffee has been highly appreciated for some time at very high prices. Malabar and lower qualities has well to do however again easier in sympathy with the further fall in Brazil prices.

Tanzania in common with other coffees generally have been slow of sale this year, generally being poor so far. An occasional lot however showed this and quality has sold well.

The first offerings of late crop Costa Rica amounting to some 4,000 bags during the past three weeks have mostly found buyers but at a price level which shows a drop of some 50 per cent compared with that rating at this period last year.

In the absence of any fresh developments Brazil prices have continued to decline. It is now generally reported that the current Santos crop will yield some 20,000,000 bags, this year, prevailing estimate of 17,500,000 bags. Superior Santos is now quoted around 20/- per cwt. C and F.

There will be no more East African coffee available for offering in sale before the Christmas holiday. Public Sales will be resumed on January 7th.

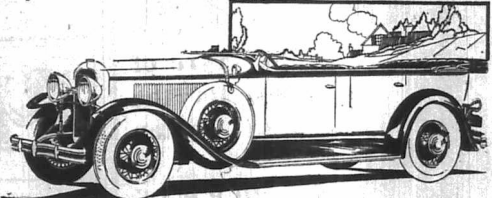

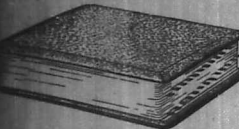

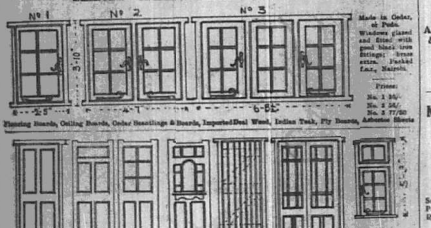

**AGRICULTURE IN
KENYA.**

**Summary of Cereals for
a Year.**

INCREASED ACREAGE.

The following summary of the report for the Agricultural Census for 1925 has been prepared by the Statistical Branch of the Department of Agriculture.

The following is a summary of the Agricultural Census Report for the year 1925, and is in respect of the period August 1, 1925 to July 31, 1926. This summary embraces the total figures disclosed by the year's returns. Much more detailed information will be available upon publication of the complete report.

Cereals.

During the year 1925 (i.e., the period which mainly affected Agricultural production in the period under review), a general deficiency in rainfall was experienced which reduced crop yields and production generally.

Area and Development.

The total area under European occupation as at July 31, 1925, is returned as 5,000,546 acres, an increase over the previous year of 104,242 acres, or 2.13 per cent.

Occupation.

The number of European occupiers increased from 1971 in 1924 to 2003 in 1925, a net increase of 3.2 per cent.

Cultivation.

Of the total area of 5,000,546 acres occupied 682,369 acres, or 11.46 per cent, is under cultivation or occupied with 592,741 acres in the preceding year. The increase in the area under cultivation as compared with the previous year is thus 42,640 acres, or 7.23 per cent. Of the 682,369 acres under cultivation maize covers 28.5 per cent, stand 17.2 per cent, coffee 14.5 per cent, wheat 10.4 per cent, miscelaneous other crops and fallow 19.7 per cent.

Livestock.

The total number of European owned cattle is 218,500 as compared with 215,951 in the previous

year, the increase being 1.15 or 0.15 per cent, as compared with the previous year. Of the 218,500 cattle, 112,615, or 51.6 per cent, are owned. There is a decrease in the number of oxen due to their replacement by mechanical power and a corresponding increase in the number of breeding stock.

The number of woolly sheep is returned as 210,242 as compared with 175,261 in the previous year, an increase of 34,981, or 19.9 per cent. Native sheep also increased from 20,008 to 24,508 during the year.

The export of wool jumped from 1,200 tons in 1924 to 1,920 tons in 1925. Although a slight decrease in the number of breeding ewes is recorded, the total number of pigs remains practically stationary.

CROPS.

Maize.

234,945 acres were harvested during the year yielding a total of 1,800,817 bags—equivalent to a country average yield of 5.56 bags per acre as compared with 6.15 bags per acre in the preceding year. A total area of 245,597 acres was returned as planted as at July 31, 1925, an increase of 29,847 acres, or 11.8 per cent, over the previous year.

Wheat.

162,651 acres of wheat were harvested during the year and produced 228,143 bags of 260 lbs., an average of 2.72 bags per acre as compared with 2.28 bags per acre in the previous year. 65,069 acres of wheat, of which 23,514 acres are in the Uasin Gishu district and 25,108 acres in Nakuru, are returned as having been sown as on July 31, 1925. The total area shows a decrease of 22,840 acres as compared with the previous year. It is known that considerable further increase in wheat takes place since July 31.

Barley.

9,721 acres of barley were harvested during the year and yielded 25,880 bags of 160 lbs., equivalent to 2.65 bags per acre as compared with 2.02 bags in the previous year. 14,458 acres are returned as having been sown with barley as at July 31.

Oats.

An increase of 6,122 acres, or 7.2 per cent, is reported. The total area under oats in 1925, 90,250 acres and is made up as follows: 1 to 2 years, 25,553 acres; 3 to 6 years, 22,800 acres; over 6 years, 40,722 acres. The production of clean oats during the year totalled

122,426 cwt., and 18,545,945 cwt. It is estimated that the 1925-26 crop will produce 229,556 cwt.

Tan.

The area under tan is now given as 2,524 acres, or 13.2 per cent. 123,811 lbs. of tan were produced during the year as compared with 92,000 lbs. in the previous year.

Sisal.

159,475 acres are now under plant, an increase of 17,200 acres, equivalent to 18.8 per cent. The total area under production during 1925 is given as 20,927 tons as compared with the total crop of 18,900 tons.

Tractors and Engines.

The number of tractors increased from 1,102 in 1924 to 1,200 in 1925, while steam and internal combustion engines increased from 909 to 1,001 during the same period.

Labour.

The average number of units of Native labour employed monthly by the Agricultural holdings in the year ended July 31, 1925, amounted to 62,513,206 as compared with 114,520 in the previous year. A plentiful supply of labour appears to have been available in most districts.

Agricultural Exports.

The total value of Agricultural commodities exported during the year ended July 31, 1925, amounted to K2,856,472 as compared with K2,896,472 in the previous year, a decrease of K17,504.

The principal increases and decreases as compared with 1924-25 are as follows:

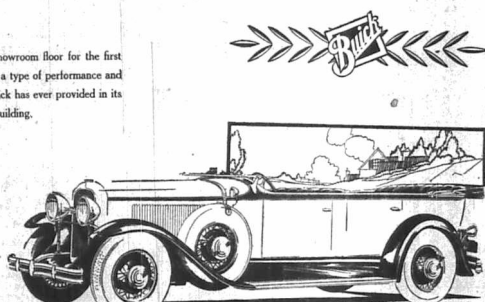

RAINFALL RECORDS NAIROBI HILL, 1929.

To the Editor: "The A Standard" Sir, -Following my usual practice, I would send you in the last six months - all except November exceeding the average, the total excess for the period referred to being 5.26 inches.

August produced a new record at 2.74 in against average of 2.41, the record, next best being 2.41 in 1929 and 2.39 in 1917. If judged December at 5.26 to be a "high spot" but found on investigation that it had been recorded three times as follows: 1909 6.22; 1912 5.55; 1922 5.64 inches respectively, and was almost reached in 1920 by 5.12 inches.

Distribution is probably a more important factor than volume so I examined this aspect of the subject to find that we had 100 days rain in 1929 against an annual average of 107.55 days but if we take other figures for the last six months we find that we had 67 only thus confirming my belief that the last six months have been specially good.

The final interesting bit of figures appears to be the following based on the two peak years at this station 1912 and 1922. Both these years came out a little over 10 inches each. I divided the periods before and after into groups of five years each with the following results:

Five Years pre 1912	average 32.71 per annum.
Five Years post 1912	average 32.71 per annum.
Five Years pre 1922	average 32.75 per annum.

The latest five year group is clearly on the low side but remains somewhat better than the average for three years 1928 to 1930 at 27.22 per annum.

In conclusion, I would again refer to the lowest annual fall recorded here in the 23 years, that is 1921 with only 18.49, a very small margin over 50 per cent. of my average. I trust that will not be repeated for some years ahead.

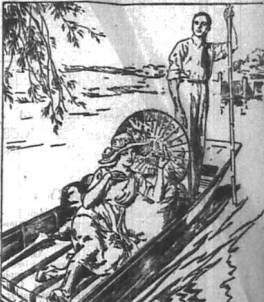

Notification of Malaria.

TO BE MADE COMPULSORY IN NAIROBI.

The Nairobi Municipal Council has recommended that notification of malarial in the township of Nairobi be made compulsory. At Tuesday's meeting of the Council the notification was recommended by the Health Officer under the Local Government (Malaria) Ordinance, 1926, which was submitted and approved. These by-laws require the following notification: "Every medical practitioner attending on, or called in to visit, or, accompanied in, any building, including a hospital or other place used for the reception of the sick, situated within the Municipality shall, forthwith on becoming aware that such patient is suffering from malarial, send to the Medical Officer of Health at the Municipal Office of Health at the following time table: -

The Council shall pay to every medical practitioner, other than a medical officer in the service of the Government, for each certificate duly sent to him, if second class a fee of five shillings. The approval of the Governor will be procured in due course in the "Official Gazette."

SPORTS AND PASTIMES.
SOUTH AFRICAN STUDENTS RUGBY TOUR.
Country Clubs Defeated At Ruiri.
VISITORS HANDLING FALLS MUCH BELOW PAR.
Speed Behind Scrum Carries Them Through.

After a spell of more or less quiet life, the South African Uni- versities party in their second match on Wednesday in the midst of the rural settings of Ruiri. The attendance was a record and the twenty miles to see the game. Once again, great words by the Kenya clubs part carried them through, and though broken by the visitors were not disgraced.

The second half was against the "County Club," and the side was captained by Ianich, Ruiri. Unfortunately, the strength of the party was reduced by the untimed absence of Hodnett, while the students turned out showing many changes from the side which did duty against the Home Boro at Rutanda. However, speed behind their scrum carried the visitors to success. They did the bulk of their scoring in the first half as was the case at Nairobi, but they did not lessen their efforts, despite the fact. The forwards of the visitors played a scouder game than on Saturday, and towards the end of the second half had the upper hand. All over, the students gave a better, ob- servant display, although their handling was much below par. Again, they were inclined to be too much running across the field instead of going straight for their mark. One weakness is definitely apparent in the team, and that is that they lack a real sound goal kicker. The weather was dull, but not unpleasant, while the ground now in splendid condition.

From the kick of Van der Spuy found touch at the center but off side mark of the gain. One of Spuy's touch at the same spot less than a minute later and Lathen- berg scored to drop over the line for straight for their mark. One kick struck through up from a loose scrum and sent it stiff, but the latter pass was nullified by Henderson. The latter dropped

another pass to culminate a three-quarter, and twice certain tries were lost through untoward hap- penings. Maria picked up a loosing ball and sent it to Van der Spuy, whose possession and broke through on his own, but not as he got over the line he lost his balance and the ball bounded off his kick. On another posses- sion the ball went "dead" when it was stopped in the air. Some consolation for these failures came a goal from the scrum.

Twenty minutes football found Ruiri, solely on the defense, but they were defending well. As was the case with the Home Boro on Saturday, the forwards were dominating that game, so far as Ruiri was concerned. They were quick to smother loose represen- tatives. The three were held in and were kept completely on the defense.

Another point notes the students when De Test counted from a free kick. Just before this a beautiful three-quarter movement was spoiled by Lathenberg losing possession a few feet from the line. The winger was not having a day even. Nearly every pass without exception had been muffed and when it seemed another score had been made, another score put the side into a sorry state. Lathen- berg was having a bad day and it was raining all at once.

Van Loosen got the next point the try coming after a penalty movement in which Maria was conspicuous. The Judge had a promising run for Ruiri, the first one of the kind since the start of the 25. A ruse was used, but Van der Spuy found touch at midfield. Maria looked like getting through on his own, but was well tackled by Henderson. Lathenberg got

over, but it was his unlucky day, and more so the ball flew off his eye as he took the ball and ground- ed it, but a nervous indecision sent him the points disallowed. A kicking, but the visitors saw De Test score. It was the last phase of the game. The visitors dropped the penalty goal, two (two-11) points.

The second half had barely com- menced, though the students had scored a three-quarter move- ment which broke down, when Lathenberg's eye made it stiff failed to find the ball, a pretty corker by the Home Boro which left the beating frost, but that got back to bring off a timely clearance. Ruiri's three got going, but it was a bit of a struggle to get the opening scored. A shot of mid- field play followed until Mynhardt broke and walked round the defence to score by no far not for stiff to convert.
